# UPSET FARMER SETS HIMSELF ON FIRE OUTSIDE POLICE STATION

**SHEETAL BAJAK, A RESIDENT OF CHOWKA VILLAGE, WAS MENTALLY DISTRESSED AFTER HE LOST HIS CROP DUE TO SUB-STANDARD PESTICIDE. HIS WIFE SAID:**

A farmer in Sagar district was left with 25 per cent loss after he "tried to burn himself on fire on the premises of a police station" allegedly after the cops refused to take his complaint against a shopkeeper who sold sub-standard pesticide to him. A probe has been ordered on the supply of sub-standard pesticide, and also on whether the police delayed lodging a complaint, a senior cop said.

Sheetal Rajak, a resident of Chowka village, was mentally disturbed after he lost his crop due to sub-standard pesticide, his wife said. "Our crops were ruined due to



sub-standard pesticide. He was mentally stressed and because of that he approached the local police station to lodge a complaint against the shopkeeper who sold the pesticide but the police refused to lodge the complaint," his wife Nisha Rajak said. Congress leader

Kamal Nath left out at the Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan of not doing enough for farmers in the state.


The BJP government had promised to double the income of the farmers but had doubled the cost. Shivraj Singh has nothing to do with

the problems of the farmers," Nath tweeted. According to reports, Sagar Rajak spent the merchandise across 20 acres but the soybean crop still got infected with pests. On Thursday morning he reached Banda police station in Sagar district and lodged a complaint. The farmer received 25 per cent crop losses and is being treated at Sagar medical college.

"Agriculture department is probing the complaint of substandard pesticides and an inquiry will be held to look into who no action was taken by the police who were complained," a senior cop said.

Garlic farmers are also angry with the government not getting a fair price for their produce. In districts like Dewas and Ujjain, known as the garlic belt of the country, the farmers are demanding the Centre and the state to immediately announce a market intervention scheme and start procuring garlic to help. Accordingly, farmers took out a 1-kilogram pack of garlic in Sehore and set free to quench the thirst of the harvest failed to fetch the desired price.

## LUMPY'S KNOCK IN MP, PYRE RAISED

Lumpi, a skin disease of cattle has knocked in Madhya Pradesh, two cases have been reported in Ratlam. Since then, the possibility of spreading this virus has increased in other areas of the state as well. Officially, it has been told that lumpy skin disease has been confirmed by NIHSD of Bhopal in two animals of Ratlam district.

State authorities are improving the work of administering 12,000 vaccine doses to animals has been completed. Directorate of Animal Husbandry and Dairying Dr R.K. Mehta has directed the departmental officers of the state to adopt all bio-security, bio-safety, and bio-containment measures of prevention of symptoms of the disease. Action is being taken by the Joint Director Veterinary Services of Ujjain along with the team of

veterinary and ensure ring vaccination with goat pox vaccine and adequate storage of the drug while a routine of bio-contamination of the area of ruptures. Special care of animals has been increased in Aligarh, Bhopal, Ratlam, Mandla, Neemuch, Raigarh and Berhampur bordering Rajasthan and Gujarat. The movement of animals in neighboring states has already been banned to prevent spread of the disease. Along with this, veterinary institutions, main village seats, veterinary offices of the border area have been asked to visit the area daily and keep a constant vigil.

## Strengthen ration distribution scheme in tribal dominated areas: Chief Minister

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has said that the week of providing ration to the people in tribal dominated areas should be continuously reinforced. At present, the increase in the number of beneficiaries under the scheme and the lifting of food grains is commendable. The youth of the tribal class have been given the responsibility of this work, due to which they also got self-employment and the villagers have been ensured in gas food grains on time. Continuous evaluation of this grand scheme, which provides grain to all the tribal families and half-farm people in their villages itself, should be done to make it more effective. The popularity of the scheme will continue to increase due to the study of the plan from the Alai Bhari Vajapeyi Institute of Good Governance and Policy Analysis and monitoring of the implementation by public representatives.

