

# Injured Rohit ruled out, Agarwal in for ODIs; Gill back for Tests

New Delhi, Feb 4. Limited-overs vice captain Rohit Sharma was on Monday ruled out of the upcoming ODI and Test series against New Zealand after sustaining a calf injury during the fifth T20 International in Mount Maunganui.

Rohit retired hurt after scoring 60 off 41 balls after he pulled his calf muscle while going for a quick single during the match that India won on Sunday.

"He is out of the tour. Right now, it's not looking good. The physio is assessing him. We will get to know how bad it is but he is not taking any further part in the series," a top BCCI source told PTI on conditions of anonymity.

India are set to play three ODIs, starting Wednesday, and two Tests after that.

It has been learnt that Mayank Agarwal will be



replacing Rohit as the third opener in the ODI set-up along with K.L. Rahul and Prithvi Shaw.

Agarwal was the logical choice in the white-ball format since he was the reserve opener in the side during the home ODI series against the West Indies when Shikhar Dhawan was absent due to knee injury.

In the Test squad, Shubman Gill will join KL Rahul and Prithvi

Shaw as the third opener in the absence of Rohit.

During India's last two Test series at home (vs South Africa and Bangladesh), Gill was the back-up opener to Rohit and Agarwal. His place was sealed in the squad after scores of 83 and 204 not out in a drawn first 'A' Test against New Zealand in Christchurch.

The Test squad is yet to be officially announced but it is learnt that it

has already been selected and only the official announcement is due.

The old selection committee under M.S.K. Prasad picked the replacements but it might take some time for the official announcement as convener of the selection committee, secretary Jay Shah, is on his way to New Zealand along with treasurer Arun Dhumal.

"Once the secretary's approval comes, the replacements will be officially announced. But the selectors have already sent the names," the source added.

It has still not been ascertained whether Rohit has endured a calf muscle tear but he looked in severe pain even after physio Nitin Patel attended to him.

Despite that, he smacked a six off Ish Sodhi but had to be replaced after it became unbearable for him.

# Coronavirus hits China's Olympic prep; anti-doping agency halts testing

Lausanne, Feb 4: China's state anti-doping agency "temporarily" suspended testing on Monday less than six months before the Tokyo Olympics in response to the coronavirus epidemic, the International Testing Agency told AFP.

"The situation is one of caution so as not to endanger athletes or test officials and while recognising the importance of anti-doping activities, the priorities are to maintain public health for all," said the ITA.

The Olympics start on July 24.

The Chinese agency (CHINADA) "will gradually resume testing as soon as the situation improves," the ITA said, adding that it was examining whether "private providers" could conduct tests.

"We are still six months away from the Tokyo games," an agency spokeswoman said.

"It is indeed likely that this will have an impact on the testing missions in China and solutions will have to be found." The Chinese authorities reported 57 new deaths from the virus on Monday, taking the tally past 360 since the virus

was detected late last year in the central city of Wuhan, where it is believed to have jumped from animals.

The virus has spread to more than 24 countries. A string of sports events in China have been cancelled.

All domestic football has been suspended and among the events either cancelled or postponed are the World Indoor athletics championships, Tokyo Olympics boxing and women's basketball qualifiers and cycling's Tour of Hainan.

Also cancelled are snooker's China Open, badminton's China

Masters and golf's LPGA Blue Bay tournament. The Chinese Formula E Grand Prix on March 21 was called off on Sunday.

The Chinese Formula One Grand Prix, in Shanghai on April 19, is also at risk, with the FIA announcing last Thursday it was "monitoring the evolving situation".

The ITA spokeswoman said that for events moved outside China the planned testing regimes would not be changed.

"We will continue to run the programme we have prepared, even if the competitions are held in other locations."

# Vinesh, Sindhu, Mary among nominees for BBC Sportswoman award

New Delhi, Feb 4: Star wrestler Vinesh Phogat, badminton queen P.V. Sindhu and boxing great M.C. Mary Kom will compete for the inaugural BBC Indian sportswoman of the year award after being nominated for the honor with two other athletes.

Sprinter Dutee Chand and para-badminton player Manasi Joshi are the other nominees for the award, the winner of which will be announced on March 8. The winner will be decided on the basis of public voting, which will be open till February 18 on six BBC

vernacular websites.

Vinesh had won a bronze at the 2019 World Championship in Nur Sultan to secure a quota for the Tokyo Olympics while Sindhu became the first Indian shuttler to become world champion last year.

