Hitting \$6.5 billion turnover, Amul eyes world top 3 ranks

GCMMF Targets ₹50k Cr Annual Turnover By 2020-21

Vadodara: The Gujarat Co-operative Milk Marketing Federation (GCMMF) which markets dairy products under brand Amul is targeting a turnover of Rs 50,000 crore and emerge as largest FMCG organisation in the country by 2020-21. At its 45th annual general meeting (AGM) held on Tuesday, the apex body of dairy cooperatives of Gujarat declared that it had registered a turnover of Rs 33,150 crore in financial year 2018-19, 13% higher than the previous financial year. Amul, which is ranked ninth by turnover among world's largest dairy

organizations at present, hopes to climb up to be among the top three soon. In fact, the group turnover of GCMMF and its constituent member unions, representing unduplicated turnover of all products sold under Amul brand has exceeded Rs 45,000 crore (US \$ 6.5 billion). "During the last nine years, our milk procurement has witnessed a phenomenal increase of 153%. This growth is a result of high milk procure-

milk production needs to grow at around 3.2% CAGR for the next 40 years. This can be possible only when dairy farmers are given stable and remunerative prices through proper market linkage. In order to achieve this estimated growth in demand, the time is ripe for the second White Revolution," he said.

GCMMF's managing director RS Sodhi said that Indian dairy farmers can look forward to golden days ahead with dairy commodity prices firming over the last three to four months. "Innovation is key to our success," he said, adding that Amul has introduced as many as 102 new products in last four years. Of these, 48 are presently registered and in just last two years, he said, exceeding the target of launching two new products every month.

He added the total milk processing capacity which presently stands at 360 lakh litres per day will be scaled up to 400 lakh litres per day within the next two years.

14 booked for driving couple to suicide

Rajkot: The Rajkot police on Tuesday booked 14 persons for driving a middle-aged husband-wife duo to suicide on May 1. The accused, all moneylenders, were booked after the son of the deceased couple lodged produced his parents' suicide note during the recently held lok darbar (public hearing) by the police department. Based on the suicide note cops booked the moneylenders.

Kiritiben Sangani (52) and her husband Kamlesh Sangani (59), a imitation jewellery worker, ended life at Racecourse ground on May 1 after consuming poison. The couple are residents of Bhaktinagar in Rajkot.

Their son Mayur, who is working with the Rajkot Municipal Corporation (RMC), had then informed the po-

lice that before dying her mother had asked him to check his father's belonging but he forgot to check. Kiritiben died on the same day in the hospital while Kamlesh died two days later. In his statement Mayur had then

told police that he was not aware of the reason for his parents' suicide.

During the lok darbar, Mayur informed cops that he had found a suicide note of his father naming 14 persons from whom he had borrowed the money. However, there was no mention of the amount he had borrowed from each one of them. But it was written in the suicide note that the 14 people were harassing and threatening him for money. Pradhmanagar police has booked all 14 based on the suicide note submitted by Mayur.

The police has registered total 10 FIRs in past two days based on submissions made by victims of moneylenders in the lok darbar held Saturday last. In another case, a moneylender was booked for charging 60% percent interest from an imitation jeweller.

We were born with gift of making the perfect reed, say craftsmen in Palitana

Ustad Akhlaq Hussain, a renowned harmonium player, says, "Harmonium reeds are made in some parts of Delhi, Haryana and Punjab as well but they are not match for reeds made in Palitana. Palitana reeds sound more melodious and have distinct notes. Since reed manufacturing units in Germany closed down, majority of harmonium players prefer only Palitana reeds."

Renowned playback and ghazal singer, Hariharan, says he uses Palitana reeds for their tone quality and tuning stability. "I have used reeds made by Manoharbarhai. His harmoniums are also tuned to perfection," adds Hariharan, who has known him since 1980s.

Playback singer and music director Roop Kumar Rathod says, "Reeds made in other places need frequent tuning. In contrast, those made in Palitana get more seasoned and open up with use." Barun Paul, Kolkata-based harmon-



ability of the craftsman to listen and to attune all his senses to music. It is not a skill that can be taught. It's instinctive," says Parag Mistry, great grandson of Mohanlal Mistry whose family has been making reeds since 1931.

Local legend has it that in 1901, Bhavnagar's ruler Krishnakumarshihji Gohil called two blacksmiths to repair the harmonium of a British man. Jivantal Mistry and Mohanlal had never seen a harmonium, but using their sense of music they successfully repaired it. Since then, generations of the family have "followed their calling" and produced some of the finest reeds available in the market. At one point, the entire process was manual. Today, there are machines to assist but the tuning of the reed is done manually by the master craftsman.

Jeetubhai from Ratilal Jivantal Mistry, a 14-year-old firm theroater takes three reed units, says it can take a new worker six months to a year of practice to make a perfect-sounding reed.

According to the forest department, the victim lived alone and on Monday night, when she was sleeping at her house, the leopard entered her house by jumping a compound wall. It killed the woman and dragged her body into the bushes in the outskirts of village. When the neighbours and relatives started searching for the missing woman, they found her remains from the bushes. They immediately informed the forest department, which sent the body for post mortem while it also set a trap to catch the man-eater leopard.

NGT seeks report on govt's plan to buy 4,000 diesel buses

Ahmedabad: The principal bench of the National Green Tribunal (NGT) has ordered Gujarat government to submit a report within a month on its bid to purchase 4,000 BS-IV buses and to explain how this is not a violation of the directions issued by the Supreme Court and the tribunal to curb vehicular pollution.

The tribunal on Friday issued the show-cause notice and sought report in response to an application filed by Mustak Kadri in expressing grievance against the state government's plan to purchase 4,000 buses for non-essential purposes. Citing its earlier orders, the tribunal said, "Fact remains that purchase of diesel buses is illegal to be in violation of orders of the Supreme Court in M C Mehta v/s Union of India and the orders of this tribunal."

On December 5 last year, in response to Kadri's application, the tribunal had ordered the state government to do away with all heavy vehicles that are 10 years old. It also ordered to put restrictions on registration of diesel vehicles. Kadri had prayed to restrain the state government from buying new diesel vehicles for public transportation. He had also urged NGT to order the state government to phase out all public transport and commercial vehicles that are 10 years old. The NGT had ordered that all the norms for playing and registering heavy vehicles in National Capital Region (NCR) would be applicable in Gujarat. While ordering restriction on purchase of new diesel vehicles, the tribunal had granted some relaxations to diesel vehicles used in emergency and essential services. sw
