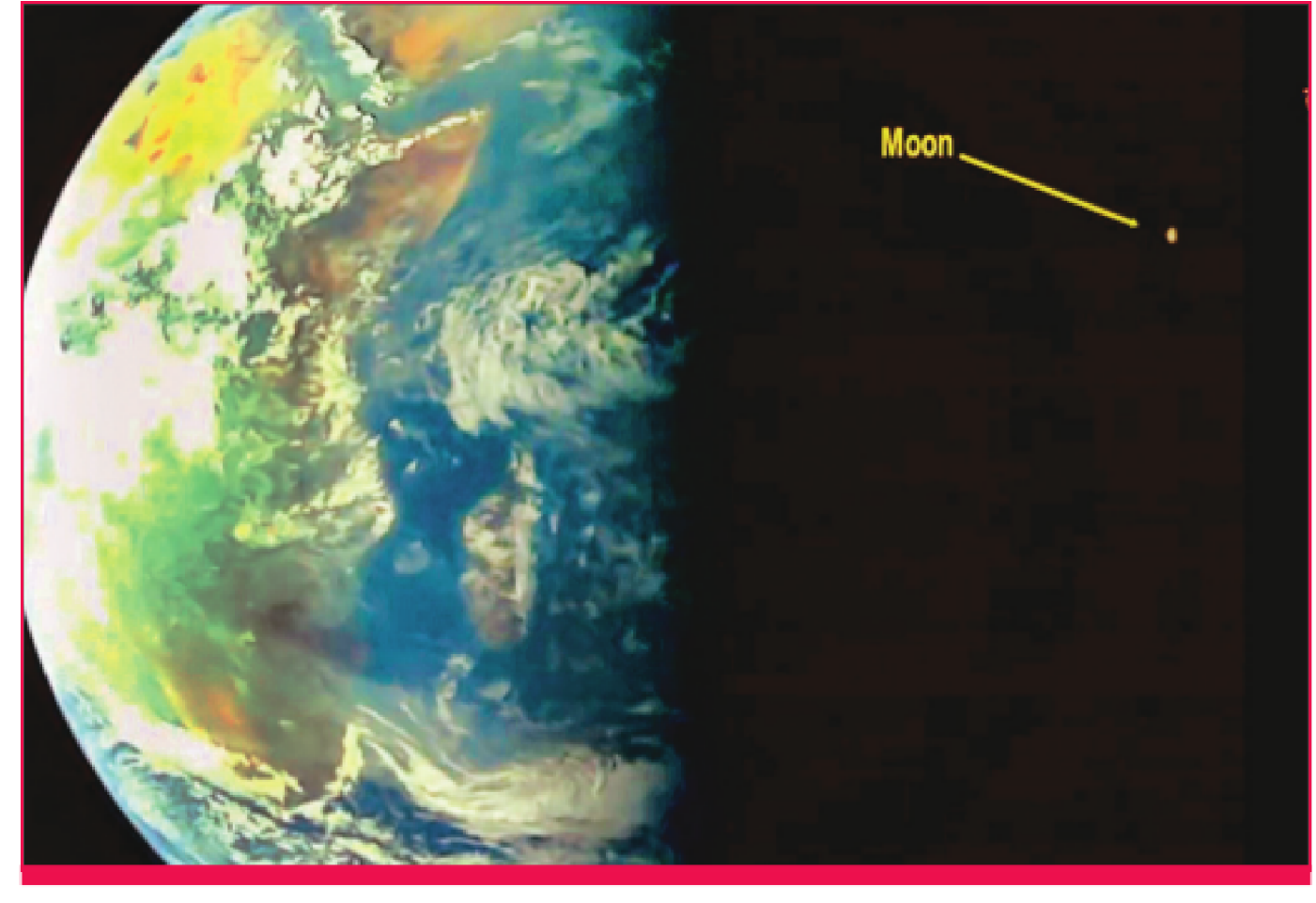

Widening the net: How to block Afridi

TWO MEN WERE the focus of attention of India's batsmen at the indoor nets in Colombo on Thursday: the Sri Lankan Nuwan Seneviratne, the team's throwdown specialist, and Hari Prasad Mohan, the data analyst. Ahead of the Pakistan game, India had turned to address the most obvious weakness chocking them: the left-armed Shaheen Afridi's atomic curlers.

