Lightning hits ancient Arch

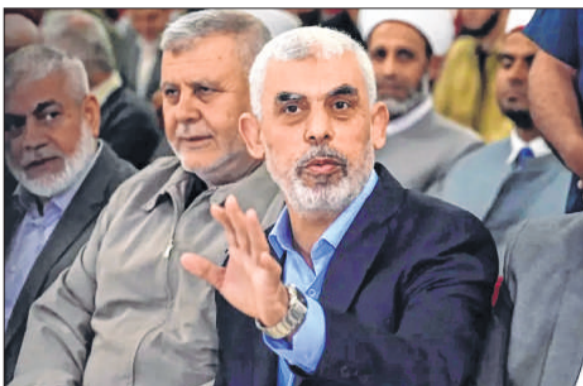

 Hamas leaders charged by US for Oct 7 attack

The United States has announced criminal charges against Hamas' top leaders over their roles in planning, supporting and perpetrating the 7 October attack in southern Israel.

The charges against Yahya Sinwar, the militant group's chief, and at least five others accuse them of orchestrating the attack, which killed 1,200 people, including more than 40 Americans.

The deceased defendants are former Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh, who was assassinated in July in Tehran; military wing chief Mohammed Deif, who Israel said it killed in a July airstrike; and Marwan Issa, a deputy military commander who Israel said it killed in a March strike.

Iran has blamed Israel for Haniyeh's death. Israeli officials have not claimed responsibility.

Greta held at Gaza war protest site

Environmental activist Greta Thunberg was arrested in Copenhagen at a protest against the war in Gaza, a spokesperson for the student group organising the demonstration has said.

Six people were detained on Wednesday at the University of Copenhagen after 20 people blocked the entrance to a building and three entered, a police spokesperson said.

Police declined to confirm the identities of any of those arrested but a spokesperson for the Students Against the Occupation said Thunberg, 21, was one of those held.

A picture of Thunberg published by the news outlet Ekstra Bladet showed her wearing what the newspaper said were handcuffs and a black-and-white keffiyeh shawl draped over her shoulders. Thunberg, meanwhile, shared images on Instagram of riot police entering a building where Students Against the Occupation was staging a protest.

Ukraine's foreign minister resigns

Ukraine's Foreign Minister Dmytro Kuleba tendered his resignation on Wednesday ahead of an expected major cabinet reshuffle as a fresh wave of Russian missiles overnight killed at least seven people, including a child, in Lviv.

Kuleba is the latest high-profile member of President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's cabinet to resign as Russia's invasion grinds on. His decision comes ahead of an expected visit by the President to the US this month.

As Ukraine's top diplomat, Kuleba has been a prominent fixture in Zelenskyy's administration and one of the most public-facing, especially dealing with overseas officials.

Davyd Arakhania, the majority leader of Ukraine's parliament, said Tuesday that there would be major changes expected in the cabinet this week. "As promised, a major government reset can be expected this week. More than 50% of the Cabinet of Ministers' staff will be changed," Arakhania said on Telegram, adding that new members would be appointed.

Among those who have resigned was the Minister for

Strategic Industries Oleksandr Kamyshyn, who was in charge of weapons production. He is expected to assume another defense role, Reuters reported.

The resignations also include the justice, environment and reintegration ministers. In his nightly address Tuesday, Zelenskyy said the coming fall will be "extremely important for Ukraine" and as such "our state institutions must be set up so that Ukraine achieves all the results we need."

"To do this, we need to strengthen some areas of the government... I am also counting on a slightly different weight for certain areas of our foreign and domestic policy," he said.

30 officials executed over N-Korea flood

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, who is known to have executed many people for reasons as flimsy as sleeping during his meetings has now executed dozens of officials for failure to respond adequately to the flood situation in Jagang province, in the northern areas bordering China.

Around 20 to 30 regional government officials in the flood-stricken area were shot last month, TV Chosun said, citing an unidentified South Korean government official.

