DIRECTORS' REPORT

Dear Members,

Your Directors present the 26th ANNUAL REPORT together with the Audited Financial Statements for the Financial Year 2017-18 ended 31st March, 2018.

1. FINANCIAL RESULTS :

There are no material changes and commitment affecting the financial position of the Company which have occurred between 1st April, 2018 and date of this report except the weaving machinery has been disposed off after April, 2018 till the date of this report.

2. OPERATIONS:

During the year under review the sales comprised from the Job work & own production of furnishing fabrics and ceramics totaling to `128.57 lakh as compared to Job work & own production of furnishing fabrics and ceramics of `135.52 lakh during 2016-17. The Company has earned other income of `21.52 lakh during the year under review as compared to `10.25 lakh during 2016-17. However business of ceramics have not yielded desired results.

During the year under review, the Company incurred Loss before Depreciation of `12.57 lakh compared to Loss of `120.61 lakh during 2016-17, which included major write off of incomplete and in process Ceramics Production items expecting no further realization and write off of all stock of weaving raw material on hand. During current year the incomplete Ceramics Stock were reworked which yeilded major reduction in loss. Further there was write off of provisions which added to ohter income. After providing for depreciation of `10.68 lakh, the Loss after depreciation stood at `23.25 lakh.

The other comprehensive income stood at $\$ 0.82 lakh during the year as compared to $\$ 0.55 lakh for the year 2016-17.

3. DIVIDEND:

In view of the large accumulated losses, your Directors regret their inability to recommend any dividend on the Equity Shares of the Company.

4. SALE OF MACHINERIES:

As already communicated in past 0.225 MW Wind Turbine Generators has completed 25 years PPA and the operation cost being unviable, was disposed off during the year.

The furnishing machinery is incurring operational losses and the Company has identified buyer to dispose off these machines. The terms were finalised after April, 2018 and the same has been disposed off during 2018-19.

5. FUTURE OUT LOOK:

The Company has installed second hand transfer printing paper machinery during the year and the operation has been started.

The ceramics division was restarted by an alliance with experienced agency for marketing these products.

6. FINANCE:

Fund arrangements including working capital have been prudently managed and during the current financial year company did not enjoy any financial assistance from Financial Institutions and Banks.

The Company has not raised any term loan during the year as well as not given any guarantee for loans taken by others from bank or financial institutions.

The Company's Income-tax Assessment has been completed up to the Assessment Year 2015-16 and Sales tax Assessment is completed up to the Financial Year 2001-02.

7. DIRECTORS:

- 7.1 One of your Directors viz. Mr. Mansukh K. Virani retires by rotation in terms of the Articles of Association of the Company. However, being eligible offers himself for reappointment.
- 7.2 The Board of Directors duly met 5 times during the financial year under review.
- 7.3 The Company has received necessary declaration from each Independent Director of the Company under Section 149(7) of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act) that they meet with the criteria of their independence laid down in Section 149(6) of the Act.
- 7.4 FORMAL ANNUAL EVALUATION:

The Nomination and Remuneration Committee adopted a formal mechanism for evaluating the performance of the Board of Directors as well as that of its Committees and individual Directors, including Chairman of the Board, Key Managerial Personnel/ Senior Management etc. The exercise was carried out through an evaluation process covering aspects such as composition of the Board, experience, competencies, governance issues etc.

7.5 DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT:

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

CORPORATE INFORMATION:

Kush Industries Limited (formerly known as SNS Textiles Limited) was incorporated on 04.03.1992 having CIN L17119GJ1992PLC017218 is the listed entity incorporated in India. The registered office of the Company is located at 330-A, GIDC, Opp. Atul Products, Ankleshwar, Bharuch-393002. The Company is engaged in the business of weaving and ceramics.

A. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

a) Basis of Preparation and measurement:

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (hereinafter referred to as the 'Ind AS') as notified by Ministry of Corporate Affairs pursuant to section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 3 of the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Amendment Rules, 2016.

