ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan has brushed aside the accusations on Pakistan being supportive of a Taliban takeover in Afghanistan, stating that the country does not have magic powers to dictate terms to the Taliban.

Imran Khan said that Pakistan is not gaining anything from the situation in Afghanistan, instead it is worried because the situation there seems to be moving towards a long civil war, which, he said, will have direct impact on Pakistan as well.

Imran Khan said that since the US decided to have a "strategic partnership" with India, Washington was treating Pakistan differently, according to a journalist present at the meeting, reported news agency Press Trust of India.

Islamabad is unhappy that Joe Biden has not spoken to Imran Khan since he as-

sumed the US Presidency in January. Pakistan's National Security Adviser Moayed Yusuf recently expressed disappointment over President

Biden's reluctance to contact Prime Minister Khan despite considering Islamabad as an important country in some critical issues like Afghanistan.

NAIROBI: A Chinese firm demanded billions of shillings in pending bills that Kenya borrowed to build the modern railway line from Mombasa to Nairobi.

Bonface Otieno, writing in Business Daily said that the Africa Star Railway Operation Company Ltd (Afristar), the Chinese company contracted to run the train service, has listed clearing of its debts as a condition before fully transferring operations of standard gauge railway (SGR) to Kenya in May next year.

Parliament last year revealed that Kenya had not paid Sh 38 billion to Afristar, which is majority-owned by China Road and Bridge Corporation (CRBC) and was contracted in May 2017 to run the passenger and cargo trains on the SGR.

"The negotiations between KRC and Afristar commenced in the year 2019 and an agreement has been reached that KRC (Kenya Railways Corporation) takes over obviously with some conditions including clearing of any outstanding payments," KRC chairman Omudho Awitta told the Business Daily.

The billions of shillings in pending bills add to the Sh 420 billion that Kenya borrowed to build the modern line from Mombasa to Nairobi and for the purchase of engines and coaches. The line, which started operations in 2017, was then linked with

Cash van driver flees with 200 mn rupees in Pak

KARACHI: In a daring broad daylight robbery, a cash van driver fled with more than 200 million rupees from Pakistan's financial hub in Karachi's "Wall Street".

According to the FIR lodged with the police, driver Hussain Shah of a security company drove off with the van carrying the currency on Monday after the van's security guard went inside the State Bank of Pakistan building on the busy Chundrigar road to deposit the cash.

The complaint was lodged with the police by the regional operations manager of the cash transportation company. Chundrigar Road is the financial hub of Pakistan, with the country's central and other banks located on it. "It is an unusual case. It took place on August 9 in broad daylight," a senior police officer investigating the case said.

Speaking to the German broadcaster ZDF, Foreign Minister Heiko Maas said the Taliban know that Afghanistan cannot survive without international aid.

"We will not send another cent to this country if the Taliban take complete control, introduce Sharia law and turn it into a caliphate," Maas said.

Germany sends Afghanistan 430 million euros (\$504 million) in aid a year, making it one of the biggest donors to the strife-hit nation. Since international troops began their withdrawal from Afghanistan in May, the Taliban have taken control of large swathes of territory.

German soldiers were deployed as part of a NATO force in Afghanistan for nearly 20 years until June. German Defence Minister Annegret Kramp-Karrenbauer confirmed that Afghans who had worked with German forces locally would be brought to Germany to protect them from Taliban retaliation.

ANKARA: Turkish authorities said Thursday the death toll from the severe floods and mudslides that struck the north of the country has risen to nine. One other person is reported missing.



The floods battered the Black Sea coastal provinces of Bartın, Kastamonu, Sinop and Samsun on Wednesday, demolishing homes and bridges and sweeping away cars.

As floodwaters began to recede across the affected regions in Turkey's north, a statement from the Disaster and Emergency Management Presidency, or AFAD, said rescuers had recovered six bodies in Kastamonu.

The disaster struck as firefighters in southwest Turkey worked to extinguish a wildfire in Mugla province, an area popular with tourists

that runs along the Aegean Sea. The blaze, which was brought under control on Thursday, was one of more than 200 wildfires in Turkey since July 28. At least eight people and countless animals died and thousands of residents have had to flee fierce blazes.
