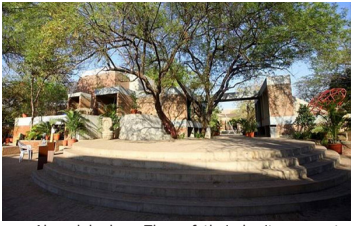

National Monuments Authority recognises CEPT's Center for Heritage Conservation as expert heritage body



Ahmedabad : The Center for Heritage Conservation (CHC) of CEPT University in Ahmedabad has been recognised as one of the expert heritage bodies with powers to prepare bylaws to protect monuments by the National Monuments Authority (NMA) under the Ministry of Culture, Government of India. In the past, the CHC of CEPT Research and Development Foundation (CRDF) has been instrumental in conducting heritage impact assessments for some notable projects in Ahmedabad. It has also advised the Agra Municipal Corporation on addressing the management

of their heritage assets. Members of the CHC team have played a key role in the preparation of the nomination dossier for Ahmedabad to be recognised as a World Heritage City by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (Unesco).

Section 20E(1) of Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remains (AMASR) Act, 1958, as amended in 2010, mentions expert heritage bodies will work with the central government to prepare heritage bylaws concerning nationally important monuments and protected

areas. All nationally protected monuments have a 300-metre area around them demarcated as protected and regulated. Each of these sites is unique and needs some generic and some specific bylaws. The NMA has long been looking at this aspect and hopes to address it with the engagement of expert bodies across the country. The recent notification included 34 such bodies into the panel of expert heritage bodies, including centres at the Indian Institute of Technology (IITs) National Institute of Technology (NITs), Centre for Historical Studies at OP Jindal Global University inaryana, Urban Design Research Institute in Mumbai among others.

The CRDF is the research and advisory arm of CEPT University. Through CRDF, University engages actively in research projects, advisory assignments and capacity building initiatives aimed at solving critical problems in the built environment and improving people's quality of life in towns and cities.

sted in illegal arms cases in Gujarat Police special drive



Ahmedabad : As many as 106 cases were lodged and 114 persons arrested for illegal sales, purchase, smuggling possession and production of firearms and ammunition across Gujarat in a special drive by Gujarat Police in February.

As per a statement released by the office of Gujarat Director General of Police (DGP) Ashish Bhatia Monday, a month-long special drive was organised from February 1 to February 28 across all 33 districts of the state in which police personnel attached with local crime branch (LCB) and Special Operations Group (SOG) teams took part in the investigation. "Investigative teams were asked to create a database of all accused involved/absconding in cases of smuggling, possession, sale/purchase of illegal weapons and ammunition. Meanwhile, a database was also created of those with arms licences, including private security agencies and their present whereabouts. Teams were asked to take action if suspicious activity was found in the database," read a statement from the office of the DGP. A plan has been made to nab the accused who have absconded to Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra, it added.

Sabar Dairy director Jayanti Patel cuts Cong ties, joins BJP



Ahmedabad : Jayanti Patel, one of the directors of Sabarkantha District Cooperative Milk Producers Union Limited also known as Sabar Dairy, joined Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) at Gandhinagar on Monday, quitting his association with Congress.

Kathakar Morari Bapu donates Rs 1.25 crore to Indians in Ukraine



Ahmedabad : Expressing his condolences to those who have been affected by the Russian invasion in Ukraine, Kathakar Morari Bapu raised a donation of Rs 1.25 crore to Indians and others affected in Ukraine.

On an appeal from Morari Bapu for a generous contribution to construct the Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, his trust received a staggering amount of Rs 19 crore, of which Rs 9 crore was donated by foreign devotees and philanthropists, a release issued from Chitrukut Dham in Tajgajarda stated. London-based Lord Dollarbah Popat and his son Pawan decided to allocate Rs 1.25 crore from the Ram Mandir donations to 10 different organisations, which are operating in Poland, Slovakia and Romania and are involved in various activities such as the evacuation of Ukraine war victims, providing them with shelter, food and medical facilities.

"In the spirit of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam, the amount is being utilised as per the requirement for the Indian victims and also for those belonging to other religions or castes. He has prayed for a speedy end to the conflict between the two countries and for those who have lost their lives in this tragic situation," it added.

From peon to delivery executive — how lives of women from Ahmedabad changed

Ahmedabad : Chhayaben Chauhan felt liberated at the same time empowered the day she got her driving licence. For a woman who has never stepped out of her house alone or knew how to ride a bicycle, she now works as a delivery executive for a food delivery company Ahmedabad.

Chhayaben's journey from a peon to a delivery executive where she earns Rs 20,000 per month against Rs 2,000 she was making to make her ends meet has inspired many other women in her vicinity and family who earlier would raise aspersions on her decision to learn driving and take up as a driver.

