HP govt to set up panel to address doctors' grievances

Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu has issued a directive to constitute a committee under the chairmanship of the Special Secretary (Health) to address the demands and grievances of medical officers in the state.

The committee will comprise the Director of the Health and Family Welfare Department, the Director of Medical Education, and representatives from the Medical Officers Association. At a meeting held here on Tuesday with the representatives of the Medical Officers Association, the Chief Minister said that this committee would also study the various aspects of doctors' promotions and recommend guidelines for improving the condition of medical officers.

He said that the state government is considering their genuine demands sympathetically but pointed out that the state's financial condition is precarious. "Due to the sincere efforts of the state government, the economy of the state is gradually coming back on track. My government will surely provide the financial benefits of the government employees in due course," he assured. He urged doctors to cooperate with the state government and assist in improving the state's economy. "We are focusing on strengthening the health infrastructure in the state to provide specialised health services to people at their doorsteps," he said, adding that the state government is setting up Adarsh Swasthya Sansthan in all the 68 Assembly constituencies in the state, each equipped with six specialist doctors. The CM assured that the state government is recruiting new medical officers and supporting staff to meet the shortage of doctors and para medical staff in health institutions.

The Delhi High Court on Tuesday formed a committee of experts regarding the reformation/improvement of the health and medical infrastructure of all hospitals of Delhi governed by the Centre Government, Delhi Government and Municipal Corporation of Delhi. The bench of Justice Manmohan and Justice Manmeet Pritam Singh Arora, while passing directions to constitute a committee of experts, stated that, since this health and medical field is an extremely specialized area that requires subject experience and deemed knowledge, we deem it expedient to appoint a committee of experts that shall consider the matter in detail and place their suggestions and recommendations. The court also stated that huge investment, along with structural reforms in the functioning of government hospitals without entering into a blame game, is the need of the hour to come year of neglected apathy, which can only be done if there is consensus on the measures to be adopted both in the short and long run.



The court directed the committee of experts to suggest ways for optimizing the existing resources in the various hospitals located in Delhi owned by the Delhi, central government or MCD. The committee is also to devise a mechanism for the establishment of a control room that will enable the provision of real-time information concerning the availability of ICU beds in the various hospitals and their timely availability for patients. Availability of infrastructure, medicines and adequate manpower in the hospitals for operating/managing high-end equipment and critical care units in various hospitals, court-directed. To reduce the stress on referral hospitals by strengthening the peripheral hospitals located in various districts of Delhi, the end-to-end mechanism for ensuring uninterrupted supply of medicine, injections and consumables in government hospitals, said

the court while seeking committee recommendations on it. The court also asked the committee for a mechanism to fill the vacant posts in hospitals on a contract basis until regular incumbents join through UPSC/DSSB.

Other recommendations, which the committee thinks are fit and proper for the purpose of improving the medical services provided by the hospitals in Delhi to the public at large. The court passed directions while dealing with a suo motu PIL initiated in 2017 regarding the availability of ICU beds and ventilator facilities in government hospitals, stressing the need for medical infrastructure to keep pace with the city's population.

The court earlier showed displeasure with the government of NCT Delhi and concerned departments for the non-availability of adequate health infrastructure in the national capital. The Delhi government suggested on Monday that the

committee should consist of subject matter experts who have wide experience in the field of health infrastructure management and management of critical care units and intensive care units or have a proven track record of working as activists on the issue of health. According to a status report, out of 735 sanctioned posts of non-teaching specialists in Delhi government hospitals, 287 posts, i.e., 39 pc of the total sanctioned posts, are lying vacant. Specialities like radiology, Neurosurgery and medicine, which are essential for managing critical care patients, have more than 50% of sanctioned posts lying vacant. More than one-third of the sanctioned posts of anaesthetists, who are in charge of critical care units, are vacant. Similarly, 282 (21%) sanctioned posts of General Duty Medical Officers (GDMOs) and 25 (61%) sanctioned posts of Dental Surgeons (CAS) are also lying vacant.

HP Budget session from February 14

A day ahead of the commencement of the budget session on February 14, Himachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly Speaker Kuldeep Singh Pathania called an all-party meeting on Tuesday.

The meeting was attended by Parliamentary Affairs Minister Harsh Vardhan Chauhan, Chief Parliamentary Secretary Mohan Lal Brakta from the ruling party and Balveer Singh Verma from the opposition and an independent MLA K.L. Thakur.

Leader of Opposition Jai Ram Thakur could not attend the meeting due to personal reasons and other commitments. However, he informed the Speaker over telephone that he would not attend the meeting and BJP MLA Balbir Singh Verma would his party.

