Report on the Audit of the Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial results of GTN Industries Limited ("the Company"), for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2023, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, these

- (i) are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulations 33 of the Listing Regulations in this
- (ii) give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit/loss and other comprehensive income and other financial information for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2023.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit of in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under Section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 (the 'Act') (SAs). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records,

relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial results, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Other Matter

The financial information for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2022 included in the Statement, were audited by predecessor auditor whose report dated May 25, 2022 expressed an unmodified opinion on those audited financial information.

The Financial Results include the results for the quarter ended March 31, 2023 being the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures up to third quarter of the current financial year which were subjected to limited review by us. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.
