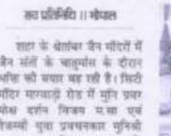

# UPSET FARMER SETS HIMSELF ON FIRE OUTSIDE POLICE STATION

**SHEETAL RAJAK, A RESIDENT OF CHOWKA VILAGE, WAS MENTALLY DISTRESSED AFTER HE LOST HIS CROPS DUE TO SUB-STANDARD PESTICIDE. HIS WIFE SAID.**

A farmer in Sagor district was left with 25 per cent burns after he tried to set himself on fire on the premises of a police station allegedly after the cops refused to take his complaint against a shopkeeper who sold sub-standard pesticide to him. A probe has been ordered on the supply of sub-standard pesticide, and also on whether the police denied lodging a complaint, a senior cop said.



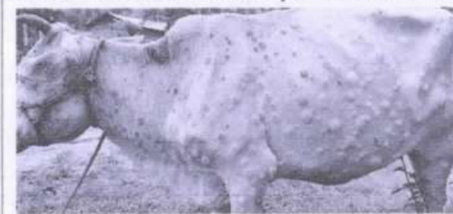
Sheetal Rajak, a resident of Chowka village, was mentally distressed after he lost his crop due to sub-standard pesticide, his wife said. "Our crops were ruined due to

sub-standard pesticide. He was mentally stressed and because of that he approached the local police station to lodge a complaint against the shop owner who had sold him the pesticide but the police refused to lodge the complaint," his wife Nisha Rajak said. Congress leader

the problems of the farmers," Nath tweeted. According to reports, Sheetal Rajak sprayed the pesticide across 20 acres, but the soyabean crop still got infested with pests. On Tuesday morning he reached Bhopal police station in Sagor district and received petrol. The farmer received 25 per cent burn injuries and is being treated at Sagor medical college.

"Agriculture department is probing the complaint of sub-standard pesticide and an inquiry will be held to look into why no action was taken by the police when he complained," a senior cop said. Civic farmers are also angry with the government not getting a fair price for their produce. In districts like Dewas and Ujjain, known as the garlic belt of the country, the farmers are demanding the Centre and the States to immediately announce a market intervention scheme and start procuring garlic to help them. Recently, farmers took out a funeral procession of garlic in Jabber and set fire to quintals of garlic after the harvest failed to fetch the desired price.

# LUMPY'S KNOCK IN MP, PYRE RAISED

Lumpy, a skin disease of cattle has knocked in Madhya Pradesh, two cases have been reported in Rattam. Since then, the possibility of spreading this virus has increased in other areas of the state as well. Officially, it has been found that lumpy skin disease has been confirmed by NIDRASH of Bhopal in two animals of Rattam district. Symptoms of lumpy skin disease have been seen in 73 animals of 11 villages of the district. Action is being taken by the Joint Director, Veterinary Services of Ujjain along with the team of

Divisional Disease Research Laboratory in the affected area as per the advisory. No death of animal is reported, health of 60 animals is improving, in Rattam district, the work of administering 12,000 vaccine doses to animals has been completed.

Director of Animal Husbandry and Dairying Dr. R.K. Mehta has directed the departmental officers of the state to adopt all bio-security, bio-safety, vector control measures if symptoms of the disease are found. Make animal owners aware of safety and protection measures. Immediately send samples of suspected animal to the labo-

rary and ensure ring vaccination with good pen vaccine and adequate storage of the drug within a radius of five kilometers from the site of rupture. Special vigil has been increased in Alirajgarh, Babusa, Baskera, Mandla, Narmada, Bilaspur and Bhopal bordering Rajasthan and Gujarat. The movement of animals in neighbouring states has already been banned to prevent the spread of this disease. Along with this, veterinary institutions, main village units, veterinary officers of the border areas have been asked to visit the area daily and keep a constant vigil.

# AIIMS BHOPAL TO INCREASE 10 PG BEDS

under Ayushman scheme, even the patients of Above Poverty Line (APL) category will get free treatment if need be. They would not be denied treatment over monetary issues. It is our people's friendly plan, said the new director. He further said, I've had notified patients moving from one ward to another due to lack of proper guidance. There will be a unified system to guide the patients to help them lead to their desired department. Outfit department will work in sync with the emergency and trauma centre. There will be a public relation department to assist the patients. Screen will display bed status so patients will not have to move here and there seeking information. There will be more OPD counters for the convenience of patients. This will bring down the number of queues and also save time of patients. It will be a patient grievance redressal system in AIIMS, Bhopal, he added. Within the next 1.5 years,

we are going to have Gamma Knife radiation surgery for neurosurgery. It will be a super speciality facility in central India, the AIIMS director added. In addition to Amit Pharmacy and Jay-Anshu, AIIMS administration will start its own medical pharmacy to provide all medicines to patients. It will be an internal arrangement, said the director. There will be five undergraduate students under one PG student and there will be a facility on two PG students. This will help AIIMS administration to remain in touch with undergraduate students and also keep informed about their issues, he added. We are going to start a recreation room with indoor games. Gym facilities will also be provided to students. Department of happiness and wellness centres will be started in AIIMS for students. Psychologists will be there to help students deal with depression. It will help in checking suicide cases in AIIMS, Dr Singh said.