If the lengths were fuller for Gill and Shreyas, with Rahul it varied a bit. Earmarked to bat in the middle-order at No 5, it is a phase where the left-arm pacers tend to operate around the stumps and cramp them for room.

Afridi once again caused all sorts of problems for India's top-order in Pallekele. Come World Cup, apart from Afridi, India will face Trent Boult (NZ), Mitchell Starc (Australia), Reece Topley, David Willey (England), Marco Jansen (SA), Mustafizur Rahman (Bangladesh) and all of them capable of bringing the ball back into the right-hander.

Above all, it's Afridi who strikes terror the most and uniquely without any elaborate set-up strategy to push India into a maze. It's almost as if he says, 'this is my plan: slip in a couple that go away perhaps but attack with the inswingers - stop me if you can'. And the effect has been startling. Batsmen's feet have frozen in recent times after trampling too far across in the past and the ball has invariably pinged the pad or the stumps.

Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli had opted out of the optional nets at Gamiini Disnayaka Indoor facility at the Nondescript Cricket Club, but the others sweated out physically and mentally on a rainy day. Once their focus on Seneviratne ended after their stint, Shubman Gill, Shreyas Iyer, KL Rahul, in for his first training session with the team since recovering from injury, and the rest would hunch over

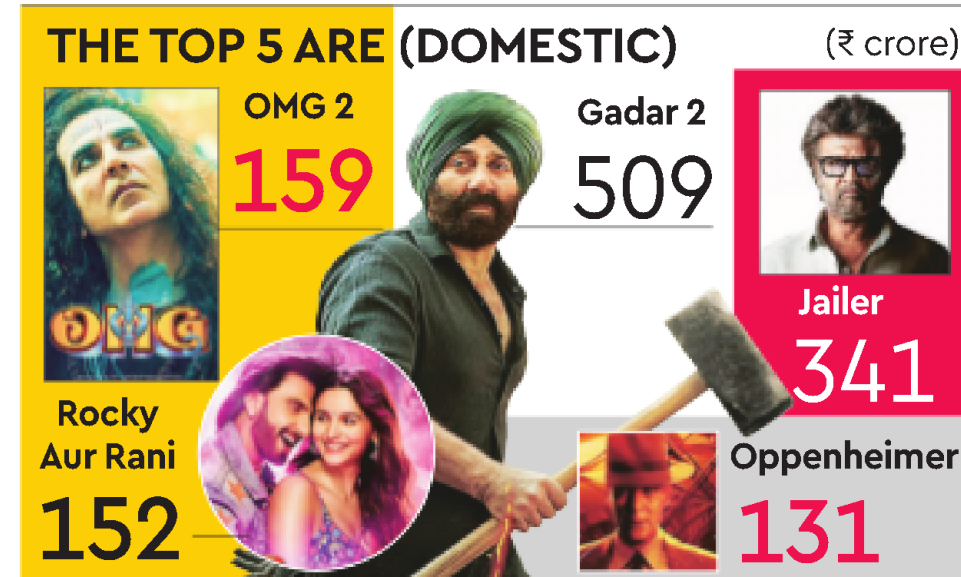

SRK shoots past SRK

ONE OF THE great principles in moviemaking is that the hero is only as good as the person he fights. On Thursday, it was a duel between SRK and SRK. Between 'Jawan' and 'Pathaan', if you may.

Shah Rukh Khan's 'Pathaan', which was released in January this year, earned ₹57 crore (domestic) on its first day for all languages. According to industry tracker Sacnilk, 'Jawan' is set to gross a whopping ₹75 crore (Hindi: ₹65 crore, Tamil: ₹5 crore, Telugu: ₹5 crore) on its opening day, that is, Thursday, across all language versions in India.

Chennai and Lucknow were the top markets with 70% plus occupancy for its Hindi (IMAX) shows. Kolkata led the attendance chart for Hindi (IMAX), with 88.33% overall occupancy and 94% for the morning show.

To 'Pathaan's ₹105 crore worldwide on Day 1, 'Jawan' is expected to post worldwide collections to the tune of ₹120 crore, with overseas collections of about ₹45 crore.