Upto the year ended March 31, 2018, the Company has prepared its financial statements in accordance with the requirement of Indian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), which includes Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 and considered as "Previous GAAP". The financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2018 and the opening Balance Sheet as at April 01, 2017 have been restated in accordance with Ind AS for comparative information. The transition was carried out in accordance with Ind AS 101 First-time Adoption of Indian Accounting Standards. Company has presented a reconciliation of the effect of the transition from Previous GAAP to Ind AS on the Company's Balance Sheet, Statement of Profit and Loss and Statement of Cash Flows.

These financial statements are the first statements of the company, which have been prepared in accordance with Ind AS.

These financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost convention on the accrual basis, except for certain financial assets and liabilities measured at fair value.

Based on the nature of products and the time between acquisition of assets for processing and their realisation in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current or non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

These financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees, which is also its functional currency and all values are rounded to the nearest rupee, except when otherwise indicated.

b) Property, Plant and Equipment:

Property, plant and equipment (PPE) are stated at cost, net of recoverable taxes, trade discount and rebates less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. Such cost includes purchase price, borrowing cost and any cost directly attributable to bringing the assets to its working condition for its intended use.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the entity and the cost can be measured reliably.

Expenses incurred relating to PPE during its development stage prior to its intended use are disclosed under Capital Work-in-Progress.

Depreciation on PPE is provided using written down value method. Depreciation is provided based on useful life of the assets as prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. Useful life of PPE is as prescribed under Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.

Freehold land is not depreciated.

Depreciation is not charged on capital work-in-progress until construction and installation is complete and the PPE is ready for its intended use.

(Formerly known as SNS Textiles Limited)

Gains or losses arising from derecognition of a PPE are measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss when the asset is derecognised.

The residual values and useful lives of PPE are reviewed at each financial year end and adjusted prospectively, if appropriate.

Upon first-time adoption of Ind AS, the Company has elected to measure all its PPE at the Previous GAAP carrying amount as its deemed cost on the date of transition to Ind AS i.e., 1st April, 2016.

c) Investment Property:

Investment property includes property (land or building or both), to earn rentals or for capital appreciation or both, but not for use in the production or supply of goods or services or for administrative purposes or sale in the ordinary course of business.

Investment property is measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. Such cost includes purchase price, transaction costs and any directly attributable expenditure. Investment property is recognised only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the entity and the cost can be measured reliably.

Depreciation on investment property is provided using written down value method. Depreciation is provided based on useful life of the assets as prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

Gains or losses arising from derecognition of investment property are measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss when the asset is derecognised.

The residual values and useful lives of investment property are reviewed at each financial year end and adjusted prospectively, if appropriate.

Upon first-time adoption of Ind AS, the Company has elected to measure all its investment property at the Previous GAAP carrying amount as its deemed cost on the date of transition to Ind AS i.e., 1st April, 2016.

d) Leases:

Leases are classified as finance leases whenever the terms of the lease, transfers substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership to the lessee. All other leases are classified as operating leases.

Operating lease payments are recognised as an expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

e) Assets held for Sale:

Non-current assets or disposal groups comprising of assets and liabilities, which are retired from active use, are classified as 'held for sale' when all of the following criteria are met:

- decision has been made to sell
- the assets are available for immediate sale in its present condition
- the assets are being actively marketed and
- sale has been agreed or is expected to be concluded within 12 months of the Balance Sheet date.

Subsequently, such non-current assets and disposal groups classified as held for sale are measured at the lower of its carrying value and fair valueless costs to sell. Non-current assets held for sale are not depreciated or amortised.

f) Borrowing Costs:

Borrowing cost includes interest, ancillary costs incurred in connection with the arrangement of borrowings and exchange differences arising from foreign currency borrowings to the extent they are regarded as an adjustment to the interest cost. Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalised as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use.

All other borrowing costs are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss for the period for which they are incurred.

g) Revenue Recognition:

a. Sale of goods

Revenue from sale of goods is recognized when significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to the customer, recovery of the consideration is probable, the associated cost can be estimated reliably, there is no continuing effective control or managerial involvement with the goods and the amount can be measured reliably. Revenue is measured at fair value of the consideration received or receivable, after deduction of any trade discounts, volume rebates and any taxes or duties collected on behalf of the government which are levied on sales such as sales tax, value added tax, etc.

b. Job Work Income

Job work income is recognized when services are rendered and related costs are incurred and the amount of revenue can be measured reliably.

c. Interest income

Interest income is recognized using the effective interest rate (EIR) method.

d. Others

All other items of income and expenditure except dividend income are accounted on accrual basis.

h) Taxes:

Income tax expense for the year comprises of current tax and deferred tax. It is recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss except to the extent it relates to an item which is recognized directly in equity or in other comprehensive income. In which case, the tax is also recognised in equity or other comprehensive income.

