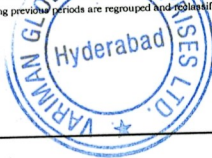

**Report on the Audit of Standalone Financial Results**

**Opinion**

We have audited the accompanying standalone annual financial results of **VARIMAN GLOBAL ENTERPRISES LIMITED (formerly known as Spring Fields Infraventures Limited)** hereinafter referred to as 'the Company' for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2022 ('the Statement'), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ('Listing Regulations').

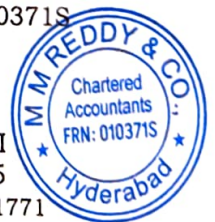
**Other Matters:**

Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matters.

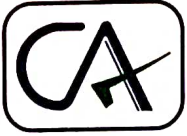

**Opinion**

Our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiaries, and our report in terms of sub-sections (3) and (11) of Section 143 of the Act, in so far as it relates to the aforesaid subsidiaries is based solely on the reports of such other auditors.

The Statement include the results for the quarter ended 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2022 being the balancing figure between the audited figures in respect of the full financial Year and published unaudited year to date figures upto third Quarter of the current financial year prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian accounting standard 34 "Interim financial Reporting" which were subject to limited review by us.
