Indigenous Assamese get land rights

PM Modi lands in poll-bound Assam amid anti-CAA, anti-NRC clamour

SIVASAGAR: Reaching out to the indigenous people of election-bound Assam amid frequent anti-CAA protests, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday distributed land ownership certificates to over 1 lakh such families, insisting the move will guarantee them "pride, freedom and protection".



On his first physical visit outside the national capital this year, Modi reaffirmed the state and the central government's commitment to protecting the land rights and the unique cultural traditions of the indigenous people.

He castigated the previous governments for depriving them of their land rights for years since Independence.

"When the Sarbananda Sonowal government took over the reins in Assam, over 6 lakh indigenous families had no legal rights over their land. In the last few years over 2 lakh such families have

been allotted ownership certificates. "With more than 1 lakh families added today, the government has shown its commitment to protecting the rights of the indigenous people," Modi said.

The previous governments in Assam never cared for the rights of those who "loved this sacred land", he alleged.

"The land ownership certificates (pat-tas) will guarantee their 'Swabhiman'

(pride), Swadheenta (freedom) and Suraksha (protection)," the prime minister asserted. As Modi spoke at the function in Sivasagar, the historical capital of the Asom kings, anti-CAA and anti-NRC protests were staged at several places in Assam. The PM, however, steered clear of the controversies and made no mention of the issues in his speech.

He asserted the BJP-led government is committed protecting the land, language and culture of the indigenous people of Assam. The PM said the development of Assam and the North East was fundamental to his government's 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' mission.

Modi said since the central government was led by former PM AB Vajpayee, the present NDA government has been according top priority to the development of Assam and other northeastern states.

With 'blood bond' RaGa hits campaign trail in Tamil Nadu

Hitting the campaign trail in Western Tamil Nadu ahead of upcoming Assembly poll, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Saturday sought to strike a "blood relationship" with people, taking on the Modi Government at the Centre.



"You have given my grandmother (Indira Gandhi) and father (Rajiv Gandhi) so much love and affection I am indebted to you. My relationship with you is not political but it is a blood relationship. That is why I want to help you have a government that respects Tamils and takes the state on the path of the development," he told multiple gatherings in Coimbatore and Tiruppur, both industrial towns.

At an interaction with entrepreneurs from the medium, small and minor enterprises (MSMEs), Rahul sought to drive home the

point the foundation of economic growth in India is diversity. "The notion the PM has that you can reduce diversity and grow faster, is ignorance, it is lack of understanding and lack of respect. They think power should be centralised, one man should control everything, one organisation should control everything," he said, adding, "but you cannot have an economy without diversity."

Stating the erstwhile Congress-led UPA government conceptualised the GST as one minimum tax, he accused the BJP government of "superimposing GST." He

favoured its restructuring. The Congress MP, who if a recent survey is to be believed, is preferred as a national leader in Tamil Nadu than Modi, rhetorically asked, "You have seen pictures of PM with large industries. Have you seen pictures of the PM with MSMEs?"

During the Covid-19 pandemic, the government should have certain provisions that make GST more benign, he felt. Charging the Modi govt of not respecting Tamils, he said the Congress wanted to help the people get a government that recognised the Tamil self-respect.

"Tamil Nadu that had shown the way for the rest of the country in industrialisation had now fallen backwards. There was a lot the country learnt from the state. But that is not the case. That is why Tamil Nadu needs a new thinking and new government," Rahul said.

Let's have a duel: Amit Shah slams vaccine critics

GUWAHATI

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Saturday lambasted those who have been criticising the efficacies of Covid-19 vaccines, saying that there should be no politics on public health.

At a function in Guwahati to extend the benefit of the central health insurance to the armed police forces by launching 'Ayushman CAPF', Shah urged the personnel to get inoculated when their turn comes. "There are people spreading misinformation on vaccine. Come to another platform and let's have a duel. But why are you creating doubt over people's health and doing politics? There are other issues for that," he said.

Shah said the vaccines developed by Indian scientists are safe and the men from all forces will be vaccinated after health workers are covered. "I appeal to all of you to go for the vaccine when your turn comes. Do not have any doubt about its efficacy."

Postwoman's hubby sells off Aadhaar card bundles to scrap dealer

The tipsy husband of a temporary postal employee sold valuable postal articles, including Aadhaar cards and

bank, insurance records along with old newspapers to a scrap dealer to make money for another shot for the road. The unusual event came to light when a bundle of Aadhaar cards was discovered at the scrap dealer's yard in Kattakkada near here on Saturday.

