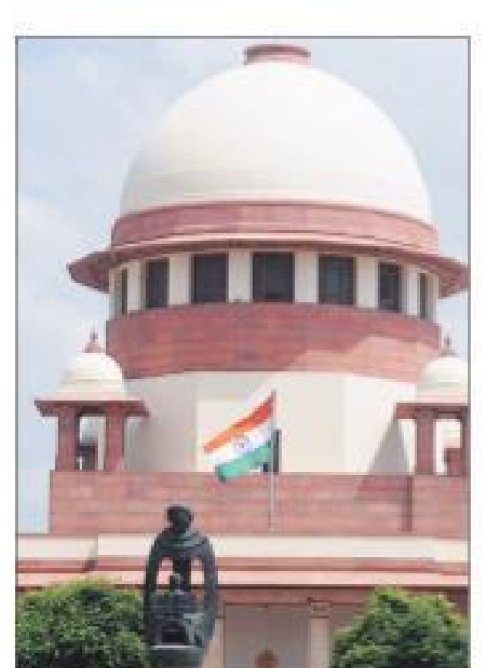
J&K had surrendered sovereignty upon accession: Govt to SC

THE CENTRE ON Thursday told the Supreme Court that the state of Jammu and Kashmir had fully surrendered its sovereignty to the Union of India upon accession and the petitioners who have challenged changes made to Article 370 have confused internal sovereignty with autonomy, which every state has.

"The petitioners are confusing internal sovereignty with autonomy. (As for) external sovereignty, nobody can dispute that it is with the Union of India," Solicitor General Tushar Mehta told a five-judge Constitution bench headed by CJI D Y Chandrachud.

"Internal sovereignty in the facts of our case, and in the Constitutional structure which we have accepted, would mean autonomy of the federating units and which autonomy is there with every state," Mehta submitted. "It's actually there with every institution; like we are the autonomous authority to decide a Constitutional issue," the CJI remarked. "But we can't say internal sovereignty vests with us. We are an



independent autonomous institution under the Constitution."

The CJI also told Attorney General R Venkataramani, who, while opening the arguments for the Centre on Thursday, said the running theme of his submissions will be on balancing between losing the nation and preserving the Constitution, that "one cannot postulate a situation where the ends justify the means".

Mehta cited from the Proclamation issued by Karan Singh [son of Kashmir's erstwhile ruler Hari Singh] on November 25, 1949, to buttress his argument that the sovereignty was completely given up to the

Order directing doctors to prescribe only generic drugs put on hold

THE NATIONAL MEDICAL Commission (NMC) on Thursday put on hold the regulations that make it mandatory for doctors to prescribe generic drugs and bar them from accepting gifts from pharma companies or endorsing any drug brands.

The Registered Medical Practitioner (Professional Conduct) Regulations, 2023, were published on August 2.

However, the Indian Medical Association (IMA) and Indian Pharmaceutical Alliance (IPA) had expressed concern over the NMC making it mandatory to prescribe generic medicines saying this was not feasible because of the uncertainty about their quality.

They also suggested that registered medical practitioners should be allowed to attend conferences sponsored by pharmaceutical companies or the allied health sector.

They said the regulation barring doctors from attending conferences sponsored by pharma companies warrants reconsideration and also demanded that associations and organisations should be exempted from the purview of NMC guidelines.

ED searches bid to defame govt ahead of polls: Baghel

A DAY AFTER the Enforcement Directorate (ED) conducted searches at premises linked to his political advisor and two of his officers on special duty (OSDs), Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel on Thursday alleged attempts to "defame" and "obstruct" his government ahead of the Assembly elections due later this year.

Addressing a press conference at the AICC headquarters in Delhi, Baghel accused the BJP-led government at the Centre of misusing central agencies to carry out a "political vendetta". He said he was not afraid of death, or going to jail.

"We are from Chhattisgarh. Neither do we fear death, nor do we fear going to jail. Naxalites have killed so many people, our main leaders were assassinated. This happened during their (BJP) regime. We don't fear death. We don't fear a fight either," he said.

"Raman Singh (former chief minister) had sent me to jail. The BJP's 15-year rule decimated the party to 15 seats," he said.

