China falls into deflation as demand revival fails



Beijing: China's consumer sector fell into deflation and factory-gate prices extended declines in July, as the world's second-largest economy struggled to revive demand and pressure mounted on Beijing to release more direct policy stimulus. Anxiety is rising that China is entering an era of much slower economic growth akin to the period of Japan's lost decades, which saw consumer prices and wages stagnate for a generation, a stark contrast to the rapid inflation seen elsewhere. China's post-pandemic recovery has slowed after a brisk start in the first quarter as demand at home and abroad weakened and a flurry of policies to support the economy failed. REUTERS

Pakistan parliament 'set for dissolution'



Islamabad: Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said he would advise the president to dissolve parliament, setting the stage for a national election as the country grapples with political and economic crises. The parliament's five-year term is due to expire on August 12, but this move would dissolve it three days earlier. "I will tonight advise the president to dissolve the parliament," the premier told parliament. The X factor: Indian content creators raking in the moolah

GOOD MOVE, FINALLY. With ad revenue share payouts, X set to become a viable platform: Experts

Indian content creators on X, formerly known as Twitter, have begun receiving ad revenue share payouts from the platform. This is part of the platform's global ad revenue share model, which lets creators get a share of the revenue from the ads that are served in their replies.

Experts believe this could lead to a surge in blue tick subscriptions in the country, and also end up making X a viable platform for content creators.

Abhishek Asthana, Co-Founder of Hood, and owner of @GabbarSingh, told *businessline*: "Unlike YouTube and Instagram, content creators on X were not being incentivised to

create content on the platform.

"Hence, X had not really been their key choice for content monetisation. This will encourage a lot more creators to become active on the platform,

and may help them earn a living. I believe with this strategy Elon Musk has made all content creators, who are getting payouts, as endorsers or salesmen of blue tick subscrip-

tions." Eligible creators are users that are subscribed to X Premium, earlier known as Twitter Blue. They must have at least 15 million organic impressions on their cumulative posts within the last three months, have at least 500 followers, and a Stripe account, among other parameters.

"There will definitely be a surge in blue tick subscriptions, and content creators will work hard to hit the 15 million impressions-mark," said Asthana. Angel investor and business strategist, Lloyd Mathias, said: "I think of all the moves made by Musk in the past year-and-a-half, this one has been welcomed universally. This will definitely see creators gravitating towards X, and the platform will see an upward spike."

According to a recent re-

search by RedSeer, the size of the influencer community in the country - with more than 10,000 followers - is estimated at 3.5 million to 4 million.

'POSITIVE SIGNS'

Ambika Sharma, Founder and MD, Pulp Strategy, said: "This is a new initiative and early signs are positive. Influencers who have received payments from Twitter have reported that they are seeing an increase in engagement with their followers."

"It is possible that this initiative will lead to more blue tick subscriptions. If influencers are able to create more high-quality content and engage with their followers more effectively, they are more likely to attract blue tick subscriptions."

Social-media influencers with over 5 lakh fan base are celebrities, says ASCI

In a bid to bring social-media influencers under its guidelines, the Advertising Standards Council of India (ASCI) has decided to broaden the definition of celebrities.

Influencers with a fan following of 5 lakh or more will now be considered celebrities.

The ASCI code now defines celebrities as individuals that get "compensated ₹40 lakh or equivalent value annually for appearing in advertisements or campaigns on any medium and any format or have a social media following of 5 lakh or more on any single social-media handle".

Manisha Kapoor, CEO & Secretary General, ASCI said: "We have seen a surge in misleading ads featuring celebrities. In 2022-23, ASCI processed 500 misleading ads featuring celebrities, compared to just 55 ads in 2021-22."

This widening of definition also comes at a time when the Consumer Protection Act puts the responsibility of due diligence on celebrities regarding the claims made by brands they endorse. This responsibility of due diligence has been put on all endorsers, whether celebrities or not.

'SCENARIO DIFFERENT'

"With the advent of social media and the increasing popularity of influencers on digital media, the definition of celebrities has come to change drastically. Earlier, only personalities from the world of sports or entertainment were considered celebrities.

"Today, however, the

scenario is different. We have a range of personalities who are extremely popular on social media and share a close personal connection with consumers. These personalities affect the spending habits of consumers who trust them," Kapoor stated.

She added that to ensure protection of consumer rights, ASCI has decided to widen the ambit and now it includes all personalities who have a notable influence as celebrities.

TRUE TESTIMONIALS

According to the ASCI code, testimonials of celebrities must reflect their genuine, recent opinion, and must be based on adequate information or experience about the product or service being advertised.

The guidelines also mandate that celebrities conduct due diligence to ensure that claims featured in the advertisements can be objectively verified and substantiated. Celebrities, when called upon, also need to produce evidence of due diligence.

The code also stipulates that celebrities should not participate in the advertisement of a product, treatment or remedies that are prohibited for advertising under the Drugs & Magic Remedies (Objectionable Advertisements) Act, 1954, and the updated Drugs & Cosmetic Act, 1940, and Rules 1945 (Schedule J).

Maran seeks attachment of 50% of SpiceJet's daily revenues

Kalanithi Maran, Chairman of Sun Group, has sought the attachment of 50 per cent of SpiceJet's daily revenues towards payment of ₹393 crore the low-cost airline owes him.

He has filed an application in the Delhi High Court, stating that Ajay Singh, MD and Chairman of the airline, has not complied with the said orders.