The startling discovery was made when the scrap dealer was sorting his wares. The envelopes containing the Aadhaar cards had not even

been opened. Also recovered by records issued by banks and insurance companies as well as documents from the registration office. The startled scrap dealer informed the police. A thorough search of the place yielded bundles and bundles of valuable documents, ready to be recycled into pulp. The papers carried all different addresses.

Police initially suspected that the Aadhaar cards

might have been forged and was exploring the sabotage angle, when further probed to the lady postal employee. On questioning, she admitted her drunkard husband had sold the postal articles along with the old newspapers to the scrap dealer.

The police registered a case, but let off the couple after questioning, saying they would be booked if anybody came forward to claim any of the documents was missing.

PM, MAMATA HAVE A SILENT SLUGFEST...

In a rare joint appearance with PM Modi, the CM refused to speak as chants of 'Jai Sri Ram' was heard from the audience. "I am insulted as it is not any political rally. It is a government programme to celebrate the birth anniversary of Netaji. After calling me such an insult was not expected. I will not speak at this event," said Banerjee, thanking the PM for attending the event. The PM referred to Mamata Banerjee as his 'behen' (sister).

Earlier in day, she had lashed out at the Centre over the naming of Netaji's birth anniversary as "Parakram Diwas". She had urged the Centre to declare it as a National Holiday and also 'Desh Nayak Diwas' as Rabindranath Tagore had bestowed the title of Desh Nayak on Netaji.

BJP IT cell chief Amit Malviya took to Twitter and alleged that Banerjee had 'insulted' the memory of Netaji and that 'Bengal will not tolerate this disregard of its icons'.

BJP Bengal observer Kailash Vijayvargiya mentioned that after Rabindranath Tagore Mamata Banerjee had 'insulted' Netaji.

The PM inaugurated postal stamps and a dedicated galleries 'Nirbhik Subhas' (Fearless Subhas) and 'Biplabi Bharat' to celebrate 125th birth anniversary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. The PM also said that once Netaji wanted to go to Delhi to free India and today Delhi is coming to Kolkata to celebrate the birthday of the biggest Saint.

Didi wants four capitals

She added that Kolkata should also be another capital state. Slamming the Central government for calling January 23 as 'Parakram Diwas', Mamata claimed that neither she nor anyone from Netaji's family was consulted. "Nobel laureate Rabindranath Tagore called Netaji Deshnayak. This is the reason we call it Desh Nayak Diwas. Netaji should be understood with emotions. There are few people who love their motherland as much as Netaji. We all know about Netaji's birthday but are unaware about his death," mentioned the West Bengal Chief Minister.

Taking further potshots at the BJP government, Mamata questioned why did the Central government close the planning Commission that was conceptualized by Netaji himself. "We don't politicise Netaji. We are in touch with Netaji's family all around the year. But some just want to take Netaji's name just because the election is nearing. The Centre has dissolved Netaji's planning commission. It must be recovered. Now the central government doesn't listen to anyone. They are destroying the federal structure," further added Mamata.

Mamata also said that a monument, named after Azad Hind Fauj, will be built in Rajarhat area and a state-funded university, which is also being set up, will be dedicated to Netaji.

"A monument, named after Azad Hind Fauj, will be built at Rajarhat. A university named after Netaji is also being set up which shall be funded entirely by the state, and will have tie-ups with foreign universities," added the Chief Minister before starting the 'Padyatra' towards Red Road to garland another statue of Subhas Chandra Bose.

BMC keen to bring meal on wheels in...

He added, "There are at least three to four streets in each of the 24 wards in the city where informal and unchecked Khau Gallis exist and some of these stalls operate from late night to the wee hours, many of these stalls are illegal and unhygienic. Once the street food hubs are set up, things will be uniform and clean. Those willing to set up stalls in these food hubs will have to apply for the same and follow the rules. Following this licensed food trucks and stalls will be allotted fixed pitches and existing places will be upgraded."

The civic body has almost decided on a fixed time window for food hubs in tourist areas or public places. However, the civic officials are thinking of allowing these food hubs to remain open from morning to evening in commercial hubs and office areas like Nariman Point, Fort, Lower Parel and a few others. An official said, "We will set stringent norms for the stalls and food trucks that will be allotted pitches at these food hubs. They will have to ensure they clean up the place before the shut shop."

