

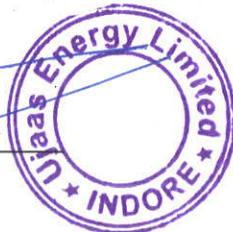

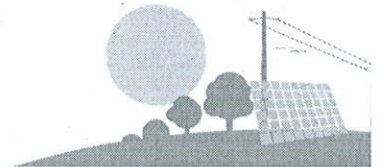

Pentagon stops accepting new F-35 jets after discovering part made in China

WASHINGTON: The US Pentagon has stopped accepting new F-35 jets after it discovered a magnet used in the stealthy fighter's engine was made with unauthorised material from China. The

aircraft's maker, Lockheed Martin, found a part used in the jet's engine was made in China, the defence department and company confirmed on Wednesday (local time).

Bannon surrenders in New York court

NEW YORK: Former President Donald Trump's longtime ally Steve Bannon surrendered on Thursday to face fresh charges that he duped donors who gave money to build a wall on the US-Mexico border. Bannon's state-level charges in New York closely resemble an attempted federal prosecution that ended abruptly, before trial, when Trump pardoned Bannon on his last day in office. Presidential pardons apply only to federal crimes, not state offenses.

Man held for attack on Sikh priest in UK

MANCHESTER: A man has been arrested after last month's attack on a Sikh priest in UK's Manchester which left the 62-year-old victim with serious brain injury, media reports said. A 28-year-old man was arrested on Wednesday on suspicion of section 20 assault in connection with an attack on a Sikh Priest in Manchester City Centre. Last week, police released CCTV footage of an assault on a Sikh Priest. The victim's family said that the man was inflicted with "life-changing injuries."

White House unveils Obamas' portraits

WASHINGTON: Former president Barack Obama and former first lady Michelle Obama returned to the White House for the unveiling of their official portraits, marking their first joint visit to the iconic building since they left in 2017 and the return of a Washington tradition last celebrated in 2012. The ceremony to unveil their portraits was hosted by President Joe Biden and attended by First Lady Dr Jill Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris, among others.

ECB raises rates by 75 basis points

FRANKFURT: The European Central Bank (ECB) has hiked interest rates across the eurozone by a record amount, as policymakers try to curb inflation, a media report said. The ECB's governing council has voted to raise all three key interest rates by 75 basis points, or 0.75 percentage points — a bigger hike than ever before, The Guardian reported.

CNN chief anchor Shaw dies at 82

NEW YORK: Bernard Shaw, CNN's chief anchor for two decades and a pioneering Black broadcast journalist best remembered for calmly reporting the Gulf War in 1991 has died. He was 82. He died of pneumonia on Wednesday at a hospital in Washington, according to Tom Johnson, CNN's former chief executive.

Ukraine retakes Russian-held territory

Ukrainian forces have retaken portions of Russian-held territory in the northeastern Kharkiv region as a Ukrainian counteroffensive in the south has drained some of Moscow's resources there, as per a report released on Wednesday.

Ukrainian forces in Kharkiv region are "likely exploiting Russian force reallocation" to areas near the occupied city of Kherson in the south "to conduct an opportunistic yet highly effective counteroffensive" in the province, Washington-based think tank Institute for the Study of War said.

Vitaly Ganchev, the Moscow-backed mayor of the town of Kupiansk in a Russian-occupied area of the Kharkiv region, said on Thursday that authorities had begun evacuating women and children from the town and nearby areas because of relentless Ukrainian shelling.

In his nightly video address on Wednesday, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky also reported success

in the Kharkiv region but didn't provide details on its scope.

"This week, we have good news from the Kharkiv region. You have probably already seen reports about the activity of Ukrainian defenders, and I think every citizen feels proud of our warriors," Zelensky said.

The gains came as the Ukrainian military is trying

to retake territory from the Russians in the southern Kherson region and has claimed the recapture of an unspecified number of towns.

Ukraine's operations near Kherson have forced Russian forces to shift their focus to the south, the Institute for the Study of War report said, enabling Ukrainian forces to launch lo-

calised but highly effective counter-attacks near Kharkiv, Ukraine's second-largest city. Zelensky's presidential adviser, Oleksiy Arestovych, also spoke of Ukrainian gains near Kharkiv late Wednesday, saying they would help disrupt supplies to Russian forces in the area and potentially lead to their encirclement.

Blinken, in Kyiv, unveils \$2 bn in US military aid for Europe

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken made an unscheduled visit to Kyiv on Thursday as the Biden administration announced new military aid worth more than \$2 bn for Ukraine and other European countries threatened by Russia. Blinken said the Biden administration would provide \$2 bn in long-term foreign

military financing to Ukraine and 18 of its neighbours, including NATO members and regional security partners "most potentially at risk for future Russian aggression." That's on top of a \$675 million package of heavy weaponry, ammunition and armoured vehicles for Ukraine alone that Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin announced earlier on Thursday.

Memphis man who streamed his shootings arrested

A gunman who streamed live visuals of himself driving around Memphis shooting dead four and wounding three others in seemingly random attacks, was finally arrested after crashing a stolen car, police said on Thursday.

The hours-long rampage had police warning people across the city to shelter in place, locking down a baseball stadium and university campuses and suspending public bus services as frightened residents wondered where the man might strike next.

Ezekiel Kelly, 19, a violent felon who was released early from prison this year, was taken into custody at around 9 pm.

Memphis Police Director Cerelyn "CJ" Davis said during a news conference early on Thursday that four people were killed and three others were wounded in seven shootings and at least two carjackings.

The first killing was at 12:56 am on Wednesday, and officers responded to three more crime scenes before receiving a tip at 6:12 pm that the suspect was livestreaming himself threatening to cause harm to citizens, Davis said.

Police then sent out an alert warning people to be on the lookout for an armed and dangerous man responsible for multiple shootings and reportedly recording his actions on Facebook.

FINAL SUSPECT IN CANADA RAMPAGE DIES AFTER ARREST

The final suspect in a stabbing rampage that killed 10 people in and around a Canadian Indigenous reserve died of self-inflicted wounds after his car was run off the road by police on Wednesday following a three-day manhunt, officials said.

Myles Sanderson, 32, was found near the town of Rosthern in Saskatchewan province, as officers responded to a report of a stolen vehicle being driv-



en by a man armed with a knife, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police said.

Officers rammed Sanderson's vehicle off the road, said an official who was familiar with the matter, speaking on condition of

anonymity because the person was not authorised to talk publicly.

The official said the fugitive's injuries were self-inflicted, but he didn't have further details on when the injuries were inflicted or when he died.

Video and photos from the scene showed a white SUV off to the side of the road with police cars all

around. Air bags had deployed in the SUV.

Myles Sanderson's death comes two days after the body of his brother, 30-year-old Damien Sanderson, was found in a field near the scene of their rampage, which also wounded 18 people. Police are investigating whether Myles Sanderson killed his brother.

Iranian diplomats leave from Albania

Tirana

The last staff of the Iranian Embassy in Tirana have left the building after they were given 24 hours to leave Albania over a major cyberattack that the Albanian government blames on Iran. It is the first known case of a country cutting diplomatic relations over a cyberattack. The last two embassy cars with about 10 passengers left the compound Thursday near noon after much movement inside the building overnight.
