# India, Bangladesh to enhance counter-terrorism cooperation

**NEW DELHI:** In a virtual meet of police chiefs of India and Bangladesh emphasis was laid on enhancing counter-terrorism cooperation especially against global terror groups. As a step towards that, designated 'nodal points' would be established for timely and effective handling and response to existing as well as emerging security and counter-terrorism

challenges. In the first delegation-level virtual Police Chiefs' Dialogue both sides agreed to enhance cooperation against terrorist entities including global terrorist groups, and other fugitives, wherever they are present and active. Both sides also reiterated the need for sharing real time intelligence and feedback through the designated 'nodal points'.

## FAST NEWS

### No wait till July for DA/DR hike

The central government may soon bring cheers to its staff and pensioners to restore the dearness allowance (DA) and dearness relief (DR) respectively this month itself instead of the earlier decision on a freeze till July. Sources in the Finance Ministry said the government is contemplating to end the wait imposed due to the Covid-19 pandemic in view of an improvement in the economic activities in the country. It means the employees will get a hike of 28% in DA and DR with effect from January 1, 2021, in accordance with the accepted formula based on the recommendations of the 7th Pay Commission. There are 48.34 lakh employees and 65.26 lakh pensioners who will benefit. —Our Bureau

### 26 child labourers rescued; 7 nabbed for trafficking

Seven people were arrested in Hyderabad for allegedly trafficking 26 children from different states and engaging them as labourers, police said on Tuesday. Based on information that children in the age group of 12 to 17 were detained and engaged as labourers, police teams conducted raids at various places on Monday and rescued 23 boys and 3 girls, they said. The rescued children belong to Chhattisgarh, UP, Maharashtra, Jharkhand, West Bengal and Telangana. Rachakonda Commissioner of Police Mahesh M Bhagwat said. All the children were trafficked by the owners/accused.

### Nizam's jewel tax: Kin for settlement

Family members of 11th Nizam Mir Osman Ali Khan have urged the government of India to resolve the Nizam Jewellery Trust income and wealth tax issue pending for last 26 years. Nizam's grandson Najaf Ali Khan told IANS on Tuesday that he has written to Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman to resolve the issue as most of the beneficiaries of the trust are senior citizens facing health and financial problems. Many of the beneficiaries have expired, he said. Khan, who is the president of Nizam Family Welfare Association, said despite their cooperation with the income tax department by submitting requisite information sought from time to time, the issue remained unresolved.

### Now, lady pilots in Army's aviation wing

In a major move, the Army has decided to induct women as pilots in its aviation wing and the first batch is likely to be admitted for training in July.

## FARMERS WELCOME SC STAY ON CONTENTIOUS LAWS BUT...

# NO LET-UP IN PROTESTS

AGENCIES / New Delhi

Farmer leaders welcomed the Supreme Court's order to stay the implementation of the 3 farm laws on Tuesday, but said they would not call off their protest until the legislations are repealed.

The Sankhyukt Kisan Morcha, an umbrella body of 40 protesting farmer unions, has called a meeting later in the day to decide the future course. The farm leaders said they are not willing to take part in any proceedings before a committee appointed by the SC, but a formal decision on this will be taken by the Morcha. "We welcome the court's order to stay the implementation of the farm laws, but we want a complete repeal of these laws," Abhimanyu Kohar, a senior leader of the Morcha, told PTI.

Another farmer leader, Harinder Lokhwal, said the protest will continue until the contentious farm laws are repealed.

### Police detain YC activists near Tomar's residence

The Indian Youth Congress (IYC) on Tuesday said its members were detained by police after they tried to stage a protest near Union Agriculture Minister Narendra Tomar's residence here against the Centre's farm laws. IYC president Srinivas B and many other activists were taken to Connaught Place police station. Many

other activists were detained and taken to other police stations, Rahul Rao, national media in-charge of IYC, said.

The IYC activists who assembled at Kamraj Marg were stopped by police as they tried to march towards Tomar's residence on Krishna Menon Marg. Raising slogans against the Modi government, they tried to cross a barricade following which they were detained by police.

### Centre must repeal laws or BJP-JJP alliance in Haryana will pay heavily: JJP MLAs

The Centre should repeal the three farm laws or it will cost the ruling BJP-JJP alliance in Haryana "heavily", a section of JJP MLAs said on Tuesday, hours before their party chief and Dy CM Dushyant Chautala meets Union Home Minister Amit Shah in New Delhi.

