# INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REVIEW REPORT ON REVIEW OF INTERIM FINANCIAL RESULTS

# TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF FUSION MICRO FINANCE LIMITED

- We have reviewed the accompanying Statement of Unaudited Financial Results of Fusion Micro Finance Limited (the "Company") for the quarter and nine months ended December 31, 2022 (the "Statement"), being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 and Regulation 52 read with Regulation 63(2) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations 2015, as amended.
- 2. This Statement, which is the responsibility of the Company's Management and approved by the Company's Board of Directors, has been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the Indian Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" ("Ind AS 34"), prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the Statement based on our review.
- 3. We conducted our review of the Statement in accordance with the Standard on Review Engagements (SRE) 2410 'Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity', issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI). A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of the Company's personnel responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Standards on Auditing specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.
- 4. Based on our review conducted as stated in paragraph 3 above, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying Statement, prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the aforesaid Indian Accounting Standard and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, has not disclosed the information required to be disclosed in terms of Regulation 33 and Regulation 52 read with Regulation 63(2) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) as amended, including the manner in which it is to be disclosed, or that it contains any material misstatement.



- 5. The comparative financial information of the Company for the quarter and nine months ended December 31, 2021 and for year ended March 31, 2022 prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards included in this Statement have been reviewed/ audited by the predecessor auditor. The report of the predecessor auditor on these comparative financial information dated February 14, 2022, and May 06, 2022 respectively expressed an unmodified conclusion.
- 6. This Statement includes comparative figures for the quarter and nine months ended December 31, 2021, which have been reviewed by predecessor auditor via audit report dated February 14, 2022 which expressed an unmodified conclusion on those financial results. Accordingly, we do not express any conclusion on the comparative figures reported in the financial results for the quarter and nine months ended December 31, 2021.

- The financial results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and upon their recommendation, approved by the Board of
  Directors of Fusion Micro Finance Limited ("the Company") in their respective meeting held on February 11, 2023. The Company
  has prepared these financial results in accordance with the requirement of Regulation 33 and Regulation 52 read with Regulation
  63(2) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and disclosure requirements) Regulations, 2015 ("Listing Regulations, 2015") and the
  accounting standards specified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Companies (Indian Accounting
  Standards) Rules, 2015 as amended ("Ind AS") and relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, as applicable. The results for
  the quarter and nine months ended December 31, 2022 are reviewed by the Statutory Auditors of the Company.
- The Company operates in a single business segment i.e., lending to borrowers, having similar risks and returns for the purpose of Ind AS 108 on 'Operating Segments'. The Company operates in single geographic segment i.e., domestic.
- (i) The Company, during the quarter and nine months ended December 31, 2022, has issued 1,175,701 and 1,228,829 number of
  equity shares respectively, each, fully paid up, on exercise of options by employees, in accordance with the Company's Employee
  Stock Option Scheme(s).
  - (ii) During the quarter ended December 31, 2022, the Company has completed initial public offer (IPO) of 29,999,813 shares of face value of Rs. 10 each at an issue price Rs 368 comprising fresh issue of 1,63,04,347 and offer for sale of 1,36,95,466 by selling shareholders. Pursuant to IPO, shares of Company were listed on National Stock exchange (NSE) and BSE Limited (BSE) on November 15, 2022.

The Company had received an amount of Rs. 5,693.65 million (net off IPO expenses Rs 306.35 million) from proceeds of fresh issue of equity shares. The utilization of the net IPO proceeds is summarized below: -

The effective date from which the changes are applicable is yet to be notified and the rules for quantifying the financial impact are yet to be framed. The Company will assess the impact of the Code when it comes into effect and the rules are framed. The Company will record any related impact on the period the Code becomes effective.
