# Basant Panchami: Millions take amrit snan

The third amrit snan of Maha Kumbh 2025 concluded on Basant Panchami in Prayagraj with akharas taking the sacred ritual bath.

According to the administration, millions of devotees took a holy dip in the sacred waters of Triveni Sangam on Basant Panchami on Monday.

A wave of unwavering faith surged along the banks of Triveni as devotees participated in the amrit snan of Basant Panchami. The third amrit snan commenced with the ritualistic dip of saints from 13 akharas, the torchbearers of Sanatan Dharma, at the confluence of the Ganga, Yamuna, and the mystical Saraswati.

The alignment of Basant Panchami, the divine day marking the manifestation of Goddess Saraswati, with the amrit snan of the akharas made this occasion even more extraordinary. Amrit snans at Maha Kumbh hold deep spiritual significance - the first signifies karma, the second devote, and the third knowledge. Upholding their ancient Sanatan traditions, the akharas of sadhus and sanyasis took the sacred amrit snan following an elaborate shobha yatra taken out with full rituals and grandeur.

The sight of this millennia-old unbroken tradition left common devotees spellbound as the dharma rakshak Nagas, ascetics from the Himalayan caves, monasteries and temples, descended on the holy Sangam, adorned in their traditional attire.

Following the customary order, the akharas proceeded towards the Sangam with full grandeur. The amrit snan began with Maha Nirvani Akhara, followed by the Nag Sadhus of Niranjani Akhara, Panchdashnam Juna Akhara,

On Tuesday, the King of Bhutan is set to visit Prayagraj Maha Kumbh, where he will take a holy bath at the Triveni Sangam and perform darshan and puja at the sacred site. Among those who were present to welcome the Bhutan king at the airport were Mayor Sushma Kharkwal, Principal



Secretary (Home) Sanjay Prasad, DGP Prashant Kumar and Lucknow District Magistrate Vishak G, who also presented bouquets to the king.

Aawahana Akhara, and Panch Agni Akhara. The Vaishnav and Udasin Akharas took their sacred dips next, and finally, the Nirmal Akhara completed the holy bathing ritual in the auspicious amrit kaal.

Adding to the divine spectacle, the Yogi Adityanath government showered flowers from helicopters upon the crores of devotees who thronged the Sangam for this last amrit snan of Maha Kumbh 2025. The floral showers, which began at 6:30 am, continued throughout the amrit snan, blessing saints, Nagas sanyasis and devotees with a celestial

downpour of rose petals from the skies. The atmosphere reverberated with sacred chants of 'Jai Shri Ram' and 'Har Har Mahadev'.

On all three amrit snans of Maha Kumbh 2025, floral showers from helicopters honoured the saints, akharas, devotees and kalpvasis. # Ayodhya witnesses devotional surge

Ayodhya has set a new record with over one crore pilgrims visiting the holy city between January 26 and Basant Panchami (February 3). Amid vigilant administrative arrangements, pilgrims arriving in Ayodhya are filled with joy and devotion, chanting slogans in praise of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, and Lord Shri Ram.

On Basant Panchami, lakhs of devotees took the holy dip and offered prayers, further enriching the spiritual atmosphere. For the first time since Ram Lalla was enthroned in the grand temple, Maha Kumbh is being held in Prayagraj, drawing an influx of pilgrims to Ayodhya as well. Anticipating this, Chief Minister Yogi had deployed a dedicated team of officials to oversee the arrangements and ensure a seamless experience for devotees.

Following a public meeting in Milkpur on February 2, he reinforced instructions to officials, emphasising that no devotee should face any difficulty. The sacred bathing ritual on Basant Panchami began at dawn and continued until the afternoon, accompanied by acts of charity and devotion. Devotees then proceeded to maths and temples for darshan, with queues stretching till late evening at Ram temple and Hanuman Garhi.

The Ram temple remains the spiritual epicenter of Ayodhya, attracting around three lakh devotees daily. The temple trust has made elaborate arrangements to facilitate darshan, keeping the temple open for 18 hours a day.

Simultaneously, Hanuman Garhi continues to witness a steady stream of devotees, reinforcing Ayodhya's deep-rooted spiritual significance.

The maths and temples of Ayodhya witnessed vibrant celebrations on Basant Panchami, as sadhus and saints joyfully played with colours, marking the festive spirit. As part of the rituals, abir and gulal were also applied to the deity seated in the sanctum sanctorum. Ram Lalla, the presiding deity, was adorned in new yellow garments, symbolising the arrival of spring. According to the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teertha Kshetra Trust, gulal was applied to Ram Lalla, and priests exchanged it as prasad, enhancing the spiritual atmosphere. A variety of offerings, including kheer, puri, dry fruits and fruits, were presented as part of the sacred rituals.

While Prayagraj offers vast spaces for ritual baths, Ayodhya's focus remains on Ram Lalla, drawing massive crowds to a concentrated area. Managing such a large gathering was a significant challenge, but effective administrative planning and strategy ensured smooth coordination.

IG Praveen Kumar highlighted key measures implemented for crowd management, including road diversions, designated parking areas, and a substantial police deployment to maintain order. Entry to the fairgrounds was regulated based on safety protocols, ensuring a hassle-free experience for devotees.

Divisional Commissioner Gaurav Dayal affirmed that officers were monitoring the fair zone 24x7, with arrangements in place to accommodate 25,000 to 30,000 people. Additionally, vehicles have been deployed to transport those sleeping in the open to designated shelters, ensuring their comfort and safety. As a result of these measures, devotees arriving in Ayodhya are experiencing well-organised facilities and a spiritually enriching atmosphere.

# Milkpur bypoll a 'chunauti', says Akhilesh

Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav launched a scathing attack on the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party, saying the by-election in Milkpur assembly constituency was not a "chunav" (election) but a "chunauti" (challenge).

"Milkpur bypoll is a direct contest between people and administration; it is not just an election but a challenge," he said.

Addressing a rally in Milkpur on the last day of campaigning, Yadav also said that Milkpur would send a strong message for the future of Uttar Pradesh politics. He alleged that the BJP deliberately postponed the Milkpur bypoll, fearing a loss.

"This is not just an election, it is a challenge. The BJP knew that the people of Milkpur would never abandon the Samajwadi Party, so they ensured the poll did not take place earlier. But those who run away from elections will have to face the people's verdict,"

Yadav said while addressing the rally in support of party candidate Ajit Prasad. The SP candidate is son of party MP from Faizabad Awadhesh Prasad. The former chief minister of Uttar Pradesh accused the BJP government of engaging in divisive politics while failing to address real issues. He also targeted the administration over the handling of the Maha Kumbh at Prayagraj, alleging mismanagement and under-reporting of casualties.

"They claim crores have taken

a dip in the Maha Kumbh, but they are unable to provide the real count of those who lost their lives in the stampede," he said.

"The chief minister says he wakes up at 3 am to monitor arrangements, but when the tragedy happened, where was he?" Yadav asked.

Referring to the victory of SP's Awadhesh Prasad from Faizabad constituency in the 2024 Lok Sabha election, Yadav said the people of Ayodhya had already rejected communal

politics.

"The BJP tried to create a communal atmosphere, but Ayodhya's voters stood with Samajwadis. Now, Milkpur will send another strong message for the future of Uttar Pradesh politics," he added.

The Milkpur bypoll is scheduled for February 5 and the results will be announced on February 8. The contest is primarily between the SP and the BJP, with both parties deploying senior leaders for campaigning.
