Data Tampering: Third Party Collectors Liable for Penalty

New Delhi: Third party agencies involved in the data collection work for key statistics would be liable for penalty if they tamper with the data on a par with government data collectors, officials said. The move is aimed at enhancing accountability of third party data collectors and quality of data.

The ministry of statistics and programme implementation (MOSPI) has proposed a data ombudsman for in-house resolution of issues related to the collection of statistics to reduce the number of cases that need legal recourse, and the wide range of the ombudsman is proposed as the field work for the ongoing economic census and various National Sample Surveys is being done using outsourced staff.

"The entire cycle of data collection, even third parties to which the collection work is outsourced, will come under the ombudsman," said an official.

Industry body warns American nationals against travelling to India.

The US Department of State-Bureau of Consular Affairs has a level 4—highest level of risk rating—for travel to India due to the Covid-19 situation.

Industry bodies are of the view that the advisory could make things difficult for India as it kickstarts travel with limited markets.

Industry body Federation of Associations in Indian Tourism and Hospitality (FIATIH) said on a scale of 1-4, this is the highest risk rating and the countries reflecting in this category as on August 23 included Syria, Iran, Pakistan, Iraq and Yemen. "This is perceptually extremely

"The outsourcing agents will be equally bound and liable for penalty under the Act if they tamper with the data," the official added. There is no dearth of digital devices and need to convey that we are safer than many countries," said Subhash Gosai, secretary general at FIATIH.

Chander Mairishurvarman, former vice chairman of India Convention Promotion Bureau (ICPPB), said the move will negatively hit travel for business and professional commitments to India. "Most European countries follow US travel advisories for their updates. This will have an impact on travel for MICE (meetings, incentives, conferences, exhibitions) as India looks at restarting tourism," he added.

We would request you to urgently take it up with minister of external affairs Dr Subrahmanyam Jaishankar for him to take it up with his American counterpart for an immediate revision," he added.

Only 8 States Meet Extra Borrowing Conditions: SBI

New Delhi: Only eight states meet all the conditions set by the central bank to raise additional borrowing, according to a report by SBI Research on Monday.

Many of the remaining states are likely to face financial stress due if they are unable to borrow more or seek additional support by other means. The eight states are Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana and Gujarat. In May, as part of the Atmanirbhar Bharat package, the centre had permitted states to borrow up to 2% of their gross state domestic product over and above the existing 3% limit. This additional room was, however, subject to the states implementing certain reforms such as universalisation of One Nation-One Ration Card, measures to improve ease of doing business, and measures relating to power distribution and urban local body reforms.
