## Glacier warning

Researchers in Nepal on Tuesday warned that the highest glacier on the top of Mount Everest could disappear by the middle of this century as the 2,000-year-old ice cap on the world's tallest mountain is thinning at an alarming rate. The International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD) here said that Everest has been losing ice significantly since the late 1990s, citing a latest research report issued here. The Everest Expedition, the single most comprehensive Scientific Expedition to Everest, conducted trailblazing research on glaciers and the alpine environment, the ICIMOD said. A recent article published in the Nature Portfolio journal reported that the ice on Everest has been thinning at an alarming rate. The multidisciplinary team comprised scientists from eight countries, including 17 from Nepal. Three of the co-authors of the study were affiliated with the ICIMOD.

at an elevation of 8,020 metres is thinning at a rate of nearly two-metre per year, the report said. The findings were based on data from a 10-metre-long ice core obtained from South Col Glacier (in the Nepalese side of the Everest) at an elevation of 8,020 metre and meteorological observations from the two highest automatic weather stations in the world located on the southern slopes of Everest at 7,945 and 8,430-metre. The researchers, on the basis of radiocarbon dating, estimated the age of ice in the glacier to be 2,000-year-old. They warned that the highest glacier could disappear by the middle of this century. The rate of ice loss measured is more than 80 times faster than the 2,000 years it took to form this thickness of ice. "The long-term effect on the availability and stability of these water towers which will impact downstream communities is of major concern," the ICIMOD said in the statement. Glaciers in the Himalayas make a significant contribution to water resources for

millions of people. The research finding states that the change in ice cover in the Everest could have been triggered by climate change. In December 2002, China and Nepal announced that the world's highest peak is now taller by 86 centimetres after they remeasured Mt Everest at 8,848.86 metres, over six decades after India conducted the previous measurement in 1954. The revised height of Mt Everest put an end to the decades-long dispute between the two neighbours on the height of the world's tallest mountain that straddles their shared border. The exact height of Mt Everest had been contested ever since a group of British surveyors in India declared the height of Peak XV, as it was initially called, to be 8,778 metres in 1847. Mt Everest stands on the border between China and Nepal and mountaineers climb it from both the sides. Mt Everest is known as Sagarmatha in Nepal while in China it is called Mt Qomolangma, the Tibetan name for the world's highest peak.

# Modi made poll speech in Parliament, Cong's jibe

## Party alleges PM skipped real issues

New Delhi, Feb 9: The Congress on Monday said Prime Minister Narendra Modi gave an election speech in Parliament while skipping the real issues raised by the party and accused him of throwing parliamentary conventions to the winds. Former Congress chief Rahul Gandhi claimed the Prime Minister was afraid of the party as it spoke the truth which is why he attacked the Congress in both the Houses of Parliament. He also said if Modi likes abusing the party and his great-grandfather Jawaharlal Nehru, he

can do so but he should do his job first as the country faced danger from China and Pakistan coming together. "If you like abusing the Congress and Nehru, be my guest but do your job," Gandhi said. "I do not need anyone's certificate for my great-grandfather. I don't care what anybody says about him," the former party chief said. Replying to the Motion of Thanks on President's Address, Modi on Tuesday continued his no-holds-barred attack on the Congress declaring that even Mahatma Gandhi

wanted it dismantled and claiming there would have been no Emergency, no massacre of Sikhs, no caste politics and no exodus of Pandits from Kashmir had the Congress not been there. Modi also alleged that "urban Naxals" had control over the party. Describing dynamic parties as the biggest threat to India's democracy, he said Nehru, "concerned about his global image", refused to send the Army to help Ram Manohar Lohia-led 'satyagrahis' working for Goa's independence. The Congress staged

a walkout from the Rajya Sabha during the Prime Minister's address, prompting Modi to say that one needs to listen too in a democracy and that the party was used to only preaching to others till now. Leader of Opposition in the Rajya Sabha Mallikarjun Kharge said the PM only spoke against the party, it was irrelevant and did not speak on the President's address. "The Prime Minister only gave an election speech and attacked the Congress only as elections to five states are on. He said nothing in the

interest of the country and did not give any vision of his government in the coming year," he said. Kharge said Modi did not address the issues raised by the opposition and said they are not the ones following Gandhi's ideals but are those who eulogise Gandhi's assassin Nathuram Godse. "Those who worship Mahatma Gandhi Ji's assassin are now telling us that the Congress should be dissolved," he said, adding that it does behoove them to even use Gandhi's name.

## Ukraine crisis not stopping focus on Indo-Pacific: US

Washington, Feb 9: The Biden administration is making a push to remind China that the US remains involved and active in the Indo-Pacific despite Washington and the West's current preoccupation with a possible Russian invasion of Ukraine. As tensions between Washington and Moscow continue to escalate over Ukraine, Secretary of State Antony Blinken will visit Australia this week on a trip designed to reinforce America's interests in Asia and its intent to push back on increasing Chinese assertiveness in the region. He will also visit Fiji and discuss pressing concerns about North Korea with his Japanese and South Korean counterparts in Hawaii. In Melbourne on Friday, Blinken will

attend a meeting of foreign ministers from the so-called Quad Australia, India, Japan and the US a bloc of Indo-Pacific democracies created to counter China. While China will top the agenda, US officials say Ukraine and the relationship between Beijing and Moscow will also be a topic for discussion. ## It is woman's right to decide on what to wear, Priyanka asserts

New Delhi, Feb 9: Whether it is a bikini, a dupatta, a pair of jeans or a 'hijab', it is a woman's right to decide what she wants to wear, Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra said amid the ongoing hijab row in Karnataka. She asserted that this right is guaranteed by the Constitution. Incidents of stone pelting and use of force by police were reported on Tuesday as the hijab row in Karnataka escalated and protests by students spread to more colleges prompting the state government to declare a three-day holiday for all educational institutions. The hijab controversy first erupted in January at a government PU College in Udipi, where six students who attended classes wearing headscarf in violation of the stipulated dress code were asked to leave the campus, has spread to different parts of the state with Hindu students too responding by turning up in saffron shawls. Such saffron-clad students are also being barred from entering classes. The row has also taken a political colour as the ruling BJP stood strongly in support of uniform-related rules being enforced by educational institutions, calling the headscarf, a religious symbol, while the opposition Congress has come out in support of Muslim girls.
