# Truly feels like living in 'divya' Ayodhya, say residents



Saints and seers at the Shri Ram Temple consecration in Ayodhya on Monday

**Ayodhya:** As a festive spirit prevailed in Ayodhya, there was an emotional outpouring among residents of the holy city as the consecration of the new idol of Ram Lalla was held on Monday and said they indeed feel they are living in a 'divya' (divine) Ayodhya, 'navya' (new) Ayodhya and 'bhavya' (grand) Ayodhya.

Krishnanath Singh, a school teacher and a regular morning walker to the Ram temple, said the temple is three kilometres from his house. "Now our Ayodhya has become a 'divya' Ayodhya, 'navya' Ayodhya and 'bhavya' Ayodhya," Singh told PTI, as his voice choked with emotions. Controlling the sudden outpour of emotions, he said, "This is a historic day for each and every resident of not only Ayodhya or Uttar Pradesh but also for the entire country as our Ram Lalla has got the rightful place which he deserves. The day is very special for me, as personally I had

seen the struggle of the karsevaks from a very close quarter." "The karsevaks from Andhra Pradesh and Nagpur used to reach from Ayodhya to Mirzapur through our village in Ambedkar Nagar district. Our job was to ensure that none of the karsevaks went hungry. As I recall the scenes of the 1990s and witness today's event, I feel relieved that the efforts put by my family have finally yielded positive results," said Singh, who was near the Lata Mangeshkar Chowk.

Expressing happiness over the consecration ceremony, Yashendra Pratap Singh, a resident of Khajurhat area of Ayodhya told PTI, "There is immense happiness among the people, as they feel that their 'tapasya' (penance) for Ram temple at Ram Janmabhoomi in Ayodhya has given pleasant and wonderful results."

"In the morning, the Shiva temple in the area was cleaned and a number of events like

recitation of Sundar Kand followed by 'prasaad' distribution were lined up for the day," he said, and added that the entire area is soaked in devotion to Lord Ram.

Shailesh Singh, a resident of Balapakauli, said, "All of us are feeling very good and a sense of pride is evident. As a resident of Ayodhya, for a long time we wanted a grand and divine temple of Lord Ram to be built. We have also become a part of it now. As a resident of the temple town of Ayodhya, we are ready to welcome guests from far and wide to our city. This is a 'divya' Ayodhya, a 'navya' Ayodhya and a 'bhavya' Ayodhya. Now, our city has been established in the global arena in a new form," he said.

Echoing similar sentiments, Lavkush Srivastava, a resident of Kaushalpur Colony of Ayodhya, said, "Today, we are seeing an Ayodhya, which is divine, new and grand."

January 22 will be a historic date for every resident of

Ayodhya, he said, and added that he would cherish this moment for the rest of his life.

Anshuman Singh, who is pursuing PhD from KS Saket PG College, Ayodhya, told PTI over the phone, "This is a moment of pride for me, for my family and for all of us. I feel proud that this temple has been made at the rightful place. I also feel equally proud that now, I am able to see a divine, new and grand Ayodhya."

Anil Singh, a resident of the temple town, said, "I feel this is certainly a priceless moment for me and I am going to treasure this day forever in my life. Secondly, I feel proud that I am residing in this spiritual city."

Satyam Dubey, an MA second-year student, said, "January 22 has become a day which will always remain memorable in the history of Ayodhya. I feel that the day will always make us feel proud."

A visibly excited Prajwal Singh, who lives near Tulsi

Udyan in Ayodhya, told PTI, "This is perhaps the happiest day in my life. It is a historic day in the life of each and every 'Ayodhya' and even the 'Vishwavaasi'. Seeing the temple getting completed in front of my eyes makes me emotional and at times tears roll down."

Himanshu Varma, a resident of Nirmochan Chauraha, could not control his tears as the 'Pran Pratishtha' ritual was complete. "As soon as the ritual was complete, I hugged my elder brother. This prompted my family members to say that there is Ram-Bharat 'milaap' (meeting) in the 'Kal Yug'," said Varma, who witnessed the celebrations unfold at the Ram ki Paidi. Similar views were also expressed by Aashu Dixit and Sitaram Pandey, both residents of Naya Ghat area of Ayodhya, who feel that the temple town has become "a 'divya' Ayodhya, a 'navya' Ayodhya and a 'bhavya' Ayodhya".

## Ram Temple Trust unveils guidelines for Ramopasana

The Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust has released detailed worship guidelines of Ram Lalla after the consecration ceremony and they will come into effect from January 23.

The guidelines have been named Shri Ramopasana.

Trust general secretary Champat Rai has outlined the procedures, providing insight into the intricate preparations and rituals that will form the daily routine at this revered temple. The worship rituals are set to commence promptly at 3 am each morning, marking the beginning of a day devoted to spiritual practices. Ram Lalla will 'wake up' at 4 o'clock, initiating a sequence of sacred observances.

The tradition of performing aarti five times a day, established in the temple's past, will be continued in the future also. As per the prescribed code, Ram Lalla will be offered fruits and milk at hourly inter-

vals, underscoring a continuous engagement in divine rituals.

"The temple gates will remain open for devotees from 8 am to 10 pm every day. In anticipation of an influx of devotees post the Pran Pratishtha ceremony, the temple management is contemplating extending the darshan duration to 14-15 hours," Rai said. Ram Temple priest Satyendra Das said that Ram Lalla would wear dress of different colour corresponding to the day of the week. "The tradition dating back to 1949 when Shri Ram Lalla first appeared will continue even in his new abode," Das said.

Ram Lalla will don white attire on Monday, red on Tuesday, green on Wednesday, yellow on Thursday, light yellow or cream on Friday, blue on Saturday and pink on Sunday.