Manasi became a world champion after winning gold at the para world championship while Mary Kom is the only Indian boxer to win eight world medals, including six gold.

Dutee had won a 100m silver at the 2018 Jakarta Asian Games. Rupa Jha, the Head

of BBC Indian languages, informed that the nominees were picked up by a panel of 40 eminent sports journalists.

"We had asked our panel members to pick their candidates. The five athletes who got the maximum number of votes, were eventually selected as the final nominees," Rupa said while addressing a press conference.

"We will cover their journeys, the societal attitude towards them and their lives beyond sport. A research is being conducted on this, simultaneously,"

she added. "We feel that though, of late, the media has started taking interest in women athletes, still they are not promoted as male athletes. Since 2000, of the 13 Olympic medals, 5 are won by women but we feel the recognition they should have got, is not there. That was the thought behind starting this award," she said.

Indu Shekhar Sinha, BBC's Head of Business Development, Asia Pacific said the award will be an annual feature and they may introduce a category for emerging athletes in future.

# Tendulkar shortlisted for Laureus Sporting Moment award

New Delhi, Feb 4: Cricket icon Sachin Tendulkar has been

shortlisted as one among five contenders for the greatest Laureus Sporting Moment 2000-2020 Award.

The winner will be selected after the third and final round of voting, which will end on February 16.

The moment, titled 'Carried On the Shoulders Of A Nation', is a reference to the Indian cricket team's 2011 ICC Cricket World Cup triumph.

In his sixth attempt, Tendulkar finally tasted success in 2011

as the Indian team beat Sri Lanka by six wickets. Carried on the shoulders of the Indian team, Tendulkar made a lap of honour, shedding tears of joy after the victory was sealed in his home city of Mumbai.

Kolekar was put under pressure after the Services lad bettered his own national record lifting 119kg to open up a four-kg lead after the round of snatch lifts.

But the bandana-tied Kolekar was at his best in clean and jerk as he lifted 157kg in his third attempt for a total of 272kg and registered two

national records in the process.

Going neck-and-neck with 152kgs each after two rounds, Kolekar increased the weight by 5kgs in the final round and sealed the gold. Gururaja also attempted 157kg but in vain.

Another Maharashtra lifter Sanket Sargar shattered three national records (108kgs+135kgs, 243kgs total) and bettered the total by two kgs to clinch the men's 55kg gold.

# 4 Indian cyclists to travel to Portugal for bike challenge

New Delhi, Feb 4: Four Indian cyclists, part of the Hero Action Team, will be travelling to Portugal to race at the Algarve Bike Challenge on February 7.

The UCI category 2 cycling race will host some of the finest riders from across the world in a three-day mountain biking extravaganza on the southern coast of Portugal. The race will witness participation of over 1100 cyclists from 16 countries.

The Hero Action Team cyclists - Akshit Gaur (20), Ashish Sherpa (18), Akash Sherpa (22) and David Kumar (25)

- will be pairing up to make two teams for their participation.

Ashish Sherpa, youngest of the four, has already made a dent in the Indian mountain biking scene. Back in 2017, he finished 3rd at the Indian National Championship. He won the best Asian Rider at Hero MTB Himalaya, and finished in the Top 5 at the Darling Brew Extreme in South Africa.

His elder brother Akash will be racing his maiden international race.

Akshit, 19, is a student of Punjab University. He started cycling 5 years ago,

when he got to know about mountain biking as a sport from a school program by HASTPA. He is a double gold medalist in the Junior National Championship. He is also the youngest Indian to participate in an International MTB race.

David Kumar is the first human to take his bike to the Holy rock in Kinner Kailash. He has multiple podium victories under his belt at Hero MTB Shimla and Hero MTB Himalaya.

This is the second time cyclists from India will be racing at the event.

# Fed Cup tennis putoff for three weeks

New Delhi, Feb 4: The Fed Cup competition, which was moved out of China and scheduled to begin from Tuesday in Kazakhstan, has been postponed for three weeks due to the outbreak of Coronavirus.

The Asia/Oceania Group I event was originally scheduled to be hosted by the city of Dongguan in China from February 4-8. According to All India Tennis Association (AITA), the ITF has confirmed the postponement of the tournament after the government of Kazakhstan prohibited the organization of international sports events due to the threat of coronavirus outbreak.
