Ten-player England overcome Nigeria from the dreaded spot, enter quarters

England battled into the quarter-finals of the FIFA Women's World Cup beating Nigeria in a penalty shootout following a 0-0 draw at Brisbane Stadium.

The round of 16 match ended 0-0 after regulation and extra time, giving Nigeria a chance to win a knockout match at the Women's World Cup for the first time in nine trips to the global tournament.

But European champion England won the shootout 4-2, missing only one attempt.

England became the title favourite after the defending champion US team was eliminated on Sunday in a penalty shootout loss to Sweden. But England struggled to create opportunities against Nigeria's defence.

Matters were made worse for England five minutes from regulation time when star forward James was ejected, after a VAR review,

for violent conduct after stomping on a Nigeria defender.

She initially was shown a yellow card by referee Melissa Borjas after falling on top of Michelle Alozie and stepping on her with her studs af-

ter getting back to her feet. The crowd groaned as slow-motion replays were shown on the stadium screens and, after a delay of several minutes, the yellow card was can-

celed and replaced with a red card.

British media instantly reacted by comparing it with David Beckham's red card for kicking out at Argentina's Diego Simeone at

the 1998 World Cup in France.

SRH appoints Vettori as head coach

Hyderabad: Sunrisers Hyderabad on Monday announced the appointment of Daniel Vettori as their head coach, snapping the alliance with Brian Lara that lasted two seasons. This will be former New Zealand captain Vettori's second coaching stint in the IPL as he had earlier coached Royal Challengers Bangalore from 2014 to 2018. Vettori has also worked as Australia men's team's assistant coach recently, and he also had a stint with Bangladesh as a spin consultant.

PCB re-appoints Haq as chief

Karachi: The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) on Monday re-appointed the legendary Inzamam-ul-Haq as its chief selector, bringing back the former skipper for the role for a second term. Inzamam, 53, had earlier held the position of chief selector between 2016 and 2019. The 1992 World Cup winner had given his consent last week to become a paid selector. In his latest role as the chief selector, Inzamam will succeed Haroon Rasheed who stepped down last month.

Four women nominated for ICC WPoM

Dubai: Two Australian all-rounders Elyse Perry and Ashleigh Gardner alongside England's star all-rounder Nat Sciver-Burnt have been nominated for the ICC Women's Player of the Month award for July. Perry celebrates her first nomination after scoring consistently across all formats throughout the month. She had an exceptional month in July, which led to her nomination for the ICC Women's Player of the Month. Her performance in both the ODI and T20I leg of the Ashes tour was noteworthy.

Marsh roped in T20 Aussies skipper

Melbourne: All-rounder Mitch Marsh will get the first chance of becoming Aaron Finch's successor as Australia's T20 captain after he was announced as skipper for the upcoming T20I series against South Africa. Finch retired from T20I cricket earlier this year after a successful 76-match stint as captain that was highlighted by guiding Australia to the ICC Men's T20 World Cup title in Dubai in 2021 and selectors have taken their time on settling on his replacement.

Montreal Tigers clinch Global T20-title

Brampton: The TD Cricket Arena was packed to the rafters as Montreal Tigers were anointed champions of the season three of Global T20 Canada, following a sensation last ball victory against the Surrey Jaguars. The Montreal Tigers chased down the target of 131, with five wickets in hand. Sherfane (38*) and Andre Russell (20*) with 29 runs saw Montreal Tigers home.

History beckons FIFA women's world cup

Colombia, Jamaica, Morocco seek last 8 spot

History will be made on Tuesday in at least one of the Women's World Cup knockout games, where three teams try to advance to the quarterfinals for the first time in their history.

Colombia, led by 18-year-old sensation Linda Caicedo, is trying to advance for the first time, four years after missing the tournament field. The Colombians made it to the round of 16 in 2015, were eliminated in group play in 2011, and failed to qualify in the 1999, 2003 and 2007 World Cups.

Standing in the way of Colombia, ranked 25th in the world, is Jamaica. The Reggae Girlz are playing in their second consecutive World Cup - they were eliminated in group play in 2019 - and needed a GoFundMe campaign to afford the trip to this year's tournament.

Colombia won its group, Jamaica beat Panama and eliminated powerhouse Brazil with a scoreless draw to advance, and the winner of Tuesday's match in Melbourne will advance to the quarterfinals for the first time in team history.