The Speaker held discussion regarding the conduct of the budget session, he appealed to all the members of the ruling party and the opposition to provide constructive cooperation in the functioning of the session. On this occasion, Pathania

said that he is fully aware of his responsibility and requested all the members to extend their full support and make good use of the time and raise issues related to the of the House.

"The Lok Sabha and the Legislative Assembly have their own high tradition and dignity. All the members are requested to participate in the discussion on important topics and try to find solutions through brainstorming," he said.

Detailing about the Governor's address and other topics to be brought in the House on Wednesday, he assured that ample time will be given to the members of the House for discussion on whatever topic is in the public interest and interest of the state.

"So far, a total of 882 questions have been received from the members, out of which 632 are starred and 250 unstarred questions, while 9 notices have been received under Rule 101 and 13 under Rule 130, which have been sent to the state government for further action as per the rules," said the Speaker.

After Bihar govt triumphs in floor test, JD(U), BJP slam Tejashwi Yadav

After the Bihar government won the floor test, Janata Dal (United) and Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leaders launched a scathing attack on Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) leader Tejashwi Yadav.

The Janata Dal (United) leader Neeraj, talking about the floor test, stated, "Every claim of the opposition was thoroughly examined, but in the electoral test, Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's government succeeded, proving that they effectively countered every challenge posed by the opposition."

When asked about Tejashwi Yadav's statement on JDU MLA, Bihar JDU leader Neeraj Kumar stated that this question would also apply to Tejashwi Yadav, whose mandate the people favoured in 2020 and how he joined the government.

"Regarding job appointments, especially in the education sector, it was revealed that the teachers appointed by you (Tejashwi Yadav) don't even visit the office. So how are you taking credit? The credit goes to the government, and it speaks for the work in every village under the leadership of Nitish Kumar."

On being asked about three RJD leaders switching sides, he explained that the pressure from within the RJD led them to change their allegiance. He emphasized that it's not about the RJD MLAs not adhering to the order issued by their party but rather acknowledging reality. This shift occurred because, in their constituencies, people appreciated the work done by Nitish

Kumar, and they decided to align with him. Regarding the ex-RJD leader Jayant Choudhary joining the NDA alliance, the JDU leader stated that it's a natural process, diverging from the Congress's rigidity. The political conduct of the Congress is such that, naturally, members will move away from the Akhila Bharatiya Loktantrik Congress party, contributing to the decline of the INDI alliance and the growth of

the National Democratic Alliance (NDA). He added, "The INDI alliance is weakening and will continue to weaken." On being asked about the incident in Gopalganj, where the General Secretary of the district was shot dead, the JDU leader stated, "The incident in Gopalganj is shocking, and an SIT (Special Investigation Team) has been formed. Whoever is responsible will be brought to justice through legal proceedings."

Fog causes visibility woes in Delhi, flights may get affected; IMD predicts light rain

Shallow fog conditions were observed in isolated pockets of the National Capital on Tuesday morning, as per the India Meteorological Department.

The weather office has also predicted light rain or drizzle in the national capital for Tuesday and Wednesday.

The visibility in the Palam and Safdarjung areas of Delhi was recorded at 500 meters at 5:30 am on Tuesday.

The visibility in the Palam area dropped to 150 meters at 6:30. It had further dropped to 50 meters at 7:00 am. "Fog conditions observed (at 05:30 hours IST of today, 13.02.2024): Dense fog in isolated pockets of Punjab and Odisha; Moderate fog in isolated pockets of East Madhya Pradesh and Shallow fog in isolated pockets of Delhi, Bihar and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam. IMD said in an early morning tweet. As per the IMD, the minimum temperature in Delhi today is likely to hover around

9 degrees Celsius, while the maximum temperature at 24 degrees Celsius today. "Visibility recorded (at 05:30 hours IST of 13.02.2024) (<=500 metres): Punjab: Amritsar-50; Odisha: Pradiip-50; East Madhya Pradesh: Jabalpur-200; Delhi: Palam & Safdarjung-500; Bihar: Purnea-500; Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam: Vijayawada-500," it said in another tweet.

"As regards Palam, It was reporting 800m visibility at 05:30 hrs IST which falls rapidly to 150m at 06:30 hrs IST and currently it is reporting 50m visibility at 07:00 hrs IST of today Dated: 13.02.2024," IMD said. The month of February in Delhi continues to offer pleasant weather, making it an ideal month to explore the city's historical sites, gardens, and culinary delights. Delhi's temperature in February ranges from approximately 10.6°C to 23.5°C, with nearly 11 hours of sunlight daily. The cool breeze and low humidity levels create a comfortable atmosphere for sightseeing and outdoor activities.
