MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Your Directors have pleasure in presenting the management discussion and analysis report for the year ended on March 31, 2024.

GLOBAL CHEMICAL INDUSTRY:

Global chemical production (excluding pharmaceuticals) is forecasted to increase by 2.7% in 2024, surpassing the growth rate of the previous year (2023: +1.7%). Advanced economies are expected to see modest production growth following a significant decline in previous year (2024: +0.8%, 2023: -4.9%), while growth in emerging markets is anticipated to grow slightly (2024: +3.5%, 2023: +4.8%). In China, the largest chemical market, lower but still notable growth in chemical production is expected at 4.0%. This growth is primarily driven by the consumer goods and electronics industries. Other emerging markets in Asia, are expected to gradually recover with India being the main growth contributor at 4.5%. United States is anticipated to see a slight recovery in chemical demand (2024: +1.1%, 2023: -1.0%) after a year marked by destocking and weak industrial growth. Growth is expected across most customer industries in the manufacturing sector, with additional growth expected in the automotive industry. However, uncertainties remain due to high interest rates and the risk of recession, particularly in the construction sector. In European Union (EU), despite challenges such as high cost levels and a weak economy, production is expected to stabilize at the current level (2024: +0.8%), factors such as lower gas prices and a slow recovery in demand for goods are expected to support chemical demand in Europe. Global agrochemicals market experienced a decline in 2023 due to channel destocking, price corrections, and volatile weather. This trend is reflected in a 25% decrease in crop protection chemical exports from India and a steeper decline in Chinese exports, emphasising the industry-wide impact and the need for adaptation. Despite challenges, a gradual recovery is anticipated in 2024.

Key Global Trends

Chemical industry is crucial to the global economy, serving sectors like agriculture, construction, automotive, FMCG, consumer durables, electronics, healthcare, and more. It is undergoing significant change due to mega trends like Sustainability & Localisation and Digitalisation.

Sustainability is reshaping the way chemicals are produced and used. Chemical sector faces pressure to reduce its environmental impact and promote sustainable practices. It is also vital in providing sustainable products and services.

- As a 'hard to abate' sector, access to clean energy is essential for sustainability. Leading chemical companies are committed to reducing carbon emissions in line with the Paris Climate Accords, contributing significantly to low carbon energy investments.
- In response to climate change concerns, regulatory frameworks are evolving, paving the way for the establishment of carbon markets to incentivise sustainability efforts within industries.

• Alongside carbon emissions, reducing water usage is critical. Companies are striving for water neutrality through strategies like recycling, low water technologies, and Zero Liquid Discharge (ZLD) systems Developing sustainable chemicals and materials, guided by Green Chemistry principles, is a key trend. This involves creating renewable feedstock, ecofriendly processes, and ensuring waste is harmless. The demand for such products is projected to grow significantly in the coming years.

Digitalisation is revolutionising chemical industry, enhancing safety, efficiency, and productivity. Smart Factories, powered by Industry 4.0 technologies like automation, AI, and IIoT, are driving significant advancements.

- Digital tools such as remote monitoring, smart cameras, and VR/AR are improving safety metrics like TRIFR and PSI, while providing virtual training for emergency response.
- AI is revolutionising chemical R&D, expediting compound discovery, optimising reactions, and predicting properties. It accelerates new product development and shortens timelines, boosting industry agility and competitiveness.
- Automation is streamlining production, cutting manual labour, and reducing the risk of errors.
- Digital twins are slashing capex and time by replicating physical assets or processes.
- Blockchain is enhancing supply chain transparency and traceability in the chemical industry

INDIAN ECONOMY:

For India, the outlook is notably more optimistic. The IMF has revised its growth forecast for India's GDP to 7.0% for FY 2024-25, up from earlier estimates, citing strong private consumption and robust public investment as key drivers. The RBI also aligns with this optimistic view, projecting a 7.0% growth rate for the same period. The resilience of the Indian economy is attributed to Strong domestic demand, particularly in rural areas, which is crucial for sustaining growth and the government's commitment to infrastructure and capital expenditure is expected to bolster economic activity

Risks and Challenges Despite the positive outlook, several risks could impact both global and Indian economies:

• Geopolitical tensions: Ongoing conflicts and trade disputes may disrupt supply chains and affect investor confidence.