The Centre should rollback the laws as farmers of Haryana, Punjab and the country are up in arms against the legislations, JJP MLA Jogi Ram Sihag said.

"We will request Dushyant ji to convey our feelings to Amit Shah ji," he said.

Before meeting Shah, Chautala will meet his party MLAs. "I have nothing to do with the JJP (meeting), not going to Delhi, the sentiment in Haryana is against the farm laws and it will cost ruling BJP-JJP alliance heavily in coming days," JJP MLA Ram Kumar Gautam said.

## Hoping for amicable solution through talks: Army chief on Ladakh standoff

India needs to be prepared for China-Pak collusive threat

**NEW DELHI:** Army chief Gen MM Naravane on Tuesday hoped for an amicable resolution of the military standoff with China in Ladakh through talks based on "mutual and equal security" even as he said India will have to be prepared to deal with a "two-front" threat scenario due to the potent and collusive threat from China and Pakistan. Gen Naravane asserted Indian troops are fully prepared to deal with any eventuality along the LAC and will hold their ground as long as it takes to achieve the "national goals and objectives."

The Chief of Army Staff was addressing a news conference here ahead of the Army Day (Jan 15). He said through talks with China, India is trying to reach a solution that is "acceptable and not detrimental" to the national interests, adding "if the talks get prolonged, so be it."

On rising security challenges at the LAC, he said a need was felt about "rebalancing" of troops along the northern borders and subsequently steps have been taken to put adequate focus on the borders with China. "I am sure through dialogue and

I am stressed too. Stress is not a bad thing," Gen MM Naravane said in a lighter vein, dismissing a recently reported survey claiming more than half of Indian Army men seem to be under severe stress. He said the report was based on an inadequate sample size of 400. Several steps were being taken to reduce stress among the personnel, and noted the number of suicides in the force has been coming down. "Based on a sample of 400, we can not say there is stress or no stress. There could be stress. I am stressed too. Stress is not a bad thing. It can result in good work."

About overall security challenges facing India, he said, "There is no doubt Pakistan and China together form a very potent threat and there is an aspect of collusivity which cannot be wished away. That is also very much part of our strategic planning and calculus when we are formulating our plans."

### Teen gang-raped, murdered in UP

**ALIGARH:** The body of a girl, who was allegedly gang-raped and then killed, was recovered from near railway tracks in the Gandhi Park area here, police said on Tuesday. They said efforts are on to nab the 3 accused.

According to police, the girl student, aged 15-16 years, had gone missing from her house in a village under the Harduaganj police station area on Sunday morning. Later, her family received a message she has been kidnapped, demanding Rs5 lakh as ransom for her release.

The kidnappers warned if the money was not paid, a video showing the victim in a compromising position would be posted on social media, police said.

According to the complaint by the girl's family at Gandhi Park police station on Monday, they were unable to raise the money and were desperately trying to search for her when they were asked by police to identify a dead body of a girl which was found several kms away from their village along the railway tracks.

**Girl gang-raped in Ranchi** A 13-year-old girl was gang-raped by 2 persons in Ranchi, police said on Tuesday. The girl had gone to a shop to buy some goods on Monday evening when the two allegedly abducted and gang-raped her.

## For now, C-vax recipients can't choose from 2 options: Govt

NEW DELHI: The government hinted on Tuesday for now, the Covid-19 vaccine recipients will not have the option to choose from the two vaccines recently approved for restricted emergency use in India.

Replying to a question at a press conference in Delhi, Union health secretary Rajesh Bhushan said, "At many places in the world, more than one vaccine are being administered, but presently, in no country, vaccine recipients have the option of choosing the shots."

India recently approved two vaccines for the viral disease for restricted emergency use -- Oxford University's Covishield and Bharat Biotech's Covaxin.

Bhushan said there will be a gap of 28 days between two doses of the Covid-19 vaccine and its effectiveness can be seen only after 14 days. "So we urge people to keep following Covid appropriate behaviour," he said.