Civic officials claim that the initiative will not only add to the revenue of BMC coffers but also generate employment.

Centre yields to farmers' tractor parade...

Samyukt Kisan Morcha leader Darshan Pal and Swaraj India leader Yogendra Yadav announced that they have received the police nod on the final route and the exact route of their tractor parade will be decided before Sunday morning. They said the tractor parades will start from three protest points at Tikri, Singhu and Ghazipur borders. "We are working out details of the route with the police," Pal said, adding that police have agreed to remove the barricades for the smooth rollout of the farmers' parade. "Farmers will take out 'Kisan Gantantra Parade' (Farmer Republic Parade) on January 26. Barricades will be opened and we will enter Delhi. We (farmers and Delhi Police) have reached an agreement on the route, final details are to be worked out tonight," Yadav said. "We will take out a historical and peaceful parade and it will have no effect on the R-Day parade or the security arrangements."

The details will be finalised Saturday night, said farmer leader Abhimanyu Kohar, after attending a meeting between the unions and the police. He said this would be the farmers' show that they would not yield until the government agrees to repeal the three laws. Another farmer leader Gurnam Singh Chaduni of the Bharatiya Kisan Union said thousands of farmers on their way from various states to join the parade and hence there will not be a single route. All leaders appealed to the farmers participating in the parade to maintain discipline and follow instructions of the committee.

Avian flu confirmed in 9 states for poultry birds

NEW DELHI: The Central government on Saturday informed that avian influenza or bird flu has been confirmed in nine states for poultry birds and in 12 states for crow, migratory and wild birds till January 23.

"Till January 23, 2021 outbreaks of Avian Influenza (bird flu) have been confirmed in 9 States (Kerala, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Uttarakhand, Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh and Punjab) for poultry birds and in 12 states (Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Himachal Pradesh, Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Delhi, Rajasthan, Jammu and Kashmir and Punjab) for Crow/Migratory/ Wild birds," informed the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying.

The ministry said the samples of crow and pigeon submitted from Rudraprayag, Lansdowne Forest Range and Paudi Forest Range of Uttarakhand, pigeon samples from Sriganaganagar district of Rajasthan, crow and peacock samples from UP's Fatehpur have been found negative for avian influenza.

Control and Containment Operations (Cleaning and

disinfection) are going on in the affected epicenters of Maharashtra, MP, Chhattisgarh, Punjab, UP, Gujarat, Uttarakhand and Kerala. Compensation is paid to farmers whose poultry birds, eggs and poultry feed are culled/disposed of by the state as per the action plan.

"The Dept of Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Government of India provides funds to states / UTs on a 50:50 sharing basis under Assistance to States for control of animal diseases component of its Livestock Health and Disease Control Scheme," the ministry said.

Gujarat: Samples of 10 dead poultry birds test positive

Samples of 10 dead poultry birds from Dolasa village in Gujarat's Gir Somnath district have tested positive for avian influenza, officials said. This is the first case in Gujarat where poultry birds have tested positive for the infection. Earlier, samples of some wild birds had tested positive for the flu in few districts of the state. "Ten samples of poultry birds (chicken) tested positive for avian influenza, following which 220 birds in three backyard farms in the village were culled," a senior official said.

BSY clamps down on illegal mining

Rattled by the explosion at a stone crushing unit in his home district and the criticism by the Opposition, Karnataka Chief Minister BS Yediyurappa on Saturday clamped down on illegal quarrying or mining across the state.

"I will not allow illegal quarrying or mining for any reason. Those who want to do quarrying or mining should get a licence for it. Doing it illegally will lead to such incidents. I will direct Deputy Commissioners to take strict measures in this direction," the CM told the media.

"I'm going for spot inspection. Our Deputy Commissioner (of the district), Member of Parliament and Mines Minister have already visited the spot. I will get to know things from them and take necessary action to stop illegal quarrying or mining and find out why the truck was there at the time of the explosion," he said.

Women army officers move SC again for permanent commission, promotions

NEW DELHI: 11 women army officers have moved the SC seeking compliance of its February last year directions to the Centre for grant of permanent commission, promotions and consequential benefits to them "in an inclusive, fair, just and reasonable manner". In a plea, Lt Col Ashu Yadav and 10 other women Army officers alleged the directions were not being complied with in "letter and spirit". The procedures for grant of permanent commission is "vitiating with arbitrariness, unfairness and unreasonableness", they alleged.
