According to the police, Amir Locke was shot on Wednesday by officers who were executing a search warrant on the apartment he was in, after Locke pulled a gun from beneath a blanket. The total time between the officers' entrance and the shots fired was less than ten seconds. Locke was pronounced dead at hospital.

Two months earlier, Breonna Taylor was killed after police entered her home after midnight and her boyfriend, thinking they were intruders, fired on them.

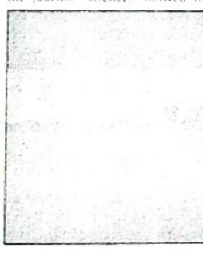
Conversations on the police radio prior to the Minneapolis events on Wednesday suggest that the police had planned a "no-knock" entrance, the Star-Tribune reported.

Like the case of Breonna Taylor, the tragic killing of Amir Locke shows a pattern of no-knock warrants having deadly consequences for Black Americans, said Crump in a statement. New "Highly Virulent" Strain Of HIV Discovered In The Netherlands

Oxford researchers announced Thursday the discovery of a highly virulent strain of HIV that has been lurking in the Netherlands for decades, but because of the effectiveness of modern treatments, is "no cause for alarm."



patients infected with what they call the "VB variant" had 3.5 to 5.5 times higher levels of the virus in their blood than those infected with other variants, as well as a more rapidly fading immune system. However, the study also found that after starting treatment, individuals with the VB variant had similar immune system recovery and survival to individuals with other HIV variants.

Since modern interventions still seem to work on the variant, the research team believes that widespread HIV treatment in the Netherlands did not contribute to the virus's evolution, and that early detection and treatment are paramount. "Our findings emphasize the importance of World Health

Organization guidance that individuals at risk of acquiring HIV have access to regular testing to allow early diagnosis, followed by immediate treatment," said co-author Christophe Fraser, also an Oxford researcher, in a press release announcing the findings. The work also supports the theory that viruses can evolve to become more virulent, a widely-hypothesized idea for which few real-world examples have been found.

The Delta variant of the novel coronavirus was another recent example. The discovery of the HIV variant should therefore "be a warning that we should never be overconfident about saying viruses will just evolve to become milder," said Wyman to AFP.

In total, the team found 109 people infected with the VB variant, with only four living outside the Netherlands, but still in western Europe. The HIV virus is constantly evolving, so much so that each person infected has a slightly different version. The VB variant, however, was found to have over 500 mutations.

The research team first identified the VB variant in 17 HIV-positive individuals by parsing a broad data set from the BEEHIVE project, a data collection and analysis initiative in Europe and Uganda. Because 15 of the 17 were from the Netherlands, they further studied data from 6,700 HIV-positive Dutch individuals, identifying 92 others.

The earliest appearance of the VB variant in their data was found in someone diagnosed in 1992 who had an early version of the variant, and the most recent in 2014. Other researchers have since found other individuals with the variant diagnosed after 2014. Doctors usually measure HIV's deterioration of the immune system by monitoring the decline of CD4 T-cells, which are targeted by the HIV virus and pivotal for protecting the body against infections in patients infected with the VB variant, CD4 decline occurred twice as fast compared to other variants, "placing them at risk of developing AIDS much more rapidly," the researchers said. In addition to its increased impact on the immune system, the VB variant to be more highly transmissible.

In A Tit-For-Tat Move, Russia To Ban German Broadcaster's Bureau

Russia said Thursday it is closing the Moscow bureau of German broadcaster Deutsche Welle and revoking staff accreditation in Russia in response to Berlin's ban on German-language channel of Russian state TV network RT. Deutsche Welle called the decision "absurd" and a "complete overreaction."

The German government said the move was unacceptable and had no basis of law in a version of "whatsoever" with Berlin's ruling on RT. "I urgently appeal to the Russian side not to abuse RT's licensing provisions for a political reaction," Germany's Culture Minister Claudia Roth said.

The announcement comes with tensions mounting between Russia and the West, particularly over fears of a Russian invasion of Ukraine. The closure also highlights the Kremlin's increasingly hostile position towards foreign media in the wake of several high-profile expulsions of journalists from foreign journalists. The Russian foreign ministry said in a statement Thursday it will also "terminate the satellite and other broadcasting (output) of

Deutsche Welle" on Russian territory. It added that it was initiating the process of designating the German media a "foreign agent" and said that further "operational measures" will be announced in the future.