Current tax is the expected tax payable/receivable on the taxable income/loss for the year using applicable tax rates at the Balance Sheet date, and any adjustment to taxes in respect of previous years. Interest income/expenses and penalties, if any, related to income tax are included incurrent tax expense.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of temporary differences between the carrying amount of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the corresponding amounts used for taxation purposes. Deferred tax is also recognized in respect of carried forward tax losses and tax credits.

i) Fair Value Measurement:

The Company measures financial instruments at fair value at each balance sheet date.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value measurement is based on the presumption that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability takes place either:

- In the principal market for the asset or liability, or
- In the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market for the asset or liability accessible by the Company.

A fair value measurement of a non-financial asset takes into account a market participant's ability to generate economic benefits by using the asset in its highest and best use or by selling it to another market participant that would use the asset in its highest and best use.

(Formerly known as SNS Textiles Limited)

The Company uses valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, maximising the use of relevant observable inputs and minimising the use of unobservable inputs.

All assets and liabilities for which fair value is measured or disclosed in the financial statements are categorised within the fair value hierarchy, described as follows, based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement as a whole:

- Level 1 Quoted (unadjusted) market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2 Valuation techniques for which the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement is directly or indirectly observable.
- Level 3 Valuation techniques for which the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement is unobservable.

For assets and liabilities that are recognised in the financial statements on a recurring basis, the Company determines whether transfers have occurred between levels in the hierarchy by re-assessing categorisation (based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement as a whole) at the end of each reporting period.

For the purpose of fair value disclosures, the Company has determined classes of assets and liabilities on the basis of the nature, characteristics and risks of the asset or liability and the level of the fair value hierarchy as explained above.

j) Inventories:

Inventories were valued at cost and each year reasonable price is reduced for providing for decline in Net Realizable Values. Items of inventories are measured at lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventories comprises of cost of purchase, cost of conversion and other costs including manufacturing overheads net of recoverable taxes incurred in bringing them to their respective present location and condition.

k) Earnings per share:

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the net profit for the period attributable to the equity shareholders of the Company by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. The weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period and for all periods presented is adjusted for events, such as bonus shares, other than the conversion of potential equity shares that have changed the number of equity shares outstanding, without a corresponding change in resources.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period is adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

I) Provisions and Contingent Liabilities:

Provisions are recognised when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the Balance Sheet date.

If the effect of the time value of money is material, provisions are discounted to reflect its present value using a current pre-tax rate that reflects the current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the obligation. When discounting is used, the increase in the provision due to the passage of time is recognised as a finance cost.

Contingent liabilities are disclosed when there is a possible obligation arising from past events, the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the Company or a present obligation that arises from past events where it is either not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount cannot be made.

m) Financial Instruments

I. Financial Assets:

a. Initial recognition and measurement

All financial assets and liabilities are initially recognized at fair value. Transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or issue of financial assets and financial liabilities, which are not at fair value through profit or loss, are adjusted to the fair value on initial recognition. Purchase and sale of financial assets are recognised using trade date accounting.

b. Subsequent measurement

i. Financial assets carried at amortised cost

A financial asset is measured at amortised cost if it is held within a business model whose objective is to hold the asset in order to collect contractual cash flows and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

ii. Financial assets at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVTOCI)

A financial asset is measured at FVTOCI if it is held within a business model whose objective is achieved by both collecting contractual cash flows and selling financial assets and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

At present the Company does not have investment in any debt securities classified as FVOCI.