With her salary she has already bought a two-wheeler for her and repaid the loan taken for her son's treatment. Paying school fees for her son is not an issue now, she says happily. A family of her five-year-old son, husband and sister-in-law, Chhayaben along with her husband worked as a peon in a nearby school in Mirzapur. With a combined monthly income of Rs 6000 it was difficult for them to manage the household expenses and their son's school fees and to repay the debt taken for her son's medical treatment.

However, after the first Covid-19 lockdown and schools closing down, she lost her job as a peon. Then she took up household chores and managed to sustain for a few months. Coming across the non-governmental organisation Janvikas, and its programme — Driven — Chhayaben joined it with the hope of earning a better life for her family.

Initiated in 2016, over 350 have been enrolled in the programme where women from weak socio-economic backgrounds are selected and professionally trained and placed as drivers. "I faced a lot of challenges in stepping out of my home alone and learning to drive. Even my husband declined my urge of working as a driver. My husband also tried to stop my training at one point of time and beat me up. Also, neighbours and my relatives too raised questions on me going out alone,

learning to drive and working as a driver. But with the strong will I continued in what I wanted to." As she was not literate, she first learned it after a long practice in order to clear her learning license exam on the computer. Later, she cleared the permanent license test too. Chhayaben lacked sense of empowerment training with the outer exposure of the city after which she gained confidence to travel alone," says Sayani from Janvikas.

Working as a food delivery executive for last seven months, she says she still faces challenges in the field. "Many customers say they are very happy to see a female delivery person but I do keep safety measures when I feel insecure. For instance, I do not stay for long and rush back when there is a male customer to take the delivery.

Surat: Citizens strive for plastic-free Tapi

SURAT: A team of members from Project Surat gathered at ONGC bridge on Magdalla-Hazira road on Sunday morning to form a human wall to prevent people from throwing plastic and other waste material from the bridge. Volunteers of the NGO also collected 13 kilo of waste within an hour. Founder of the group, Akash Bansal said, "A total of 15 volunteers gathered at ONGC bridge at around 8am and cleaned the bridge. They collected paper waste, flower offerings and plastic waste Tapi separately.

The paper waste will be given for recycling into handmade paper, while the plastic waste will be given to the SMC. The flower waste will be turned into compost and natural colours." "We also stopped many people and told them not to pollute the river with waste and its hazardous consequences. We also sprinkled bio-enzyme (a homemade natural liquid made by using fruit peels) in the Tapi river through bridge for bio-remediation," Bansal added.

Gujarat: Back in schools, children are reeling under online hangover



AHMEDABAD: Rehaan (name changed), 9, a class IV student, would refuse to lower his mask even when going out on a break, fearing that he might catch Covid-19. Anika (name changed), 11, a student of class VI, would start fidgeting midway in a session, waiting for a break to eat something or just move around.

Saturday on March 5 marked the first fortnight of opening of schools in Gujarat after the classes went "100% offline" from February 18. A primary survey by the state mental health programme indicated that the nearly two-year-long absence from in-person schooling has resulted in issues such as shorter attention span and apprehension about their learning abilities.

students and those who need assistance can be referred to experts such as 14 medical colleges and 4 mental health hospitals." The counsellors associated with the initiative said that longer classroom sessions were found to be an issue with some kids, as they were used to having munching breaks or using other gadgets for chats or games even during sessions. Some are also realizing the gaps in learning with classroom tests where no assistance can be sought from family members. This revenue earned from passenger movements is 6.5 times less compared to the earnings from first year of operations of the Ahmedabad metro which is plying on only 6.5 kilometers of the total 40-kilometer route in the city. The annual report points out that metro operations, launched by

Prime Minister Narendra Modi in March 2019, remained suspended between April-August 2020 due to Covid lockdown and the restrictions that followed later. In 2021-22, only 130 persons travelled daily on the Ahmedabad metro which is much lower than the 800-900 passengers who rode daily during 2019-20. This dip in ridership caused passenger fare collections to dip from Rs 28.7 lakh in 2019-20 to 4.42 lakh in 2021. Currently the daily ridership is close to 1000 passengers and it is expected to increase phenomenally once

the rest of the Phase-1 metro network gets commissioned by August 2022. While GMRC officials told The Sunday Express that the Phase-1 of Ahmedabad metro is 83 per cent complete, the annual report states that of the total 32 sets of trains that was imported from South Korea, seven trains are in operation in the 6.5 kilometer route between Vastral Garm and Apparel Park. GMRC has already begun work on constructing the Phase-II of Ahmedabad metro that will connect Ahmedabad with Gandhinagar.
