




Steel Demand (MT) — Demand Growth (YoY%)

China exports remain elevated due to low domestic demand













Robust India steel demand in line with strong real GDP growth











- National Steel Policy, 2017 envisages India's steel production capacity of 300mt by 2030 by enhancing domestic per capita consumption to 160 kg
- Steel capacity and production continues to rise in line with Govt's vision of capacity/production of 300mt/258mt by 2030.

India Steel Scenario








- Crude Steel production grew 5% YoY during Q1FY25 to 36.6mt and 7% YoY in H1CY24 to 73.9mt
- Finished steel consumption grew 12% YoY during Q1FY25 to 35.2mt and 11% YoY during H1CY24 to 70.8 mt driven by strong domestic demand
- Total Steel Exports declined by 51% sequentially during Q1FY25 primarily driven by lower exports of HRC. Steel exports declined 2% at 4.5mt during H1CY24. Steel exports were down both YoY and QoQ during Q1FY25 as international prices remained subdued
- Total Steel Imports declined by 16% sequentially during Q1FY25. However, imports were up by 32% YoY during the same period. For H1CY24, imports were up 31% YoY as international prices remained lower than domestic prices.
- Higher imports from China and FTA countries kept flat product prices in check in the domestic markets
- Inventory levels inched slightly up vis-a-vis Q4FY24.

Key Steel and RM Prices Trend






Coking Coal: Premium HCC (CNF Australia origin)






Domestic Pellet prices (Barbil)



Iron Ore fines and Lumps (Odisha Index)




- Indian Steel prices have shown mixed trends during Q1FY25
- While TMT prices have rallied due to significantly strong construction seasons, Flat product prices have remained statics with downward bias as International prices remained subdued
- TMT has again moved to premium over HRC as construction season starts
- Iron ore fines and lumps prices have remained largely flat despite correction in flat steel prices
- PHCC prices remained soft trending in line with international steel prices








Crude Steel Capacity (MTPA)








Net Debt and EBITDA bridge






Consolidated Adjusted EBITDA Movement (QoQ) (INR Cr)