Chouhan was reviewing the 'Mandla Marine Ration Under Gram' scheme in a meeting at Ujjain on Wednesday. It was informed that



before the implementation of this scheme, while on an average, one lakh 73 thousand metric tonnes of food grains were being lifted, it has now increased to more than one lakh 80 thousand metric tonnes. Similarly the number of consumers has also increased. In this scheme started last year, on an average 7 lakh 14 thousand consumers were getting benefited earlier. Now this number has increased to more than 7 lakh 30 thou-

sand. The increase in different districts has ranged from 3 to 10 percent. It was informed in the meeting that as per the instructions given earlier by Chief Minister, the proposal has been prepared following the continuous monitoring of the scheme and strict control system at the state level. In this proposal, the responsibility for setting up a central committee and at the state level, formation of GPS systems in vehicles used by youth for material

distribution, monitoring of material distribution in the designated location by bringing POS machines in 4G mode and study of the plan and assignments given for study of the scheme are included. At present, the implementation of the scheme is being monitored by public representatives at various levels. Along with his instructions, continuous efforts have also been made to make the scheme effective.

## BJP wins, prez, V-P posts in Mandsaur Municipality

Bhamiyan Janata Party candidate B emerged victorious in the state's largest municipality - Mandsaur.

At the first meeting of the municipality which was held on Wednesday, Ramadev Bansilal Gurjar has been elected as the municipality president. Out of 40 votes, Gurjar got 34 votes, while her nearest rival from the Congress party Pankaj Kansaria got 10 votes.

Elections out of a total of 40 wards, BJP won 29, whereas Congress got success in eight wards, while independents got three.

For the vice-president post, Nirmala Chaudhary defected Taran Narendra Sharma of Congress by a margin of 26 votes.

Chawla got 33 votes, while Sharma got seven votes. It is believed that three independent corporators cast their votes in favour of BJP for president and vice-president, while out of a total of eight corporators from Congress, many claimed that two Congress corporators have voted for the BJP president and one voted for the vice-president.

The newly elected president of Mandsaur municipality, Ramadev Gurjar, will be the municipal president in hierarchy to him. The BJP had a majority in the municipality for the last four decades, now it has again got power for five years.

Gurjar was earlier the president of Mandsaur Jajpad panchayat and has also discharged the responsibility of the chairman of Krishli Upaj Mandal in Mandsaur.

## Cheetah relocation:

## WILD CATS LIKELY TO ARRIVE IN KUNO BY END OF AUGUST

Staff and authorities of Kuno National Park are struggling to keep leopards out of the 500-hectare enclosure made for the cheetahs

The plan to translocate cheetahs from South Africa and Namibia to India by August 13, after India's 70th Independence Day, has been delayed for two weeks or more due to a number of difficulties coming in the way of the project, according to media reports.

Cheetahs captured in Namibia need to complete their quarantine before being moved to India. The animals may arrive by end of August. The staff and authorities of Kuno National Park (KNP) are struggling to keep leopards out of the 500-hectare enclosure made for the cheetahs. National leaders of the two countries are worried that the leopards will venture into the enclosure and even the 10-metre-high and 12-kilometre-long fence, posing threats to the safety of the cheetahs.

KNP has a high population of leopards of about nine per 100 square km, as per the 2018 leopard census by National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA).

"There are around 100 staff members and rangers deployed to ensure that the leopards are caught and shifted far off into the park, but as far as we managed to catch only one," said Prakash



Varma, divisional forest officer, KNP.

Apart from the two caught, three more leopards in the area are managing to slip off from the foot traps and cages, making the authorities wonder about the spotted cat's strategy. "They are wild animals and we are trying to decipher their strategy. Three leopards have so far evaded the traps after fixating on the kill that was kept inside it," added Varma. The team is studying the movement of the leopards through camera traps to keep more foot traps and cages at the locations where they are ensuring the enclosures, but it is causing a delay.

It is difficult to predict how long it may take them to capture all three of them.

"This is something that is unpredictable. It may happen in one day if luck favours us, but it may take months. We are trying our best to catch them and put a date or deadline to it. We have kept four traps to trap the leopards and hope they will be captured soon," he said. The delay had not been caused by the leopards above. The project was facing minor hurdles in the two dozen countries, but members of the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change and the NTCA were not keeping the state government abreast of all the developments. JS Chaturvedi, principal chief conservator of forests and chief of KNP, said:

The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between South Africa and India was still pending and the permit for translocation of the cheetahs from Namibia had not been signed by both countries, according to media reports. India and Namibia had signed the MoU in July.

The chief public relations officer of the Namibian environment ministry said India must first provide them with an import permit for the cheetahs to prepare an export permit, which was causing a delay.
