Siblings run over by truck

Two siblings were run over by a speeding truck near Shambhuwa village in the Vidhnu police station area on Tuesday morning. Both died on the spot. The incident took place when after getting down from the railway over-bridge they were going to school. The police have started a probe in the matter. According to a report, Kashish (11) and Rishabh (5), children of Rakesh of Shambhuwa (Vidhnu) were

going to school on the bicycle. Kashish was a student of class VIII in a junior high school while Rishabh was a student of Aganwadi Kendra. Immediately after they getting down from the railway over-bridge, the speeding truck ran over them and escaped. Irrate villagers staged a massive agitation by blocking the highway. The police made a futile attempt to pacify the situation. Instead they sat on a dharna demanding construction of a divider on the highway and payment of compensation to the kin of the deceased children. Khadeshwar outpost incharge Ghanshyam Lavania said school-going children were run over by the speeding truck. The truck driver had been arrested near Patara. Investigation was on in the matter. The kin and villagers staged an agitation with the bodies and pressed for fulfillment of their demands. Efforts are on to pacify the situation, he said. ACP Ghatampur Dinesh Kumar Shukla also reached the spot with circle force and attempted to pacify the situation, last

reports received here said. **TRAINING:** Incharge of Skill Development Scheme Dr AK Singh while inaugurating the month long training programme for small organic farmers said it is also popular as Youth Training Programme. He said now the focus shifted more on organic or bio farming. Explaining the term biological farming, he said this pattern of farming is based on measuring microbial life in soil and applying microbes, nutrients and compost tea that the soil needed to regain its balance. An important part of this was an understanding of soil succession cycle. He suggested balancing soil minerals using scientific tests on microbiological activity and chemical analysis and added there is a need for applying soil conditioners to build structure, biology and nutrient availability. Dr Singh said availability of phosphorus and calcium as well as presence of an active and diverse soil microbial population were essential to maintain highly productive and sustainable plant growth. He said conven-

tional farming practices and management such as continuous cultivation, over-reliance on pesticides and herbicides or excessive application of conventional fertilisers impede availability of these nutrients and adversely impact size and diversity of microbial population in the soil. He said biological farming is based on scientific principles and common sense and understanding that this was the realisation that microbes were the basis of all agricultural production systems. He said upmeen farmers were already familiar with the importance of microbes in ruminant nutrition. He said biological farming aimed to address the cause of these problems rather than symptoms. He said crop rotation was the practice of growing a series of different types of crops in the same area across a sequence of growing seasons. He said this practice reduced reliance of crops on one set of nutrients, pest and weed pressure along with probability of developing resistant pests and weeds.

'Make sure children attend school regularly'

Divisional Commissioner Lokesh M along with BSA Kanpur Nagar carried out a survey on Tuesday to locate poor children between six and eight years who were not going to school and were playing in the lanes. He carried out a survey of 87 houses and identified 39 such children and it was found those who had attained the age of eight were totally illiterate and had never gone to school. He directed the officials concerned to ensure that under the Sharda scheme these 24 children were admitted to Composite Girls School, Shastri Nagar and they regularly went to school. He motivated the children and apprised them of the benefits of going to school

and distributed books, notebooks, pencils and school bags. He directed the teachers to ensure that these children came to school regularly and all teachers need to go to their homes and escort them to school for at least three months. He suggested such schools need to be opened in all the slum areas. He said in the beginning the onus rests on teachers to entertain them and inculcate interest in them towards studies, especially through playway method. He checked the attendance of teachers and punctuality.

Meanwhile divisional commissioner, who is also the acting labour commissioner, while holding a review meeting of Factories and Boiler Directorate at the Labour

Commissionerate along with officials directed them to ensure they immediately introduce e-office so that departmental work of the Labour Commissionerate should be settled faster and on top priority. He cautioned the officials to take all complaints were redressed in a quality manner and within the stipulated time frame. He said tree plantation drive was going on all over the state and thus the entire officials and the staff of the Labour Commissionerate should take part in it and added in principle the department should carry it out at Central Park, Shastri Nagar. He directed the officials to upgrade the entire software of the departments under the Labour Commissionerate and intro-

duce e-court for judicial and sub-judicial works. He said registration of trade unions should also be carried out online. He said the benefit of e-office is that it enhanced transparency and accountability. He said it assured data security and data integrity and promoted innovation. He said it led to workflow automation, including standardisation automation of repetitive processes or work flows and to quick disposal of files and timely monitoring of pending files. He said it will also lead to productivity management and transparency and accountability is one of the best advantages brought by e-office. Dilip Kumar Singh, Sarju Ram, Joint Labour Commissioner, Anju Verma and others were present.

Preparations for G20 Youth conclave reviewed

A meeting was held under the chairmanship of Commissioner of Police (CP) Ashok Mutha Jain here on Monday which was also attended by Secretary, Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports Meeta Rajivlochan and District Magistrate (DM) S Rajalingam. They reviewed the preparations regarding the proposed G20 Youth Conclave to be organised in the city next month. The Youth Conclave is scheduled to be organised from August 17 to 20 and Cultural Summit from August 23 to 24. These programmes are proposed to be conducted in Indian Institute of Technology (Banarash Hindu University), Rudraksh Convention Centre (Sagra) and Trade Facilitation Centre (Bada Lalpur). A total of 570 people are expected to participate in the meeting and in connection with the meeting, discussions were held regarding the appointment of liaison officers, arrangements for their reception and their stay, showing important places etc. The DM apprised the central government team of the preparations made by the administration during the last G20 meeting by the district administration including welcoming the guests at the airport, cultural programmes at various places on the way etc. The central team agreed to implement the same protocol again. Besides, the central team asked to appoint IIT (BHU) students as liaison officers for their interaction with the international community. The meeting also talked about giving gifts and mementos related to local ODP products to the guests. The DM also apprised the team about making proper arrangements for the security of the guests and their places of stay and hospitality. In the proposed G20 Youth Conclave, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath is also to participate in the inauguration ceremony along with Union Youth Affairs Minister Anurag Thakur.