• Inflationary pressures: Persistently high inflation in services could complicate monetary policy, leading to prolonged periods of elevated interest rates.

• External demand: A slowdown in major economies could dampen India's export growth, particularly in sectors like pharmaceuticals and chemicals.

The expectation of Anti-Dumping Duties (ADD) caused a significant increase in imports into the Indian market, leading to ongoing price declines and affecting sales volumes. Your company filed application before the Directorate General of Trade Remedies (DGTR) to impose Anti-Dumping Duties (ADD) on slabstock due to excessive dumping at low prices. As a result of your Company's efforts, the DGTR announced ADD on slabstock products on March 28, 2024, pending approval by the Finance Ministry. This announcement disrupted the slabstock market, leading importers to aggressively import products to capitalize on the situation, causing an oversupply in the market. Advance Petrochemicals Limited being the only green petrochemical Company of its kind, figures in the list of leading chemical manufacturers in the country Subsidiary Companies: Nil

FINANCIAL RESULTS:

During the year under review, your company managed to achieve consolidated revenue of Rs.35.24 Crores as against Rs. 37.18 Crores which is decreased by 5.22 % as compared to last year. Net profit after tax decreased by 77.12 % to Rs. 21.60 Lacs as compared to Rs.94.43 Lacs during the last year.

The entire net profit after tax of Rs. 21.60 lacs is proposed to be transferred to the Statement of Profit & Loss in the form of Surplus of the Company.

5. <u>REMUNERATION CRITERIA:</u>

The Policy is largely based on industry benchmarks, the Company's performance visà-vis the industry, peer group comparison, factors like inflation rate in the country and performance of the employees.

a) For the Whole Time Directors/ Executive Directors:

- Nomination and Remuneration Committee shall recommend to the Board, the remuneration, within the maximum limits as set under the Companies Act, 2013, and Rules made there under and subject to the approval of the shareholders as and where applicable.
- Remuneration to whole time director/Executive Director would also depend on the performance and profitability of the company during the year as decided by Nomination and Remuneration committee from time to time. However, no remuneration or any other payments are made to any directors of the company and hence company does not require to have criteria for the same.

b) For the Key Managerial Personnel and Other Employees:

- The remuneration of other KMP and other employees largely consists of basic salary, perquisites, and allowances (both fixed and variable). Perquisites are paid according to the Company policy.
- The components of the total remuneration vary for different grades and are governed by the industry pattern, qualification & experience/merits, performance of each employee. The Company while deciding the remuneration package takes into consideration current employment scenario.

This policy shall remain in force unless modified by the Remuneration committee.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is material misstatement of this other information; we are required to report the fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT AND FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH, 2024

1. Corporate Information

ADVANCE PETROCHEMICALS LIMITED, a Chemical Industry of ADVANCE GROUP OF COMPANIES, One of the Business House at Ahmadabad. Company Established in 1984 by eminent industrialist late Shri Vishwanath Goenka. Company is engaged in manufacturing of Ethanol Amines, Alkyl Alknolamines, Non Ionic Surfactants, Oil field chemicals, Polyethylene Glycol, LeingInhibitor for aviation fuel, Acrylic& co- Acrylic Binder Glycol Ether, Auxillaries & Specialty Chemical Hydraulic Brake Fluid, Radiator coolant etc.

The financial statements were authorized for issue in accordance with a resolution of the Board of directors on May 24, 2024.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

2.1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared with all material aspect with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under section 133 of the companies Act, 2013 (the Act) read with the Companies (Indian Accounting standards) Rules, 2015 and other relevant provisions of the Act. The Accounting Policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

2.2 Historical Cost Convention

The financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis.

2.3 Rounding of amounts

The financial statements are presented in INR and all values are rounded to the nearest rupees.

2.4. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following are the significant accounting policies applied by the Company in preparing its financial statements consistently to all the periods.

2.5. Current versus non-current classification

The Company presents assets and liabilities in the Balance Sheet based on current/non-current classification.

An asset is current when it is:

- Expected to be realized or intended to be sold or consumed in the normal operating cycle;
- Held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- Expected to be realized within twelve months after the reporting period; or
- Cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is current when:

- It is expected to be settled in the normal operating cycle;
- It is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- It is due to be settled within twelve months after the reporting period; or
- There is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period.