On August 9, Maran's legal representative, Maininder Singh, said that SpiceJet has not yet furnished an affidavit detailing its financial assets and liabilities. Singh went on to allege that the airline had brazenly

disregarded court orders issued by the High Court and Supreme Court. He said that Singh was non-compliant, suggesting SpiceJet was actively sidestepping its legal obligations.

Singh said that the Code of Civil Procedure empowers the court to order the arrest of a judgment debtor for non-compliance with asset affidavit orders. He further said that SpiceJet's persistent refusal to adhere to such directives deprives the airline of the right to be heard before the court.

NON-ADHERENCE

Singh further said that SpiceJet had a history of non-adherence to court or-



ders. He highlighted that the airline did not comply with a High Court order dated November 4, 2020, directing the submission of an affidavit of asset disclosure.

Despite subsequent reaffirmation of this directive in a May 29 order, SpiceJet has yet to fulfil this requirement within the stipulated

four-week timeframe.

LEGAL TUSSELE

This legal tussle traces its origins back to a complex web of share transfers and financial transactions that unfolded in 2015. Maran and his investment vehicle, KAL Airways, transferred a significant stake in SpiceJet to Ajay Singh. This transfer

came laden with substantial liabilities totalling ₹1,500 crore.

Subsequent arbitration proceedings culminated in a ruling that awarded Maran a refund of ₹579 crore, coupled with accrued interest. The arbitration decision further imposed a set of obligations and guarantees upon SpiceJet.

The Delhi High Court has responded to Maran's application by issuing a notice to SpiceJet, demanding the submission of a comprehensive statement of accounts within a week.

The court has additionally summoned Ajay Singh to appear personally on August 24, reinforcing the gravity of the situation.

Sri Lanka 'is back in business': Minister

Noting that the worst is over and the country is back in business, Sri Lanka State Minister of Finance, Shehan Semasinghe, said on Wednesday that tourism, logistics and renewable energy were attractive short-term investment-worthy sectors in the island country.

The Minister, who stressed that "now is the ideal time to invest in Sri Lanka", repeatedly said the country had learned from its mistakes and would never repeat them. Speaking at the Invest Sri Lanka Investor Forum, a meeting organised by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), Semasinghe detailed the reforms undertaken by Sri Lanka, and how they were helping the country recover from last year's economic crisis.

INDIAN RUPEE DEALS

He said the Sri Lankan government had announced that the Indian rupee would be a "designated currency", meaning transactions in Sri Lanka could be done in the rupee.

PKG Harishchandra, Director of Research, Central Bank of Sri Lanka, made a de-

tailed presentation on how the economy was recovering. The presentation showed inflation coming under control, improving tax collections, increase in tourist arrivals, pick up in private sector credit, declining trade deficit, and increase in remittance from overseas Sri Lankans.

Dilshan Wirasekara, Chairman, Colombo Stock Exchange, emphasised that the exchange was attractive to list on with zero capital gains tax and stamp duty.

Sri Lanka is set to undertake several roadshows in India following the first one in Chennai on Wednesday to showcase the nation's resurgence and attract Indian investments.

Disease X: CEPI to fund Genova's saRNA platform

Pune-based Genova Biopharmaceuticals will receive funding from the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI) to develop the self-amplifying mRNA (saRNA) platform. The platform will develop vaccine candidates against unknown pathogenic threats or Disease X.

"CEPI will provide up to \$3.6 million to support the optimisation of the saRNA platform technology, production pro-

cess, and yield," said a joint note. "A vaccine candidate will then be produced against rabies virus, part of the Rhabdoviridae family of viruses, for pre-clinical studies.

"Testing the vaccine candidate against this known virus, with accepted correlates of protection, will help to assess the concepts behind this new technology," it explained.

Genova's saRNA vaccine platform could form part of a group of RNA technologies that CEPI is supporting to enable rapid responses to future epidemics and pandemic threats.

Cabinet clears changes to GST laws to levy 28% GST on casinos

PTI, NEW DELHI: The Union Cabinet on Wednesday approved changes to GST laws to levy a 28 per cent tax on the full face value of bets in online gaming, casinos and horse race clubs, sources said.

The online gaming industry and some horse racing clubs are currently paying GST at the rate of 18% on platform fees/commission ranging from 5 to 20% of the full face value, while some horse race clubs are paying 28% on the full face value

IGST laws. The Council, the highest decision-making body of the new indirect tax regime that comprises the Union finance minister and representatives of all states, on August 2 decided that 28% GST will be levied at the face value of entry-level bets placed in gaming platforms and casinos.

paying GST at the rate of 18% on platform fees/commission ranging from 5 to 20% of the full face value, while some horse race clubs are paying 28% on

the full face value. They are disputing the 28 per cent levy on actionable claims in the form of betting and gambling before various legal fora.

WIDENING TAX NET

The amendments to the Central GST (CGST) and Integrated GST (IGST) acts, which were approved by the GST Council last week, are likely to be introduced in the ongoing monsoon session of Parliament, which will end on August 11.

CGST Act, 2017, to provide clarity on the taxation of supplies in casinos, horse racing and online gaming.

The Council also recommended inserting a provision in the IGST Act, 2017, to impose GST liability on online money gaming provided by offshore entities. Such entities would be required to get GST registration in India.

The amendments will also provide for blocking access to online gaming platforms located overseas in

case of failure to comply with registration and tax payment provisions.

The amended provisions in the GST laws -- which would specifically define online gaming, online money gaming, virtual digital assets used to pay for online games and suppliers in case of online gaming -- will be effective from October 1.

Sources said the Union Cabinet in its meeting on Wednesday has cleared the amendments to CGST and