### Bihar receives 1st batch of 55k jobs

**LAW KUMAR MISHRA / PATNA:** It was a traffic-free movement for the 3 refrigerated mini-trucks from Patna's JP International airport to Nalanda Medical College Hospital as the first consignment of Covishield vaccine reached here on Tuesday noon. The 12.5-km road between the airport and the hospital was available for smooth movement of the 3 vehicles escorted by the police. The vehicles carried 54,900 vials with a capacity to vaccinate 10 people from each vial. It was the first consignment from the SII, claimed Mangal Pandey, the Bihar health minister, present at the airport to receive the vaccine's consignment. The Centre has allotted 10 lakh doses for the state quota in the first phase starting Saturday. 4.70 lakh health workers have enrolled themselves as corona warriors to receive the first dose. CM Nitish Kumar will launch the vaccination programme at 1.30am.

### Covishield reaches Kol

**ARITRA SINGHA / KOLKATA:** The first set of vaccine reached Kolkata on Tuesday. The first consignment of Covid-19 vaccine by Serum Institute of India (SII), has around 6.89 lakh vials, which is stored at Central Family Medical store in Kolkata's Bagbazar. Four airlines are operating 9 flights to transport 56.5 lakh doses of the vaccine from Pune to 13 cities across the country on Tuesday, Civil Aviation Minister Hardeep Singh Puri said. Other states that receive the Covid consignments are Karnataka, Telangana (3.64 lakh doses), Delhi and Uttar Pradesh. Meanwhile, the Puducherry CM said the government will administer vaccine free.



## COVID CASES LOWEST IN 7 MONTHS

The coronavirus cases in India further dipped to 12,584, the lowest in the past 7 months and the positivity rate based on daily cases and the tests also dropped to 1.41%, while the actual caseload stood at 2.07% of the total 104.79 lakh and the fatality rate at 1.44%, with 167 deaths in the past 24 hours. The daily new cases were 12,881 on June 18 last year.

The country's Covid recovery rate also went up to 96.49% with 101.11 lakh recovered so far, 18,385 in 24 hours, which is more than the day's cases. India's recovery rate is among the highest in the world. The death toll of the country rose to 1,51,327. As many as 25 of the 35 states and UTs have less than 5,000 active

cases. The total number of persons found positive with the UK variant strain of Covid-19 is 96, with no addition in the last 24 hours.

Maharashtra recorded the highest 40 deaths in 24 hours, followed by Kerala 20, West Bengal 16, Chhattisgarh 15 and Delhi 13. Maharashtra also reported maximum single-day recoveries of 4,286, followed by 3,922 in Kerala and Chhattisgarh 1,255. Kerala reported the maximum 3,110 daily cases, followed by Maharashtra 2,438 and Chhattisgarh 853.

According to the Indian Council of Medical Research, more than 8.97 lakh tests were conducted during the last 24 hours. The total number of samples tested so far has reached 18.26 crore. —Out Bureau

## 'Spurious' liquor kills 12 in MP

**MORENA/BHOPAL:** Over 12 people died and 7 others were seriously ill after consuming suspected spurious liquor in Madhya Pradesh's Morena, the second such incident in the state within the last three months. As per preliminary reports, some residents of Manpur and Pahawali villages in Morena consumed a white liquor on Monday night, a senior police officer said.

This was the second such incident in MP in 3 months. In October last year, 14 people died after drinking spurious liquor in Ujjain. "12 persons died and seven others seriously fell ill after drinking suspected spurious liquor (in Morena district)," Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Rajesh Hingankar told reporters.



## India at UN: Stop blocks, holds on listing requests

India on Tuesday told the UN Security Council the practice of placing blocks and holds without "any rhyme or reason" on requests to designate terrorists and terror groups

must end, an apparent reference to China which had repeatedly blocked New Delhi's bids to designate Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammed chief Masood Azhar

"We must not countenance double standards in this battle. Terrorists are terrorists; there are no good and bad ones. Those who propagate this distinction have an agenda. And those who cover up for them are just as culpable." External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said.

"Accordingly, we must reform the working methods of the Committees dealing with Sanctions and Counter Terrorism. Transparency, accountability and effectiveness are the need of the day. The practice of placing blocks and holds on listing requests without any rhyme or reason must end. This only erodes our collective credibility," he said.

Jaishankar was speaking at the UNSC Ministerial Meeting on Threats to International peace and security caused by terrorist acts: International cooperation in combating terrorism 20 years after the adoption of resolution 1373 (2001), the first address by Jaishankar to the Security Council after India began its two-year tenure on the 15-nation body this month.
