Bodies of 2 girls found in a well

A tragic incident has come to light in Kalwan taluka of Nashik district, where the bodies of two girls were discovered in a well. The shocking discovery was made on Aug 26. One of the deceased girls was a minor, while the other was in her 20s. Preliminary reports suggest that the two girls were friends. The victims have been identified as Madhuri More (20) and Geetanjali Ekhande (13). According to the informa-



tion available, both girls had left their homes together on Aug 25 but did not return. Concerned family members, after waiting for their return, eventually began searching for them, leading to the tragic discovery. The incident has caused considerable distress in the community, and investigations are underway to determine the circumstances surrounding their deaths. Police are investigating all the angles of suicide or any other reason or crime.

AMID FLOOD CONCERNS, GIRNA DAM IS 90% FULL

Incessant heavy rainfall over the past three days has caused rivers and drains in Jalgaon district to overflow, leading to flooding. Several dams in the district have started filling and discharging water, raising concerns of further flooding at the riverside areas. In the meantime, the Girna Dam, which is the largest one in northern Maharashtra, is now 90% full, according to an official.

Girna division's Executive Engineer Devendra Agrawal confirmed that with 90% water storage in the Girna Dam, the district's drinking water problems are resolved, and sufficient water is available for rabi crop irrigation during the winters.

The district administration has issued warnings to residents in riverside villages, including those near the Girna, Vaghur and Anjani rivers, urging them to remain vigilant and safe. Collector Ayush Prasad has urged residents of riverside villages to take precautions.



On Monday, a three-storey building collapsed in Bhusawal, but fortunately, there were no casualties. Following the collapse of the house in Bhusawal, Prasad visited the area to assess the condition of old buildings and ensure safety measures were in place.

The Waghur Dam, which supplies water to Jalgaon city and the MIDC, is currently at 83% capacity. The Hatnoor Dam on the Tapi River is receiving significant inflow from the Purna River, prompting the opening of 16 gates of the dam and the release of 61,000 cusecs of water.

In Dhule district, incessant rain has also caused rivers to flood, and medium projects like Panzra, Malangaon, Jamkhedi and others are now full. Similarly, in Nandurbar district, projects such as Rangavali and Dara have reached their full capacity.

1L tribals to march today to Adivasi Vikas Bhavan

Former MLA JP Gavit demanded that CM Eknath Shinde must decide on the vacancies by August 28

More than a lakh tribals from around 13 tribal districts will come to Nashik for a mega march to the Adivasi Vikas Bhavan today raising the issue of recruitment to around 12,000 vacant positions in 17 cadres, over which they have been agitating for a long time.

Former CPI(M) MLA JP Gavit, who was on hunger strike in front of Adivasi Vikas Bhavan demanding PESA recruitment, has warned Chief Minister Eknath Shinde from an all-party meeting. He demanded that the government should decide on recruitment by Aug 28.

The all-party meeting took place on Monday, Aug 26, at Adivasi Vikas Bhavan for the recruitment of 17 cadres in the PESA sector. In the meeting, a resolution was unanimously approved that the government should expedite the recruitment of the vacant posts. It was also decided to hold an all-party march on Wednesday.

Accordingly, more than a lakh tribals from around 13 tribal districts will come to Nashik for the march on Wednesday. After the march, a sit-in protest will also be held in front of the Tribal Development Building. Gavit has warned that this strike will continue till the demand for PESA recruitment is accepted. About 25 MLAs and two MLCs will join the protest and will demand bringing Shinde to the protest so that he can decide on the recruitment, said the Deputy Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, Narahari Zirwal.



Apart from Gavit, Chiranjeev Indrajit Gavit, Chiranjeev Indrajit Gavit, Tribal Ulgulan Sena president Prabhakar Fasale, Ravana Yuva Foundation's Vicky Munja, State Tribal Rescue Mission's central president Ashok Bagul, Mayur Bagul, Balasaheb Jadhav, Rajesh Gaikwad, Vikram Padvi, Yogesh Gavit, Jayashree Gavit, Bharti Bhoje others will be there in the protest.

Prakash Ambedkar's offer to Gavit Vanchit Bahujan Aghadi (VBA) leader Prakash Ambedkar met Gavit and supported the movement. He has reportedly asked Gavit to target marching to the Chief Minister's Office rather than the Adivasi Vikas Bhavan. During the discussion, he offered Gavit to join the third front. But Gavit explained that he would decide according to his senior leaders.

Leopard rescued from well in Niphad taluka

A leopard that had fallen into a well at Shirasgaon in Niphad taluka was safely rescued by the combined efforts of the Chandwad and Yewala Forest Reserve Officers, the modern rescue team of Niphad, AREAS Foundation and the residents. The incident came to light

when a local farmer spotted the four-year-old leopard in a well located in Sandeep Bhaurao Sonwale's field, group number 349 of Shirasgaon and Niphad. The farmer promptly informed the forest department officials, who arrived at the scene.

Under the guidance of Assistant Conservator of Forest Chandwad Shivaji Sahane, Forest Range Officer Yeola



Akshay Mhetre, Chandwad Forest Range Officer SB Waghmare, Modern Rescue team members Vijay Mali, Sagar Dusing, wildlife researcher Sushant Ranshur of AREAS Foundation and social worker Sharad Jadhav from Kasbe Sukene, along with local farmers, successfully executed the rescue operation.

Using a crane, they lowered

a cage into the well. The leopard willingly entered the cage when it was placed near its mouth. The cage door was immediately closed, and the leopard was safely lifted out of the well. The forest department officials have stated that the leopard will soon be released back into its natural habitat. Police officers and staff from Pimpalgaon managed the crowd at the scene.

15 MMC officials booked by ACB

A case has been registered against 15 officials and employees of the Malegaon Municipal Corporation (MMC) under the Prevention of Corruption Act. The charges follow the discovery that they deliberately avoided paying an amount, resulting in a financial loss to the government and the corporation.

Bureau officials said that the accused misused their positions and powers by neglecting their assigned duties. Specifically, they failed to check the actual work expenditure and to ensure the proper utilisation of government funds, which were supposed to be verified in relation to work done by the contractor, Y Sohail Abdul Rahman Masuma Ali Shah of Shah Firm. The accused allegedly facilitated the payment to the contractor without proper evaluation of the work, resulting in criminal misconduct and financial benefit to themselves. The total financial loss (embezzlement) to the government and the MMC amounted to ₹20,68,607.

Consequently, a case has been registered against the 15 accused under Section 13(1)(a) of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988, and Sections 409, 420, 468, 471 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code on Monday.