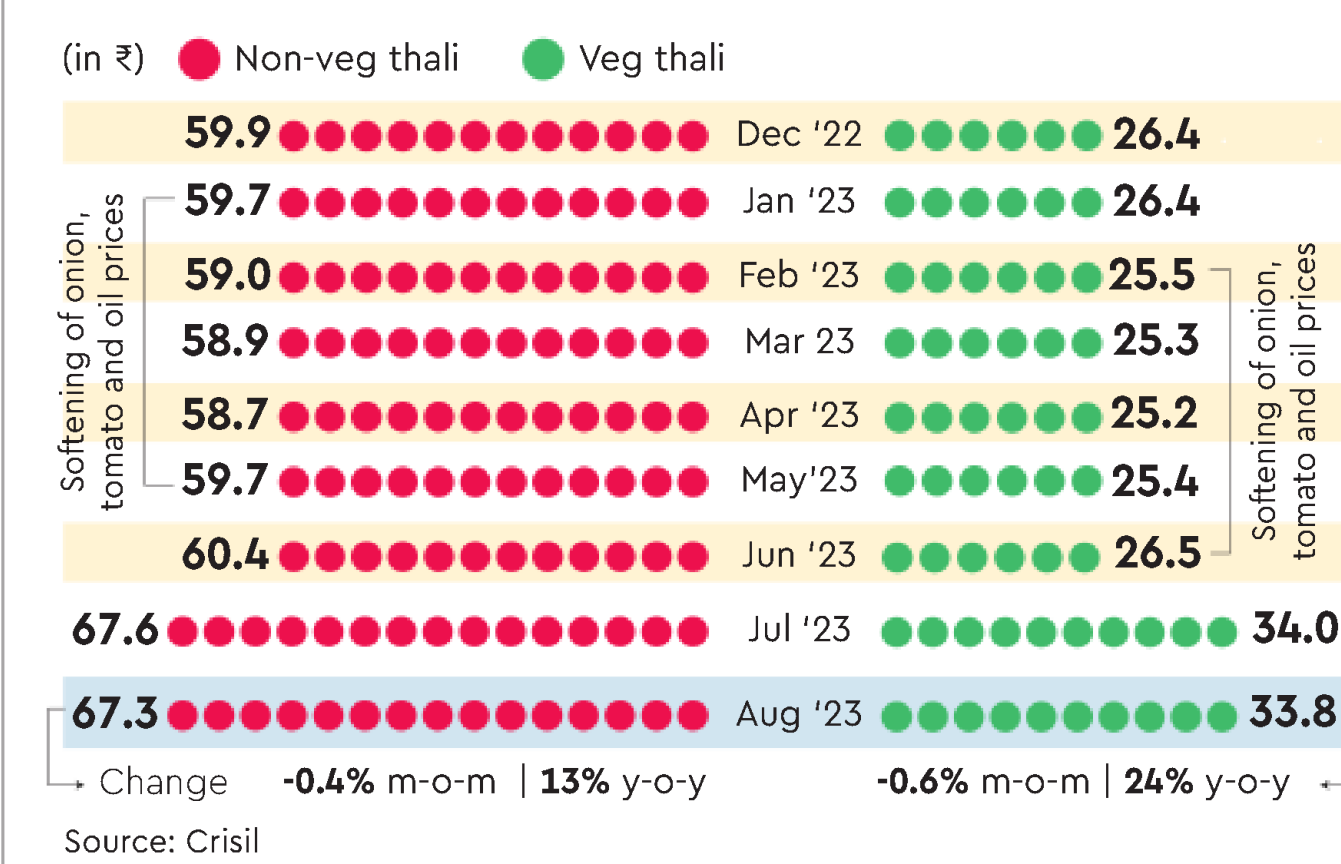

Thali cost still elevated, veg variant up 24% on year in Aug



COST OF A HOUSEHOLD thali declined marginally in August from the historic high in July, but it was still sharply elevated. The cost of vegetarian thali declined to ₹33.8 last month from ₹34 in July, while it rose by 24% on year, according to Crisil, which is tracking thali prices to gauge the impact of food prices on dietary patterns from January 2020. High tomato prices is the main reason for thali being costlier.

Continued stickiness of cereal prices and costlier onion (up 8% on year), chilli (20%) and cumin (158%) have also pushed up thali prices. While the cost of a non-vegetarian thali marginally declined to ₹67.3 in August from ₹67.6 in July, the increase was 13% on year. For the non-veg thali, spike in cost was slower because broiler chicken prices, which accounts for 50% of the cost, rose only moderately (1-3%) on year last month.