The devastating floods may have killed up to a few thousand people in the most-hit, the cable TV reported. After the floods struck, Kim declared that North Korea would not take any international aid. Instead, he asked officials to relocate thousands of displaced residents to the capital city of Pyongyang, where they would receive better care and support. The rebuilding

efforts were expected to take around two to three months, during which time the government planned to provide for nearly 15,400 vulnerable people in facilities within Pyongyang.

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un said at an emergency party meeting in late July that he would strictly punish those who "severely neglected" their duties and were, therefore, responsible for the casualties.

Pictures of Kim overseeing rescue efforts in the wake of the disaster were distributed but no mention was made of any deaths. The downpours damaged about 4,100 homes, swept over roads and rail links, and wiped out about 3,000ha of farmland in the city of Sinuiju, a trade hub connected to China by bridge, and the nearby county of Uiju, according to North Korean state media.

Some bodies were discovered during the work of clearing soil after water levels receded, the South Korean media outlet reported.

Ex-aide to NY guvs accused of aiding China, detained

In an indication of China's reach within the US government apparatus, Linda Sun, a former aide to New York Governor Kathy Hochul and former Governor Andrew Cuomo, was taken into custody from her Long Island residence Tuesday morning and charged with acting as an agent of the Chinese government.

US Attorney Breon Peace said Tuesday that Sun, a former deputy chief of staff to Hochul and Cuomo aide, was charged "with violating and conspiring to violate the Foreign Agents Registrations Act, visa fraud, and alien smuggling", according to an unsealed copy of the indictment.

Her husband Chris Hu was also charged with money laundering and conspiracy to commit bank fraud as well as misusing means of identifica-



tion, prosecutors said. They said in a news release that Sun acted as "an undisclosed agent of the Chinese government while her husband, Hu, facilitated the transfer of millions of dollars in kickbacks for personal gain."

Sun reportedly violated internal rules and state government protocols to benefit the Chinese govt, according to court documents. Among Sun's activities, prosecutors say, she acted as an undisclosed agent of the People's

20 missing as boat capsizes

About 20 migrants are believed to be missing after their boat capsized in the Mediterranean this week, the UN refugee agency said Wednesday.

Seven Syrians were rescued and taken to the southern Italian island of Lampedusa, the Italian coast guard said.

Chiara Cardoletti, the UNHCR representative to Italy, said on X that the seven survivors



were "in critical conditions and many have lost their relatives." Survivors said they had left Libya on September 1 and the accident occurred after one day of sailing, Italian news agency ANSA reported.

NASA to study speed of melting ice in Antarctica

Alarmed at the growing reports from researchers on rise in ocean levels and climate change, a team of NASA rocket scientists will soon be deploying autonomous underwater robots to inaccessible places on Earth, deep beneath Antarctica's mysterious giant ice shelves.

The robots, called IceNodes, will help study how rapidly ice is melting and how quickly that could cause catastrophic sea level rise. "We've been pondering how to surmount technological and logistical challenges for years, and we think

we've found a way," Ian Fenty, a climate scientist at NASA's Jet Propulsion Lab (JPL) and IceNode's science lead, was quoted in the media.

NASA plans to release around 10 IceNode robots into the water from a borehole in the ice or a ship off the coast. They have no propulsion but will ride ocean currents, directed by a special software, to their Antarctic destination where they will activate their "landing gear" - three legs which spring out and attach to the ice.

Once in place, their sensors will monitor how fast the warmer, salty ocean water is melting the ice, as well as how quickly the cold melt-

water is sinking. Once they have finished monitoring, the robots will detach themselves from the ice, drift to the surface of the ocean and transmit data by satellite. This data can then be fed into computer models to improve the accuracy of sea level rise projections.

"These robots are a platform to bring science instruments to the hardest-to-reach locations on Earth," Paul Glick, JPL robotics mechanical engineer and IceNode principal investigator, was quoted as saying.

The data would be crucial for many nations, including India. A few inches of rise in sea levels would swallow the islands of Andamans and Nicobar and Lakshadweep.
