Zverev knocks out Nadal in French Open first round

Emotional Spaniard says not sure of next year

Paris, May 28:

In a stunning upset at the French Open, Rafael Nadal's return to the tournament was cut short as he fell to 4th-seeded Alexander Zverev in the first round on Monday.

Zverev secured a decisive victory over the 14-time French Open champion with a scoreline of 6-3, 7-6, 6-3.

Nadal, playing his first Grand Slam match of the year after missing the Australian Open, displayed glimpses of his legendary form throughout the match, drawing fervent support from spectators.

Despite showcasing some remarkable tennis, Nadal couldn't overcome Zverev's determined performance, who sought revenge for his defeat in the semifinals of the 2022 French Open. The match, lasting 3 hours and 5 minutes, marked Nadal's third-ever loss at the French Open.

The match began with a shaky start for Nadal, as Zverev quickly seized an early lead by breaking Nadal's serve.

Despite Nadal's attempts to stage a comeback, Zverev maintained control and clinched the first set 6-3.

Zverev fought fiercely in the second set, rallying to even the score at 2-2 and thrilling the spectators with his resilience. However, Zverev's powerful serving and strategic gameplay ultimately prevailed, as he secured the second set in a tie-breaker.

Undeterred, Nadal made a spirited effort in the third set, taking an early lead and captivating the spectators with his exceptional play. However, Zverev's consistency and composure proved decisive as he broke Nadal's serve and sealed the match with a 6-3 victory in the third set.

Zverev's triumph marked a significant upset in the tournament, ending Nadal's campaign in the first round and sending shockwaves through the tennis world. Despite the defeat, Nadal received a warm ovation from both Zverev and the crowd, acknowledging his enduring

legacy at Roland Garros.

Nadal delivered an emotional speech after his defeat to Alexander Zverev in the first round of the French Open, leaving fans with a mix of nostalgia and hope as they await his future decisions regarding his illustrious career.

Nadal began by addressing the uncertainty of his return to the French Open. "It is difficult for me to talk, I don't know if it's the last time I'll be here in front of all of you. Honestly, I am not 100 percent sure," he admitted, acknowledging the special connection he shares with the Parisian crowd. "If it is the last time, then you, the crowd, have been amazing. Today the feelings I have are difficult to describe in words. For me, it is so special to feel the love in the place I love the most."

India's top-ranked singles player, Sumit Nagal, faced a tough first-round match against Russia's 18th-seeded Karen Khachanov at Court 7, resulting in a straight-sets defeat.

Despite a valiant effort, Nagal succumbed 2-6, 0-6, 6-7 (5-7) to his Russian opponent at Roland Garros here on Monday.

Nagal, aiming to upset the big-hitting Khachanov, struggled to match his opponent's power and range throughout the match. The turning point in the opening set came when Khachanov secured a break in game three, capitalising on Nagal's missed opportunities and winning the set 6-2.

Rain briefly interrupted the match, halting play for 21 minutes, before the contest resumed. Khachanov continued his dominance, breaking Nagal once more in game seven to claim the set 6-0.

Despite facing a daunting deficit in the second set, Nagal fought back, showing resilience in the must-win third set.

Trailing 2-3 and later 3-5, Nagal staged an impressive comeback, winning three consecutive games to lead 6-5. However, Khachanov forced a tie-breaker, ultimately clinching the set 7-5 and sealing his victory.

Indian men beat Argentina 5-4 in FIH Pro League

Antwerp, May 28:

In a display of resilience and determination, the Indian men's hockey team clinched a dramatic 5-4 victory against Argentina in their fourth match of the European leg of the FIH Hockey Pro League 2023-24.

The match commenced with high energy, as Argentina's Federico Monja opened the scoring in the 3rd minute. India responded swiftly, equalising through Arajeet Singh Hundal's brilliant field goal in the 7th minute. Despite India earning a penalty corner in the final minute of the first quarter, they could not capitalize, and the quarter ended with a 1-1 tie.

The second quarter saw India taking control with Gurjant Singh's impressive field goal in the 18th minute, giving India a 2-1 lead. However, Argentina's Nicolas Keenan leveled

the score at 2-2 with a counter-attacking goal in the 24th minute. India's captain, Harmanpreet Singh, then converted a penalty corner in the 29th minute, pushing India ahead 3-2 as the teams headed into halftime.

The third quarter was marked by intense, fast-paced hockey from both sides. Despite several opportunities, including a penalty corner for

India, both defenses held strong, and the quarter ended goalless, maintaining India's 3-2 lead.

The fourth quarter brought a surge of excitement.

India dominated early, earning a penalty stroke that Captain Harmanpreet Singh converted in the 50th minute, extending the lead to 4-2. Just two minutes later, another

penalty stroke allowed Harmanpreet to score again, making it 5-2. Argentina fought back valiantly, with Tadeo Marucci and Lucas Martinez scoring in the 54th and 57th minutes, respectively, bringing the score to a nail-biting 5-4. Despite the late pressure, India held on to secure the victory. India will face Germany at 14:30 hours IST on June 1

New Delhi, May 28:

The ICC men's T20 World Cup 2024 is set to commence, bringing together 20 teams from the prestigious T20I cricket title.

Group A, featuring Asian powerhouses India and Pakistan, will also

see fierce competition from co-hosts USA and Canada, as well as Ireland.

India, under the leadership of Rohit Sharma, aims to break their streak of near misses in recent world events.

With a star-studded lineup including Yashasvi Jaiswal, Virat Kohli, Suryakumar Yadav, Rishabh Pant, and Sanju Samson, India's batting depth is formidable.

All-rounders Hardik Pandya, Ravindra Jadeja, Axar Patel, and Shivam Dube add versatility, while the bowling attack, led by Jasprit Bumrah, is set to dominate.

Returning from injury, Bumrah is crucial to India's campaign, having shown exceptional form in recent matches.

Led by Babar Azam, Pakistan enters the tournament with a mission to secure an ICC trophy after recent close calls. The team's batting relies on Babar, Mohammad Rizwan, and Fakhar Zaman, while the bowling is spearheaded by Shaheen Afridi, supported by a strong pace and spin contingent.

Azam's consistent batting will be pivotal for Pakistan, especially under the pressure of leading the team.

Paul Stirling captains Ireland as they seek to make an impact. With a balanced squad featuring players like Harry Tector, Mark Adair, and Josh Little, Ireland aims to advance beyond the group stage for the first time.