# Strengthen ration distribution scheme in tribal dominated areas: Chief Minister

Chief Minister Shri Singh Chauthan has said that the work of providing ration to the people in tribal dominated areas should be continuously reviewed. At present, the increase in the number of beneficiaries under the scheme and the lifting of food grains is commendable. The youth of the tribal areas have been given the responsibility of this work, due to which they also get self-employment and the villagers have been assured to get food grains on time. Continuous evaluation of this grant scheme, which provides food grains to about seven and a half lakh people in their villages itself, should be done to make it more effective. The popularity of the scheme will continue to increase due to the study of the plan from the Atal Bihari Vajpayee Institute of Good Governance and Policy Analysis and monitoring of the implementation by public representatives. Chauthan was reviewing the 'Madhya Pradesh Ration-Aapka Gram' scheme in a meeting at Mandla on Wednesday. It was informed that



before the implementation of this scheme, while on an average, one lakh 73 thousand metric tonnes of food grains were being lifted, it has now increased to more than one lakh 80 thousand metric tonnes. Similarly the number of consumers has also increased. In this scheme started last year, on an average 7 lakh 14 thousand consumers were getting benefitted earlier. Now their number has increased to more than 7 lakh 30 thou-

sand. The increase in different districts has ranged from 3 to 10 percent. It was informed in the meeting that as per the instructions given earlier by Chief Minister, the proposal has been prepared following the continuous monitoring of the scheme and strict control system at the state level. In this proposal, the responsibility for setting up a control command system at the state level, installation of GPS systems in vehicles used by youth for material

distribution, monitoring of material distribution in the designated location by bringing PDS rations to ICs, mode and study of the plan and assignments given for study of the scheme are included. At present, the implementation of the scheme is being monitored by public representatives at various levels. Along with his suggestions, continuous efforts have also been made to make the scheme effective.

# BJP wins, prez, V-P posts in Mandasaur Municipality

Bharatiya Janata Party candidate emerged victorious in the state's largest municipality - Mandasaur. At the first meeting of the municipality which was held on Wednesday, Ramachand Bursilal Gurjar has been elected as the municipality president. Out of 40 votes, Gurjar got 34 votes, while nearest rival from the Congress party Pankaj Kankesh Soni got six votes. Earlier, out of a total of 40 wards, BJP won 20, whereas Congress got success in eight wards, while independents got three. For the vice-president post, BIP's Narindra Prasad Chaudhary defeated Varun Maunendra Sharma of Congress by a margin of 26 votes.

Chawla got 33 votes, while Sharma got seven votes. It is believed that three independent corporators cast their votes in favour of BJP for president and vice-president, while out of a total of eight corporators from Congress, many claimed that two Congress corporators gave their vote for the BJP president and one voted for the vice-president. The newly elected president of Mandasaur municipality, Ramachand Gurjar, will be the fourth youngest president in history so far. The BJP has had a majority in the municipality for the last four decades, now it has again got power for five years. Gurjar was earlier the president of Mandasaur janpad panchayat and has also discharged the responsibility of the chairman of Koshi Upaj Mandal in Mandasaur.

# Cheetah relocation: WILD CATS LIKELY TO ARRIVE IN KUNO BY END OF AUGUST

Staff and authorities of Kuno National Park are struggling to keep leopards out of the 500-hectare enclosure made for the cheetahs

The plan to translocate cheetahs from South Africa and Namibia to India by August 13, before India's 79th Independence Day, has been delayed for around two weeks or more due to a number of difficulties coming in the way of the project, according to media reports. Cheetahs captured in Namibia need to complete their quarantine before being moved to India. The animals may arrive by the end of August. The staff and authorities of Kuno National Park (KNP) are struggling to keep leopards out of the 500-hectare enclosure made for the cheetahs. Native leopards of the park continue wandering into the enclosures, undisturbed by traps and even the nine-foot high and 12-kilometre-long fence, posing threats to the safety of the cheetahs. KNP has a high population of leopards of about seven per 100 square km, as per the 2010 leopard census by National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA). "There are around 100 staff members and rangers deployed to ensure that the leopards are caught and shifted far off into the park, but so far we have managed to catch only two," said Prakash



Varma, divisional forest officer, KNP. Apart from the two caught, three more leopards in the area are being kept in cages. They are wild animals and we are trying to decipher their strategy. Three leopards have so far roamed the traps after leaping on the hill that was kept inside," added Varma. The team is studying the movement of the leopards through camera traps to keep more traps and cages at the locations where they are entering the enclosures, but it is

still difficult to predict how long it may take them to capture all three of them. "This is something that is unpredictable. It may happen in one day if luck favours us, or it may take weeks. We are trying our best but cannot put a date or deadline on it. We have kept four cages to trap the leopards and hope they will be captured soon," he said. A delay had not been caused by the leopards alone. The project was facing more hurdles in the two donor countries, but members of the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change and the NTCA were not keeping the state government abreast of all the developments. JS Choudhan, principal chief conservator of forest, told Down To Earth. The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between South Africa and India was still pending and the permit for translocation of the cheetahs from Namibia had also not been signed by both countries, according to media reports. India and Namibia had signed the MoU in July. The chief public relations officer of the Namibian environment ministry said India must first provide them with an import permit for the cheetahs to prepare an export permit, which was causing a delay.