The Company classifies all other liabilities as non-current.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are classified as non-current assets and liabilities.

Operating cycle

Operating cycle of the Company is the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realization in cash or cash equivalents. As the Company's normal operating cycle is not clearly identifiable, it is assumed to be twelve months.

2.6. Use of estimates and judgments

The estimates and judgments used in the preparation of the financial statements are continuously evaluated by the Company and are based on historical experience and various other assumptions and factors (including expectations of future events) that the Company believes to be reasonable under the existing circumstances. Difference between actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known / materialized.

The said estimates are based on the facts and events, that existed as at the reporting date, or that occurred after that date but provide additional evidence about conditions existing as at the reporting date.

2.7. Foreign currencies

The Company's financial statements are presented in INR, which is also the Company's functional and presentation currency.

Transactions and balances

Transactions in foreign currencies are initially recorded by theCompany's functional currency spot rates at the date the transaction first qualifies for recognition.

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the functional currency spot rates of exchange at the reporting date. Differences arising on settlement of such transaction and on translation of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at year end exchange rate are recognized in profit or loss.

2.8. Impairment of assets

Consideration is given at each Balance Sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment of the carrying amounts of the Company's assets. If any indication exists, an asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognized wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount.

2.9. Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at historical cost, net of accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. When significant parts of Property, plant and equipment are required to be replaced at intervals, theCompany recognizes such parts as individual assets with specific useful lives and depreciates them accordingly. Likewise, when a major inspection is performed, its cost is recognized in the carrying amount of the plant and equipment as a replacement if the recognition criteria are satisfied. All other repair and maintenance costs are recognized in profit or loss as incurred.

Borrowing cost relating to acquisition / construction of fixed assets which take substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use are also included to the extent they relate to the period till such assets are ready to be put to use.

Capital work-in-progress comprises cost of fixed assets that are not yet installed and ready for their intended use at the balance sheet date.

Other Intangible Assets

Intangible assets acquired separately are measured on initial recognition at historical cost. Intangibles assets have a finite life and are subsequently carried at cost less any accumulated amortization and accumulated impairment losses if any.

Intangible assets with finite lives are amortized over the useful life and assessed for impairment whenever there is an indication that the intangible asset may be impaired. The amortization period and the amortization method for an intangible asset with a finite useful life are reviewed at least at the end of each reporting period. Changes in the expected useful life or the expected pattern of consumption of future economic benefits embodied in the asset areconsidered to modify the amortization period or method, as appropriate, and are treated as changes in accounting Estimates. The amortization expense on intangible assets with finite lives is recognized in the statement of profit andloss unless such expenditure forms part of carrying value of another asset.

Gains or losses arising from derecognition of an intangible asset are measured as the difference between the netdisposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and are recognized in the statement of profit or loss when the asset is derecognized.

Derecognition

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognized upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Any gain or loss arising on DE recognition of the asset(calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset) is included in the Statement ofProfit and Loss when the asset is derecognized.

Depreciation

Depreciation on property, other than Plant & Machinery is calculated on the basis of Written down Value Method. In case of Plant & Machinery, depreciation is provided on Straight Line Method (SLM)

basis. The depreciation on Property, Plant and Equipment are calculated as per Schedule II of Companies Act 2013.

Depreciation on property, Plant and Equipment purchased/sold during a period is proportionately charged for the period of use.

The residual values, useful lives and methods of depreciation of property, plant and equipment are reviewed at each financial year end and adjusted prospectively, if appropriate.

2.10 Financial assets

Initial recognition and measurement:

All regular way purchases or sales of financial assets are recognized and derecognized on a trade date basis.

Subsequent measurement:

All recognized financial assets are subsequently measured in their entirety at either amortized cost or fair value, depending on the classification of the financial assets.

Classification of financial assets:

Financial assets that meet the following conditions are subsequently measured at amortized cost (except for debt instruments that are designated as at fair value through profit or loss on initial recognition):

- The asset is held within a business model whose objective is to hold assets in order to collect contractual cash flows; and
- The contractual terms of the instrument give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest.

All other financial asset is subsequently measured at fair value.

Financial assets at cost:

Investments in subsidiaries, associates and joint ventures are accounted for at cost.

