# Tomar to Present Road Map for Agriculture Today

Presentation before Niti Aayog governing council in presence of PM Modi

New Delhi: Agriculture minister Narendra Singh Tomar will present a road map reimagining agriculture for future challenges before the governing council of Niti Aayog in presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday. "Tomar will discuss about promoting water conservation and crop diversification while aligning cropping system to agroclimatic conditions at district level for optimum use of resources," said a senior agri-

culture ministry official. He said that the agenda also includes deliberations on promoting food processing and agro-based industry and exports. "The government has launched many agro-based funds including the newly set up agricultural infrastructure fund. The minister will discuss plans on how to encourage states for utilising these funds. For growth, a focused intervention is needed to develop robust agro infrastructure including an electronic marketplace and value chain," the official said. The government has divided the

farm ecosystem into seven agroclimatic zones for assessing the cropping pattern to address the issue of climate change. It will help to move towards precision agriculture with optimum water and nutrient use through drip irrigation, fertigation, conservation agriculture and mechanisation. "Climate changes are happening across the globe. We need to re-align our crop planning as per the changes in climate and monsoon pattern. This will increase our productivity and help select right crop to plant," the official said.

# Fuel Prices Hit a New Peak

New Delhi: Petrol price crossed ₹90 per litre in Delhi on Friday after state oil companies raised rates for the 11th straight day. Petrol sold for ₹90.19 per litre in Delhi and ₹96.62 in Mumbai. Diesel sold for ₹90.6 per litre in Delhi and ₹97.67 in Mumbai. Prices rose 31-38 paise a litre on Friday. Crude oil prices began to decline in the international market on Friday, falling under \$65 a barrel from above \$85 a day before, as life began to return to normal in Texas, the largest energy-producing state in the US, after a rare chill that disrupted oil and gas production and refining capacity this week. A quick comeback in refinery output can calm down international

fuel prices, to which domestic rates of petrol and diesel are linked. High international prices along with steep domestic taxes have pushed domestic fuel prices to record levels. Frustrated consumers and the political opposition have been clamouring for tax cuts but the Centre hasn't yielded. Sustained high fuel prices can induce broader inflation in the economy and gas production and refining power, essential for the recovery of the pandemic-hit economy. —Our Bureau

# IFSCA Announces Rules for Aircraft Leasing

Rules mandate min capital of \$200,000 to be maintained at all times by the entity

New Delhi: Taking forward the budget announcement to make India an aircraft leasing hub, the International Financial Services Centre Authority (IFSCA) on Friday announced a framework for companies that plan to get into the business in the country.

The government in the budget had announced several tax incentives for aircraft leasing companies. Officials said these tax benefits would be for a period of ten years and would be on par with the incentives that these companies have in Ireland. "The incentives will make it more competitive than any other part of the world, if one adds the benefits accrued on account of labour costs," said an official on the condition of anonymity.

As per the framework, an entity can set up operations in the International Financial Services Centre (IFSC) by way of a company, a limited liability partnership or a trust, or in any other form as may be specified by the authority. A minimum capital of \$200,000 or its equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency is to be maintained at all times by the entity, according to the rules. "The framework on aircraft operating lease would pave the way for offshore leasing entities to serve India's hinterland demand from GIFT IFSC," Tapan Ray, managing director of GIFT City in Gujarat, said in a statement.

The minister said robust electricity demand would help the country in adding green energy to its portfolio without the need to retire coal-based plants.

ammonia made in India. We have put it to the ministry of petroleum that you import natural gas and extract hydrogen. Suppose we put a mandate to replace 10% of the hydrogen which is used for refining with green hydrogen made in India," he said at the launch of the 'Go-Electric' campaign to promote electric mobility and cooking.

He said if a minimum 10% green hydrogen oil, coal, steel and steel refinery units, the fuel will become competitive in three years. "You have to have an obligation to buy made-in-India green hydrogen which may be slightly more expensive. Whatever it is, we need to begin. It depends on the bid. In fact, it may turn out to be not more expensive," he said.

# Indian Social Media Cos Welcome Restrictions

New Delhi: Indian social media companies Koo and Mitrn have welcomed measures to monitor and control fake information that spreads through such intermediaries.

The companies were responding to reports of possible rule changes that would mandate social media including Twitter and Facebook to take down "unlawful" posts within 36 hours against the stipulated 72 hours. Social media entities with over 5 million users would also need to set up an office in India and appoint a nodal officer to liaise with law enforcement agencies. Twitter declined to comment on the matter. An email sent to Facebook went unanswered till

the time of going to press. Policies around social media are welcome because they may remove some of the nebulous things around what's acceptable and what's not legally known and enforced, said Mayank Bidwadkar, co-founder of Koo. Twitter's annual rival. "This reduces the vagueness around clear actions that need to be taken by platforms," he said.