VMC to waive surcharge on sewage and water tax

Giving a major relief to the city dwellers, the Varanasi Municipal Corporation (VMC) has decided to waive off the surcharge in depositing the sewage and water tax within a month. The Executive Committee (EC) of VMC passed a budget of ₹843 crore of the corporation and ₹176.85 crore of the JalKal department for the financial year of 2023-2024. In the meeting of the EC held on Monday with the Mayor Ashok Kumar Tiwari in chair, the decision regarding to waive off the surcharge of sewage tax and water tax of city dwellers on depositing within a month. The decision to waive off was taken from the dues of ₹112 crore of JalKal department. The EC has set a target

to realise all dues of ₹112 crore in three months and thereafter the notice will be issued to the defaulters. In the meeting, the accountant of VMC Manoj Tripathi put a budget of about ₹853 crore for the financial year of 2023-2024 and the meeting gave its nod to the budget for the development of the city and for the works to be done in the public interest. In the budget, the provision of ₹5 crore has been made for the beautification and development of the parks including developing open gym which was ₹30 lakh in the previous year. The budget has been increased five times to make the city free from monkeys and the provision of ₹5 lakh has been made in the budget for garlanding the statues of great personalities installed in the city. All the

zonal offices and head office of the VMC will be equipped with the CCTV cameras and for the purpose, the provision of ₹35 lakh has been made in the budget. And, the budget for the development of the works has been doubled from the previous year. The registration fee of domestic dog has been increased from ₹200 to ₹500. The meeting decided to open a control room in the premises of VMC and to equip the sanitation employees with GPS to keep a monitor on sanitation work. The EC decided to make all the payments of the employees on the date of retirement and make correspondence with the railway and roadways regarding the passenger tax. The EC also decided to take user tax from hotels, banquet halls and lawns. ₹25 lakh has been allotted to

each ward for the development of the city and ₹5 lakh has been made for the lighting arrangement in the city. The registration fee of liquor shops has been increased from ₹12,000 to ₹30,000 and the meeting decided to increase the rent of all the shops of VMC as per market rate and constitute a committee to materialise it. The meeting decided to modernise all the public urinals and the VMC allotted a budget for the beautification of ghats. The GM of JalKal department Arun Kumar Rajput put the budget of ₹176.85 crore for the supply of pure drinking water and sewage system which the EC gave its nod. The Deputy Chairman Suresh Chaurasia, MC Shipu Giri, AMC Dushyant Maurya, members of EC and officers of VMC were present.

Stress on taking effective steps to reduce hit-and-run cases

District Magistrate Visakh G Iyer while holding the district level road safety meeting said black spots need to be identified on top priority. He discussed the Solatium scheme and benefits provided to the hit-and-run case victims and took a first-hand feedback as to what efforts and improvements had been made in the direction. He inquired about the action taken against overloading and directed them to provide details of past six months as to what action had been taken against such vehicles. He said of late there had been a sharp rise in hit-and-run cases on Kanpur-Kannauj and Kanpur-Fatehpur routes and this engendered the need to take immediate and

effective steps to ensure the hit-and-run cases were brought down. He directed them to identify the black spots. He said traffic on these routes had to be efficiently managed and this can certainly bring down the hit-and-run cases on these routes. He directed the officials concerned to ensure signages are put up and road markings are done to bring down accidents on the Sajeti route. The DM said on the highway between Ghatampur to Naubasta the officials of the NHAI had failed to make effective efforts to curb hit-and-run cases. He said it was found that there was no ambulance nor tow vehicles and directed these facilities be made available on top priority. Licence or permits of how many vehicles had been cancelled for over-

loading and said all details be provided to the Collectorate at the earliest. He directed the NHAI officials to set up speed breakers, signages and road markings on the route. He directed the NHAI officials that on account of massive heavy vehicles moving on the route there is a need to develop bylanes on both sides and at least four spots need to be identified at the earliest. He directed the traffic police to take strict action against drivers driving under the influence of liquor and this drive should be carried out randomly. He said on national highway elevated road between Lucknow and Bhaunsi there was poor street lighting and roads are in a bad shape and they be repaired on top priority.

BHU's mungbean variety notified

A new mungbean variety, Malviya Jankranti (HUM 27) of high protein content (28.9%) developed by Department of Genetics and Plant Breeding, Institute of Agricultural Sciences, Banarash Hindu University (BHU) has been notified by Central Variety Sub-committee on Crop Standards, Notification and Release of varieties of agricultural crops, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Government of India in its 90th meeting held recently at New Delhi.

The principal breeder, Dr Mahendra Narain Singh informed that this variety has bold seed (5g/100 seed), 44 cm plant height and maturity period 62-70 days with average production of 9 quintal per hectare and maximum productivity being 18 q/ha.

This variety is highly resistant to mungbean yellow mosaic virus (MYMV), Cercospora leaf spot, powdery mildew and leaf crinkle virus and has given a yield superiority of more than 15% over other prevailing mungbean varieties of the region. This variety is insensitive to high temperature as podding is continued beyond 45°C. The best time of sowing is from 5-30th March under irrigated conditions in Uttar Pradesh and other major mungbean growing areas of the country.