Derecognition of financial assets:

The Company derecognizes a financial asset when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the asset expire, or when it transfers the financial asset and substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the asset to another party.

On derecognition of a financial asset in its entirely, the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the sum of the consideration received / receivable and the cumulative gain or loss that had been recognized in other comprehensive income and accumulated in equity is recognized in profit or loss if such gain or loss would have otherwise been recognized in profit or loss on disposal of that financial asset.

2.11. Financial liabilities and equity instruments

Classification as debt or equity

Debt and equity instruments issued by the Company are classified as either financial liabilities or as equity in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangements and the definitions of a financial liability and an equity instrument.

Equity instruments

An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of an entity after deducting all of its liabilities. Equity instruments issued by the Company are recognized at the proceeds received, net of direct issue costs.

Trade and other payables are recognized at the transaction cost, which is its fair value, and subsequently measured at amortized cost.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

The Company derecognizes financial liabilities when, and only when, the Company's obligations are discharged, cancelled or have expired. An exchange between with a lender of debt instruments with substantially different terms is accounted for as an extinguishment of the original financial liability and the recognition of a new financial liability. Similarly, a substantial modification of the terms of an existing financial liability is accounted for as an extinguishment of the original financial liability and the recognition of a new financial liability. The difference between the carrying amount of the financial liability derecognized and the consideration paid and payable is recognized in profit or loss.

2.12 Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost or net realizable value .Cost comprises of cost of Purchases, cost of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition. Cost is determined on First-in-First-out (FIFO) basis. Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

2.13. Cash and cash equivalent

Cash and cash equivalent in the balance sheet comprise cash at banks and on hand and short-term deposits with a maturity of three months or less, which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

2.14. Provisions

Provisions are recognized when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, and it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

2.15. Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company, the Company retains neither continuing managerial involvement to the degree usually associated with ownership nor effective control over the goods sold, and the revenue can be reliably measured, regardless of when the payment is being made. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, taking into account contractually defined terms of payment.

a) Sales including export sales and trading sales are recognized when goods are dispatched from the factory and are recorded at net of shortages, claims settled, rate differences, rebate allowed to customers.

b) Export Sales are booked at the rate on the date of transaction and the resultant gain or loss on realization on transaction is accounted as Exchange rate difference and is dealt with Statement of Profit and Loss.

2.16. Export Incentive

Export incentives under various schemes notified by government are accounted for in the year of exports based on eligibility and when there is no uncertainty in receiving the same.

2.17. Borrowing Cost

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of an asset that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use or sale are capitalized as part of the cost of the respective assets. All other borrowing costs are expensed in the period in which they occur. Borrowing costs consist of interest and other costs that the company incurs in connection with the borrowing of funds.

2.18. Employee Benefits

(a) Short Term Employee Benefits

Short term employee benefits are recognized as an expense in the Profit & Loss Account of the year in which the related service is rendered. However Bonus has been accounted on cash Basis.

(b) Post-Employment Benefits

Post employment and other long term employee benefits are recognized as an expense in the Profit & Loss Account in the year of payment. Refer note no 34.

2.19.Taxes

Tax expense comprises of current income tax and deferred tax.

Current income tax

Current income tax assets and liabilities are measured at the amount expected to be recovered from or paid to the taxation authorities. The tax rates and tax laws used to compute the amount are those that are enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is provided using the liability method on temporary differences between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts for financial reporting purposes at the reporting date.

Deferred tax liabilities are recognized for all taxable temporary differences.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the year when the asset is realized or the liability is settled, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

2.20. Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. Earning considered in ascertaining the company's earnings per share in the net profit for the period.

3.0 Useful lives of property, plant and equipment

Useful lives of property, Plant & Equipments are taken as per useful lives given in Part-C of Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

3.1 Investments

In case of investments, the Management assesses whether there is any indication of permanent impairment in the value of investments. (Refer note 36).

3.2 Taxes

Significant management judgment is required to determine the amount of deferred tax assets that can be recognized, based upon the likely timing and the level of future taxable profits together with future tax planning strategies including estimates of temporary differences reversing on account of available benefits from the Income Tax Act, 1961. Deferred tax assets recognized to the extent of the corresponding deferred tax liability.

4.0 Regrouped, Recast, Reclassified

Figures of the earlier year have been regrouped or reclassified to conform to Ind AS presentation requirements.


