Priyanka Gandhi Writes to UP CM Yogi, Seeks Relief for Middle Class from Covid Impact

New Delhi: Asserting that middle class is reeling under the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra on Thursday urged Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath to take public welfare steps such as ensuring that private hospitals do not overcharge people, inflation is reined in and relief given to traders. In a letter to Adityanath, Priyanka Gandhi said the second wave of the pandemic has severely affected the masses and people have had to bear "unbearable pain" due to the alleged lack of preparation on the part of the administration. "The mayhem in April-May has made it clear that the government had no planning. Many unnecessary rules and red-tapism brought a mountain of problems for the people," the Congress general secretary in-charge of Uttar Pradesh said. While on one hand the pandemic has taken so many people



away from us, on the other it has created huge difficulties in terms of livelihood, employment and business, Priyanka Gandhi said. "Today, crores of people are apprehensive about their future, their means of earnings have decreased and inflation has increased very fast. This has particularly put the middle class in trouble," she said. Instead of leaving the people to fend for themselves in these difficult situations, the government needs to take some public welfare steps and provide relief to the people, she said. In her letter to Adityanath, Priyanka Gandhi

made five suggestions for providing relief to the people of the state. She pointed out that while private sector hospitals have played a big role in the pandemic, there have also been complaints from across the state of private hospitals charging a hefty amount for treatment from the people. Priyanka Gandhi urged the chief minister to sit with the representatives of private hospitals so that people-friendly prices can be fixed according to the medical facilities provided. The state government should also ensure compensation to those who have been

charged excess money by hospitals, she said. Priyanka Gandhi also called on the chief minister to rein in inflation and fix the prices of household items such as edible oils, vegetables and fruits, so that people don't have difficulties during lockdown. The Congress leader also flagged the problems being faced by the people due to high electricity bills and urged the state government to give relief in their payment, while also not increasing the price of electricity any further. "Schools in the state are closed but parents are under pressure to deposit fees every month. There is also a crisis in front of schools to pay salaries to their teachers etc.," she said. The state government should sit down with the representatives of the schools and parents and prepare a roadmap for providing a fee waiver as well as a package of financial aid to the schools.

Vaccination Drive by POWERGRID

New Delhi (Hindustan Samachar): POWERGRID Corporation of India Ltd, a Maharatna PSU under Ministry of Power, has organised vaccination camps in many locations for its employees at its establishments across the country. The cities where the vaccination camps are organized included Kota, Bhiwadi, Misa, Namsai, Rourkela, Ara, Biharsharif, Saharsa, and Muzaffarpur etc. For all the steps the cost on account of vaccination was borne by POWERGRID. This includes its Gurugram's multi-purpose hall where it vaccinated more than 1600 employees in association with Max hospital from 10 to 17 May. These include employees, contractual employees and superannuated employees and their family members.

Another vaccination camp was organised by POWERGRID at its MP Hall in Gurugram from 31st March to 6th May in association with Max Hospitals, Fortis and Artemis more than 700 individuals were vaccinated. A vaccination camp was also organised by POWERGRID at Katwaria Sarai office in Delhi in association with Apollo Hospitals where more than 290 people took the vaccine this number includes more than 80 employees and their families from Ministry of Power and other Power PSUs. A total of more than 2600 people have been vaccinated by POWERGRID in these three camps organized in NCR territory. These camps were organized for the age groups of 18-44 years and also for those above 45 years of age.

Pinarayi Vijayan takes oath as Kerala chief minister for 2nd consecutive time



Kerala: Pinarayi Vijayan took oath as the chief minister of Kerala for the second consecutive term on Thursday. Governor Arif Mohammad Khan administered the oath in the swearing-in ceremony which the Kerala high court allowed on the condition of only 500 invitees. Vijayan's association with the Communist Party of India Marxist goes back a long way as the 76-year-old started

as a youth leader while he was studying at Government Brennen College. In 1964, he joined the Communist Party, eventually became Kannur district secretary of Kerala Students' Federation (KSF), which became the Students Federation of India (SFI). He was arrested in 1975, during the Emergency. In 2002, he was elected to the politburo.

Dedicated Centres to Be Set Up for Treatment of Black Fungus Cases in Delhi, Says CM Kejriwal

New Delhi: Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Thursday said dedicated centres will be set up for the treatment of black fungus or mucormycosis cases at three city government-run hospitals. He made the announcement after discussing the rise in black fungus cases with officials and specialists at a meeting here. "Three important

decisions were taken at the meeting. Centres will be set up at Lok Nayak Jai Prakash Narayan Hospital, Guru Tegh Bahadur Hospital and Rajiv Gandhi Super Speciality Hospital for treatment of black fungus," the CM tweeted. The drugs used in the treatment of the fungal infection will be arranged in enough quantity and awareness will be created

among people for prevention against the disease, he said. "We have to stop the spread of the disease and have to give best possible treatment to those suffering from it," he said in another tweet in Hindi.

PRAYAGRAJ, (Hindustan Samachar): The Allahabad High Court Bar Association (HCBA) issued Rs 5 lakh cheques to the dependents of lawyers who died recently as a result of the corona pandemic. In a ceremony held at the High Court Bar Association's library hall, president Amrendra Nath Singh and secretary Prabha Shankar Mishra presented cheques to 17 dependents

of high court lawyers who died in the recent second wave of the corona pandemic. All of the Covid protocols were followed in the programme, according to HCBA's joint secretary (press), Rajendra Kumar Singh. "Now, the next session will be

held soon to disburse cheques to the family members who were left behind. According to him, 17 people received cheques this time." In addition, Rs 2 lakh cheques were issued to the relatives of lawyers who died before the Apda Programme, i.e. the covid relief scheme, was launched. In addition, Rs 10,000 in medical help was transferred to the bank accounts of ten lawyers who are suffering from Covid and are receiving treatment. The HCBA expressed its gratitude to Chief Justice of Allahabad High Court Sanjay Yadav and the state government for opening a vaccination centre for lawyers on the high court grounds.

Nearly 2 Crore Covid-19 Vaccine Doses Available with States, UTs: Union Health Ministry

New Delhi: Nearly two crore COVID-19 vaccine doses are still available with states and union territories while around 26 lakh are in the pipeline and will be received by them within the next three days, the Union health ministry said on Thursday. Vaccination is an integral pillar of the comprehensive strategy of the government of India for containment and management of the pandemic along with test, track, treat and COVID-appropriate behaviour, it said.

per data available at 8 am today," the ministry said. "Nearly 2.00 crore (1,97,70,555) COVID vaccine doses are still available with the states and UTs to be administered," it said. "Furthermore, nearly 26 lakh (25,98,760) vaccine doses are in the pipeline and will be received by the states and UTs within the next three days," it added. The government has also been facilitating the direct procurement of vaccines by the states and UTs. Implementation of the Liberalised and Accelerated Phase 3 Strategy of COVID-19 Vaccination started from May 1. Under this strategy, every month, 50 per cent of the total Central Drugs Laboratory (CDL) cleared vaccine doses of any manufacturer would be procured by the Centre. It would continue to make these doses available to the state governments totally free of cost as was being done earlier, the ministry said.