On initial recognition of an equity investment that is not held for trading, the Company has irrevocably elected to present subsequent changes in the investment's fair value in OCI (designated as FVOCI-equity investment). This election is made on an investment by investment basis.

iii. Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss (FVTPL)

A financial asset which is not classified in any of the above categories are measured at FVTPL.

c. Other Equity Investments

All other equity investments are measured at fair value, with value changes recognised in Other Comprehensive Income.

d. Impairment of financial assets

In accordance with Ind AS 109, the Company uses 'Expected Credit Loss' (ECL) model, for evaluating impairment of financial assets other than those measured at fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL).

Expected credit losses are measured through a loss allowance at an amount equal to:

- The 12-months expected credit losses (expected credit losses that result from those default events on the financial instrument that are possible within 12 months after the reporting date); or
- Full lifetime expected credit losses (expected credit losses that result from all possible default events over the life of the financial instrument)

For trade receivables Company applies 'simplified approach' which requires expected lifetime losses to be recognised from initial recognition of the receivables. The Company uses historical default rates to determine impairment loss on the portfolio of trade receivables. At every reporting date these historical default rates are reviewed and changes in the forward looking estimates are analysed.

For other assets, the Company uses 12 month ECL to provide for impairment loss where there is no significant increase in credit risk. If there is significant increase in credit risk full lifetime ECL is used.

II. Financial Liabilities:

a. Initial recognition and measurement

All financial liabilities are recognized at fair value and in case of loans, net of directly attributable cost. Fees of recurring nature are directly recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss as finance cost.

b. Subsequent measurement

Financial liabilities are carried at amortized cost using the effective interest method. For trade and other payables maturing within one year from the balance sheet date, the carrying amounts approximate fair value due to the short maturity of these instruments

III. Derecognition of financial instruments

The Company derecognizes a financial asset when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the financial asset expire or it transfers the financial asset and the transfer qualifies for derecognition under Ind AS 109.

A financial liability (or a part of a financial liability) is derecognized from the Company's Balance Sheet when contractual obligation is discharged or cancelled or expires.

n) Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

The Company assesses at each reporting date as to whether there is any indication that any non-financial asset or group of assets, called cash generating units (CGU) may be impaired.

If any indication of impairment exists, an estimate of the recoverable amount of the individual asset/CGU is made. Asset/CGU whose carrying value exceeds their recoverable amount are written down to the recoverable amount by recognising the impairment loss as an expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss. The impairment loss is allocated first to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill (if any) allocated to the cash generating unit and then to the other assets of the unit, pro rata based on the carrying amount of each asset in the unit.

The recoverable amount is higher of an asset's fair value less cost of disposal and value in use. Value in use is based on the estimated future cash flows, discounted to their present value using pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and risk specific to the assets.

The impairment loss recognised in prior accounting period is reversed if there has been a change in the estimate of recoverable amount i.e. an impairment loss recognised for an asset in prior accounting periods may no longer exist or may have decreased.

o) Employee Benefits:

A defined contribution plan is a post-employment benefit plan under which an entity pays fixed contributions into a separate entity and will have no legal or constructive obligation to pay further amounts.

The Company makes specified monthly contributions towards government administered employees' provident fund and state insurance schemes. Obligations for contributions to defined contribution plans are recognised as an employee benefit expense in profit or loss in the periods during which the related services are rendered by employees.

The company also makes contribution for gratuity and superannuation benefits, which are covered by policies taken with the LIC. The premium paid under these schemes is charged to profit and loss on actual payment basis when the related services are rendered by employees.

Short-term and long-term compensated absences (leave encashment) are provided for on the basis of an actuarial valuation, using projected unit credit method, as at each balance sheet date. Actuarial losses are taken to the statement of profit and loss and are not deferred.

B. USE OF ESTIMATES AND CRITICAL JUDGEMENTS:

The preparation of financial statements requires the management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions in the application of accounting policies that may affect the reported balances of assets and liabilities and disclosures relating to contingent assets and liabilities as at the date of financial statements and reported amounts of income and expenses during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized prospectively.

