Dear Sir,

Pursuant to Regulations 33 of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, we wish to inform you that the Board of Directors in its meeting held on today i.e. 9th August 2022 has inter alia considered and approved:

1. The Audited Financial Results (Standalone & Consolidated) for the quarter ended 30th June 2022. Copy of the said Financial Results along with unmodified Auditors Report thereon is enclosed herewith as **Annexure 1**.
2. Enhancement of the manufacturing capacity of Ethyl Acetate from 1,00,000 MT per annum to 120,000 MT per annum with a capex of about Rs.15 crore, funded through internal accruals only. The project for enhancing the said capacity shall be completed during the 3rd Quarter of FY2023. The details as per SEBI Circular CIR/CFD/CMD/4/2015 dated 09.09.2015 are enclosed herewith as **Annexure 2**.
3. In principle approved the setting up of a new Plant for Speciality Chemicals and Pharmaceuticals Intermediates in Western India to cater to domestic and international customers with a capex of Rs. 300 Crore. The project is expected to complete in 18 months.

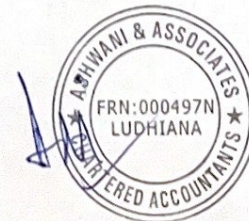

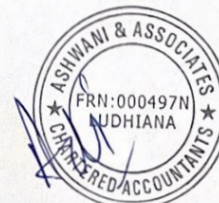

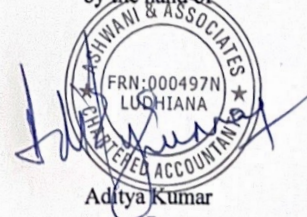

Therefore, the consolidated financial results of the Company include the financials of IOL- Foundation and IOL Life Sciences Limited. Consolidated corresponding figures for the quarter ended 30th June 2021 are not given, since the subsidiary companies viz. IOL- Foundation and IOL Life Sciences Limited were incorporated in the month of March 2022 and June 2022 respectively.
4. The Company has assessed the possible impact of COVID-19 on its financial statements based on the internal and external information available up to the date of approval of these financial results and concluded that no adjustment is required in these results. The Company continues to monitor the future economic conditions.
5. The Company has two reportable segments i.e. Pharmaceuticals and Chemicals.
6. The previous financial period figures have been regrouped/rearranged/restated wherever considered necessary.