The new 'Balroop' idol, a significant addition to the temple, will don clothes prepared on handloom by the Heritage and Handweaving Revival Charitable Trust of Pune. As

many as 10-15 lakh artisans from across the country have contributed to the weaving process. The chief priest said that following the completion of Pran Pratishtha ceremony on January 23, the temple will enter a phase of purification, worship and embellishment starting at 3 pm in the Brahma muhurat.

Around 3:30 to 4 pm, the idols and Shri Yantra of the Lord will be awakened through sacred mantras, culminating in the Mangala aarti. Subsequently, consecration and adornment ceremonies will unfold, followed by the Shringar aarti from 4:30 to 5 pm.

The daily darshan schedule will commence at 8 am, with a mid-day Bhog aarti around 1 pm. After a two-hour break for divine rest, darshan will resume from 3 pm and continue till 10 pm. The evening aarti will take place at 7 pm, weaving a spiritual tapestry of devotion and reverence at the grand Ram Temple in Ayodhya.

## Consecration ceremony held under strict security cover

During the Pran Pratishtha of Ram Lalla in the newly-built temple, Ayodhya was transformed into an impenetrable fortress with extensive security arrangements at every corner. Commandos armed with machine guns and AK-47s stood vigilant, overseeing the city's security, while surveillance was enhanced through a network of CCTV cameras and helicopters.

The city's borders were sealed and were accessible only to those holding invitations for the Pran Pratishtha and the necessary passes. Commandos and vehicles with blaring sirens patrolled the roads, ensuring strict control over the city as the consecration ceremony continued in the Ram Temple.

As many as 60 chartered planes of VVIP guests landed at Ayodhya's new airport. After the passengers disembarked, the planes were parked in airports within a 1,000-kilometre range. To accommodate the

limited parking capacity in Ayodhya, reserved spaces were allocated at 12 airports in five states - Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh and Uttarakhand.

From the security standpoint, Ayodhya was divided into 10 zones and 26 sectors. The Ram Mandir, Hanuman Garhi and Sarayu Ghat formed the Super Zone with heightened security protocols. Stringent measures, including crash-rated bollards, under-vehicle scanners, tire killers and boom barriers were in place to prevent any suspicious thing from reaching the Ram Temple. Special teams, including the Special Task Force and Anti-Terror Squad commandos, managed and oversaw these security devices.

Given that visitors to Ayodhya often extend their visit to the Sarayu Ghat and Hanuman Garhi, both areas were included in the Super Zone, protected by a 7-layer security set-up.

Aerial surveillance was

conducted around the temple premises using helicopters, with strict restrictions imposed on drones, airplanes or choppers passing over the temple.

The security of Maharishi Valmiki International Airport in Ayodhya was entrusted to the National Security Guard (NSG) and Central Industrial Security Force (CISF). Thorough verification of houses along the routes taken by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and other VVIP guests was done, with security personnel stationed on all rooftops.

The magnitude of the security measures was evident from the temporary suspension of train services in and out of Ayodhya. The railway administration diverted or cancelled all trains bound for Ayodhya, citing construction on the platforms as the reason.

## Krishna's home Mathura celebrates Ram Lalla's Pran Pratishtha

**Mathura:** From Sunder Kand recitals to sand art decorations, the consecration ceremony at Ayodhya's Ram temple is being celebrated with great fervour here with over 700 temples decked up to mark the occasion.

All major intersections of Mathura, home to the Krishna Janmasthan Temple, have been decorated and 'bhandaras' (community kitchen) have been set up in many parts of the city. At the Radha-Krishna mandir inside the temple complex, the idols were given the appearance of Lord Ram and Sita, said Kapil Sharma, secretary of Shri Krishna Janmabhoomi Seva Sansthan.

The idol of Lord Krishna at the Banke Bihari Temple held a bow and arrow, besides

the standard flute, in a nod to the 'pran pratishtha' of 'Ram Lalla' in Ayodhya. Thakur Dwarkaadhish Temple has been decorated with lights and lamps would be donated in the evening. 'Prasad' was distributed at the temple from 10 am to 11 am.

Sunder Kand recitals were held and devotees sang songs in the morning at the Keshavdev Temple, which was festooned for the occasion. The Govardhan intersection (Atal Chowk) drew a huge crowd for a sand art of Ram temple - the creation of artist Sameer from Jhansi.

At Deorha Ghat and Kanha Gausala, sand art of the temple and Lord Ram were created by artists from Odisha using sand from the Yamuna, said Gopal

Vashishtha, tax inspector at the Vrindavan office of the municipal corporation. Customers have been swarming the markets for the past two days. Earthen lamps, other lighting devices, flags etc. have been sold in abundance. A 'deepotsav' will be held at Devraha Baba Ghat at 4 pm while various cultural programmes have been planned at Jugal Ghat, which has been bedecked with a 'rangoli' made with 500 kg flowers, said a senior district administration official. District Magistrate Shailesh Kumar Singh and Senior Superintendent of Police Shailesh Kumar Pandey said that consecration ceremony-related events are being organised in about 700 temples in the district. Security has been

tightened in the city with heavy police deployment. Hotels, ashrams and guest houses are being checked and the city is being monitored by drones, officials said. The police force was alert in the city and special security arrangements have been made, SSP Pandey said.

The SSP said that only local residents are allowed entry on the route leading to Shahi Idgah. Relatives of locals are being given entry after inquiry, he said, adding that the security at other temples, including Banke Bihari Temple, has also been increased. The new Ram Lalla idol was consecrated at the Ayodhya temple on Monday, an event led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