Baghel said the only purpose of the central agencies — Enforcement Directorate (ED) and Income Tax (IT) — was to "defame" and "obstruct" his elected government. "The only purpose is political. There is nothing more than a political reason," Baghel said. "They (BJP) started this in July 2020

after their defeat in the Jharkhand Assembly elections," he added.

Accusing the BJP-led government at the Centre of misusing these agencies, he said: "You don't want to contest elections democratically. You are using the ED and I-T to intimidate and harass people, to obstruct their work. If such people work with such motives, then democracy is in danger."

He said the ED, I-T and DRI (Directorate of Revenue Intelligence) had conducted over 200 raids in Chhattisgarh so far. "Today, there is an atmosphere of fear. You know about Sanjay Mishra (ED Director). He has been given a task till September 15... He still has 15-20 days left," he said.

ED chargesheet against Supertech chairman in money laundering case

THE ENFORCEMENT DIRECTORATE (ED) Thursday filed a charge sheet against RK Arora, chairman and promoter of real estate major Supertech Group, his company, and eight others in a money laundering case, accusing them of hatching a "criminal conspiracy" to cheat home buyers.

They have been accused of defrauding at least 670 home

buyers of ₹164 crore. The nearly 100-page prosecution complaint, ED's equivalent of charge sheet, was filed before Special Judge Devender Kumar Jangala, claiming there was sufficient evidence to prosecute Arora for laundering money. Arora was arrested on June 27 under the criminal sections of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act after three rounds of questioning.

The money-laundering case against the group, its directors and promoters stems from a clutch of FIRs registered by police in Delhi, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh. The ED counsel had told the court that the anti-money laundering agency was probing the matter related to 26 FIRs registered by the Economic Offences Wing of Delhi, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh police against Supertech Ltd. and its group companies for alleged criminal conspiracy, cheating, criminal breach of trust and forgery.

69TH NATIONAL FILM AWARDS Rocketry wins best feature; Alia, Kriti, Allu Arjun get acting honours

HINDI FILM 'ROCKETRY: The Nambi Effect' on Thursday won the National Award for best feature film while Alia Bhatt and Kriti Sanon shared the best actress prize for their roles in Gangubai Kathiawadi and Mimi, respectively. South superstar Allu Arjun was judged the best actor for the Telugu film Pushpa: The Rise (Part I).

The National Awards for 2021 were announced by filmmaker Ketan Mehta who headed the 11-member jury.

The National Film Award for best director went to Nikhil Mahajan for Marathi film Godavari. Pankaj Tripathi was named best supporting actor for Mimi and Pallavi Joshi the best supporting actress for The Kashmir Files.

The Kashmir Files, directed by Vivek Ranjan Agnihotri, also won the Nargis Dutt award for best film on national integration.

The award for best popular film providing wholesome entertainment went to the Telugu version of the multilingual film RRR. Gangubai Kathiawadi won five National Film Awards. Its director Sanjay Leela Bhansali won two — best screenplay writer (adapted) along with Utkarshini Vashishtha and best editing for the film.

The other awards were for best dialogue writer, which went to Vashishtha and Prakash Kapadia, and best make-up artist for Preetisheel Singh D'Souza.

The Indira Gandhi Award for best debut film of a director went to Malayalam film Mepadiyan, whereas the prize for best film on social issues was given to Assamese film Anunaad-the Resonance.

"Good cinema gets acknowledged and a pat on the back from a respectful jury always brings joy," said Bhansali said on Thursday after the awards were announced.

"I'm happy for everybody who has won, my film and other films, and everybody who has won. Good cinema gets acknowledged and a pat on the back from the government, and nationally and from a respectful jury, it always brings you joy," Bhansali told PTI.

"As far as cinema is celebrated from all over India, it is a wonderful moment for all of us. I'm too happy," he said.

Gangubai Kathiawadi, which had its world premiere at the 72nd Berlin International Film Festival, was adapted from a chapter in Hussain Zaidi's book Mafia Queens of Mumbai.

The film's star cast also included Ajay Devgn, Shantanu Maheshwari, Vijay Raaz, Indira Tiwari, Seema Pahwa and Jim Sarbh.
