Min KTR Unveils Ambitious Plans for Handloom Sector Development

Pochampally : In a momentous event held in Pochampally, Telangana, Minister of IT, Municipal Administration, and Handloom Textile Department, Kalvakuntla Taraka Rama Rao, unveiled a series of ambitious initiatives aimed at uplifting the handloom sector and benefiting handloom families. The Minister's visit to Pochampally included the inauguration of various key projects and participation in the National Handloom Week program, where he emphasized the government's commitment to supporting the skilled weavers of Telangana. During the event, Minister KTR expressed his appreciation for the artisans and weavers, describing the loom as a symbol of their hard work and heritage. He highlighted the Chief Minister's understanding of the challenges faced by the handloom workers, as he himself has a personal connection to the craft, having studied in the house of a weaver in Dubbaka.



Minister KTR outlined several significant initiatives aimed at rejuvenating the handloom sector. Notably, he announced that an enhanced insurance scheme has been implemented, providing coverage to netanas (weavers) until the age of 75. He also revealed plans to directly deposit

INR 3,000 per month into the accounts of handloom workers, a unique initiative aimed at providing financial stability to artisans. The Minister stressed the importance of modernization for the handloom industry and introduced the Telangana Handlooms program, which will allo-

cate INR 40 crore to upgrade traditional looms. He encouraged weavers to adopt frame looms to enhance their productivity and access global markets. Additionally, he revealed the government's intention to establish a handloom museum in Uppal Bhagayat to showcase the rich heri-

tage of handloom textiles.

In a heartfelt gesture, Minister KTR announced that the government has increased financial assistance for the funeral expenses of deceased handloom workers from INR 5,000 to INR 25,000. He reiterated the government's commitment to elevate the handloom sector to new heights and emphasized that the profits generated from the Pochampally handloom park will be directed towards the welfare of handloom families in the region.

Praising the weavers' skill and dedication, Minister KTR affirmed that the handloom sector is an integral part of Telangana's heritage and a vital source of employment. He criticized the central government's cancellation of key handloom and powerloom schemes and GST imposition on handloom products, urging them to support and preserve this traditional art form. The Minister's visit marked a significant milestone in the government's efforts to empower handloom workers and promote their craftsmanship on a global stage. With a clear focus on innovation, modernization, and social welfare, these initiatives are poised to revitalize the handloom sector and ensure a brighter future for the skilled artisans of Pochampally and beyond.

Telangana Cong launches 'Thiragabadadham - Tharimikodadam' campaign



Hyderabad: The Telangana Congress on Saturday launched the "Thiragabadadham - Tharimikodadam" campaign, in a bid to garner public support amid the fast-approaching polls. The campaign will see over 10,000 leaders and cadre of the party attempting to

directly reach out to voters through 12,000-gram sabhas and 3,000 division meetings, the party said in a statement. The campaign, which translates to 'Let's rise and revolt', is touted as an aggressive step against the ruling Bharat Rashtia Samithi government. It includes a chargesheet,

postcard movement, and a unique people's court event. Citizens can support the campaign through a dedicated missed call number, 7661899899, Congress said. Under the campaign, Telangana Congress aims to reach out to over 75 lakh households through a door-to-door initiative.

Telangana HC expresses discontent over flood report, seeks fresh one

Hyderabad: The Telangana High Court has ordered a fresh report on floods in the state after expressing its disappointment over the report generated on the recent floods. A bench comprising chief justice Alok Aradhe and Justice T Vinod Kumar, on Friday, directed the administration to furnish a fresh report in accordance with the court's directives issued on July 27 and August 1, 2023. The bench outlined specific requirements that need to be includ-

ed in the fresh report. "It must encompass comprehensive particulars about the flood victims, special measures taken under the Disaster Management Act, actions taken to mitigate the situation, details of deceased individuals, specifics of family members receiving compensation of Rs 4 lakh, and a comprehensive overview of rehabilitation efforts for the affected victims by the next hearing on August 17, 2023," stated the bench. The state

government was earlier asked by the court to submit a detailed report on the floods, following which Special Government Pleader (SGP) Harender Prasad, presented a report outlining the ramifications of the heavy rainfall in Telangana. The report stated that Telangana witnessed relentless rains from July 18 to 27, leading to the loss of 49 lives, and extensive damage to irrigation tanks, and agricultural crops. Warnings from the IMD had fore-

warned of exceptionally heavy rainfall on July 19 and 20, followed by additional alerts between July 26 and 28. Additionally, it said that the flood crisis was exacerbated by copious rainfall in the coastal areas of Maharashtra and the catchment regions of the River Godavari. The SGP also said that the chief minister announced an allocation of Rs 500 crore for the restoration of flood-affected areas in response to the damage.