In Tuesday's second knock-



out game, World Cup debutante Morocco will attempt to continue its historic first tournament with a win over France. Coincidentally, the

two nations played to a 2-0 France victory in the semifinals of the men's World Cup last December in Qatar. Morocco's women's team

advanced as runner-up in Group H after back-to-back 1-0 wins against South Korea and Colombia. Morocco was the first Arab or North

African nation to qualify for the Women's World Cup, then became the first to advance beyond the group stage. Morocco was one of eight teams to make its tournament debut this year and the only one to advance. Morocco, ranked 72nd in

the world, will have a tough time making it to the quarterfinals when the Atlas Lions play France in Adelaide, South Australia. France is ranked fifth in the world and advanced to at least the quarterfinals in the last three World Cups, and finished fourth in 2011.

France was eliminated by the United States in the quarterfinals in 2019.

Wake up call for Indian batters

India will need to bat with the fearlessness they often talk about as they look to avoid a series defeat in the third T20 International against the West Indies here on Tuesday.

The slow pitches on offer have not been the best for batting but as skipper Hardik Pandya pointed out after the loss on Sunday, India should have a found way to score additional 10-20 runs.

India, who last lost to the West Indies in a bilateral T20 series back in 2016, trail 0-2 in the five-match series.

The shortest format demands the batters to go hard from ball one and that is something India's top-order, comprising Ishan Kishan,

Shubman Gill and Suryakumar Yadav, have not been able to do.

The top-order's failure has put extra pressure on the likes of Sanju Samson and rookie Tilak Varma, who has taken to international cricket like fish to water.

With focus on ODIs in a World Cup year, Gill, Kishan and Suryakumar would want to be amongst runs ahead of the Asia Cup beginning August 31.

"Batters need to take more responsibility," Hardik's message was clear to the batters

following the two-wicket loss here on Sunday.

India have been playing with a long tail with Axar Patel batting at seven to maintain the balance of the side and it is unlikely to change in the next game.

India's in-form spinner Kuldeep Yadav missed Sunday's game due to a sore thumb and it remains to be seen if he is available for selection.

The bowlers, especially the spinners, need to find a way to contain a rampaging Nicholas Pooran. The south-paw has been batting with disdain against the likes of Yuzvendra Chahal and Ravi Bishnoi. Left-arm spinner Axar was not even used in the last game.

Labuschagne dropped

Marnus Labuschagne was on Monday left out of Australia's 18-man preliminary squad for the ODI World Cup in India in October-November.

Labuschagne was part of Australia's last ODI squad that played three matches in India earlier this year. The right-handed batter has featured in 30 ODIs since making his debut in January 2020.

Uncapped leg-spinner Tanveer Sangha and all-rounder Aaron Hardie are the fresh faces in the Australia squad. The same 18-man extended squad, which will be trimmed later to 15 for the ODI World Cup, has been named for the series against South Africa and India in September ahead of the 50-over showpiece beginning October 5.

Inter Miami prevail over Dallas in penalty shootout

Lionel Messi scored on another mesmerizing free kick in his third consecutive two-goal game for Inter Miami, a tying tally that led to a 5-4 victory over FC Dallas on penalty kicks in a Leagues Cup elimination game.

Messi's goal in the 85th minute on Sunday night was reminiscent of the game-winner in his Inter Miami debut, both on free kicks from just outside the penalty box in the waning moments and sneaking past the goalkeeper into the upper corner of the net.

This time, the left-footed superstar, was to the right of the net, and beat FC Dallas' Maarten Paes to the near post the same way he did from the

left side in a 2-1 win over Mexican club Cruz Azul in his Inter Miami debut.

The victory in the round of 16 sent Inter Miami into the Leagues Cup quarterfinals

against the winner on Monday night between Charlotte FC and Houston.

Messi's first goal outside of Florida for his new US club was another left-footed strike outside the penalty area in the sixth minute, on a pass from former FC Barcelona team-mate Jordi Alba. It was initially disallowed on an off-sides call that was overturned on review.

The seven-time Ballon d'Or winner and World Cup champion for Argentina has scored in all four matches for Inter Miami, with seven goals total.

FC Dallas had gone ahead 4-2 on Robert Taylor's own goal in the 68th minute, but Dallas gave an own goal right back in the 80th minute. Marco Farfan put a header into his own net on a cross from Messi on a free kick from outside the left corner of the penalty box.