Deutsche Welle - a German state-owned broadcaster - has services in 30 languages, including Russian. The moves come after Germany's broadcasting regulator on Wednesday announced it was banning the transmission of the channel "RT DE" over the lack of a broadcasting licence. Deutsche Welle's chief Peter Limbourg said the sever was an "absurd reaction of the Russian government." Even if we were to close it eventually, that will not affect our coverage of Russia - rather we will significantly boost our coverage, said Limbourg.

Deutsche Welle's Moscow bureau chief Jiri Rescheto said he had been ordered to close the bureau by Friday morning. Vladimir Putin Hails Russia's "Unprecedented" Close Ties With China

Russian President Vladimir Putin on Friday hailed his country's close ties with China, in a meeting with Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping ahead of the opening of the Winter Olympic Games in Beijing. Xi's Chinese capital is the only Chinese city to develop relations in the face of mounting criticism from the West. Moscow's ties with Beijing are "developing progressively along the path of friendship and strategic partnership," Putin said in remarks at the start of their meeting. "They are of a truly unprecedented nature" - the Russian leader said describing relations as an "example of a dignified relationship." He said ahead of the meeting that Moscow had prepared a new contract for the supply of 10 billion cubic metres of natural gas to China from Russia's Far East. In the days leading up to the trip, a Kremlin aide said the two leaders also would sign a document that reflected their "common views on security and other issues. Later in the day, Putin will take part in the opening ceremony of the Olympic Games. While Russian officials are banned from attending international sporting competitions over a doping scandal, they may attend if invited by the head of state of the host country.

North Korea Calls Beijing Winter Olympics "Great Victory" For China

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un sent a message to Chinese President Xi Jinping congratulating him on the Beijing Winter Olympics as a "great victory" and saying he wanted to improve relations between their countries. State news agency KCNA credited on Friday. The successful opening of the Beijing Winter Olympics despite the worldwide health crisis and unprecedented security circumstances is another great victory won by socialist China," Kim said in the letter, according to KCNA. Kim said that he would "steadily develop the relations between the two parties and the two countries to a new high stage." The Olympics are set to open in Beijing on Friday. The United Nations Security Council will the same day to discuss a recent round of North Korean missile tests, including the launch of an intermediate-range ballistic missile on Sunday the first test of that type since 2017.

Afghan Situation Precarious Nearly 6 Months After Taliban Takeover: UN

The situation in Afghanistan remains precarious and uncertain nearly six months after the Taliban takeover, as the multiple political, socio-economic and humanitarian shocks reverberate across the war-ravaged country, the UN Secretary-General said in a report Thursday.

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, in his report Thursday on the situation in Afghanistan and its implications for international peace and security, said that the best way to promote stability and future international support is for the Taliban to avoid the isolation that characterised its previous experience in power.

The Taliban is showing efforts to present itself as a caretaker government. The movement, however, has yet to fulfil governing structures that reflect the country's ethnic, political and religious diversity by including women. Efforts are encouraged by the UN Secretary-General, as well as to encourage

clashes in many ways with international norms of governance. The movement is also



seeking to manage its own internal coherence. With the Taliban not having established the trust of many of the Afghan people or convinced Afghans of its capacity to govern, many continue to seek to leave their country. Moving forward, it is essential that every effort be made to

reach out to all segments of Afghan society in order to establish a process that can lead to inclusive governance

shocks reverberate across the country. The Taliban seized power in Afghanistan on August 15, two weeks before the US complete troop withdrawal on August 31 after a costly two-decade war. This forced Afghan President Ashraf Ghani, who was backed by the US and led West, to flee the country to the UAE. The Taliban's soldiers stormed across Afghanistan

and captured all major cities in a matter of days, as Afghan security forces trained and equipped by the US and its allies melted away. The report added that Afghanistan is experiencing a massive economic contraction. An entire complex social and economic system is shutting down in part because of the deficiencies in government, the suspension of non-humanitarian aid flows and sanctions. The best way to promote stability and future international support is for the Taliban to avoid the isolation that characterised its previous experience in power. Developing a constructive dialogue between the de facto authorities, other Afghan stakeholders, the region and the international community, led as focused on the wellbeing and rights of the Afghan people is therefore essential. I note positively the steps taken towards establishing such a dialogue. Guterres said she underlined that the suspension of such dialogue address the broad range of issues relat