Information about critical judgments in applying accounting policies, as well as estimates and assumptions that have the most significant effect on the amounts recognized in the standalone financial statements is included in the following notes:

- 1. Note-2 Identification of the land and/or building is an investment property
- 2. Note-2 Depreciation/Amortisation and useful lives of property plant and equipments
- 3. Note-16 & 29 recognition and measurement of provisions and contingencies: key assumptions about the likelihood and magnitude of an outflow of resources (contingent liabilities)

4. Impairment of Non-Financial assets

The Company assesses at each reporting date whether there is an indication that an asset may be impaired. If any indication exists, the Company estimates the asset's recoverable amount. An asset's recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's or Cash Generating Units (CGU's) fair value less costs of disposal and its value in use. Where the carrying amount of an asset or CGU exceeds its recoverable amount, the asset is considered impaired and is written down to its recoverable amount.

In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset. In determining fair value less costs of disposal, recent market transactions are taken into account, if no such transactions can be identified, an appropriate valuation model is used.

C. Standards issued but not yet effective

The MCA has carried out amendments to the following accounting standards. These amendments shall be applicable to the Company from April 01, 2018:

- (a) Ind AS 21 The Effects of Changes in Foreign Exchange Rates
- (b) Ind AS 40 Investment Property
- (c) Ind AS 12 Income Taxes
- (d) Ind AS 28 Investments in Associates and Joint Ventures and
- (e) Ind AS 112 Disclosure of Interests in Other Entities

Application of above standards are not expected to have any significant impact on the Company's Financial Statements

D. FIRST TIME ADOPTION OF IND AS

The Company has adopted Ind AS with effect from 1st April 2017 with comparatives being restated. Accordingly, the impact of transition has been provided in the Opening Reserves as at 1st April 2016. The figures for the previous period have been restated, regrouped and reclassified wherever required to comply with the requirement of Ind AS and Schedule III.

a) Optional Exemptions:

i. Business combinations

Ind AS 101 permits an entity to apply the requirements of Ind AS 103 - Business combinations (Ind AS 103) prospectively from the transition date or opt for retrospective application of Ind AS 103. Retrospective application could be either done since inception or from a date determined by the management. The exemption for past business combinations also applies to past acquisitions of investments in associates, interests in joint ventures and interests in joint operations in which the activity of the joint operation constitutes a business, as defined in Ind AS 103.

Accordingly, the Company has elected not to restate past business combinations with an acquisition date prior to the transition date.

ii. Deemed cost for property, plant and equipment, intangible assets and investment properties

The Company has elected to measure all its property, plant and equipment, intangible assets and investment properties at the Previous GAAP carrying amount as its deemed cost on the date of transition to Ind AS.

iii. Investment in certain Equity Shares

On the date of transition to Ind AS, a first time adopter can designate investments in certain equity shares of certain entities i.e. other than subsidiaries, associates and joint arrangements, as instruments fair valued through the other comprehensive income (FVOCI) or Fair value through Profit and loss (FVTPL).

Accordingly, the Company has opted to designate such equity investments as FVOCI.

b) Mandatory Exceptions:

i. Estimates

On assessment of the estimates made under the Previous GAAP financial statements, the Company has concluded that there is no necessity to revise the estimates under Ind AS, as there is no objective evidence of an error in those estimates. However, estimates that were required under Ind AS but not required under Previous GAAP are made by the Company for the relevant reporting dates reflecting conditions existing as at that date.

ii. Classification and measurement of financial assets

Ind AS 101 requires an entity to assess classification of financial assets on the basis of facts and circumstances existing as on the date of transition. Further, the standard permits measurement of financial assets accounted at amortised cost based on facts and circumstances existing at the date of transition if retrospective application is impracticable.

Accordingly, the Company has determined the classification of financial assets based on facts and circumstances that exist on the date of transition. Measurement of the financial assets accounted at amortised cost has been done retrospectively except where the same is impracticable or effect thereof is immaterial.

iii. Derecognition of financial assets and financial liabilities

The Company has applied the derecognition requirements of Ind AS 109 prospectively for transactions occurring on or after the date of transition to Ind AS.

Foreign Currency Risk

Foreign currency risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of an exposure will fluctuate because of changes in foreign exchange rates.

Interest Rate Risk

Interest rate risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market interest rates.

Borrowings of the company are interest free and therefore, there is no interest rate risk.

Credit Risk

Credit risk is the risk that a counterparty will not meet its obligations under a financial instrument or customer contract, leading to a financial loss. The Company is exposed to credit risk primarily trade receivables and other financial assets including deposits with banks.

Other financial assets
