India's diplomacy touched new heights in last 30 days: PM

PRIME MINISTER NARENDRA Modi on Tuesday said India's diplomacy touched new heights in the last 30 days and some decisions taken during the G20 Summit have potential to change the direction of the 21st century world takes.

Addressing students, faculty members and heads of educational institutions at the finale of the G20 University Connect here, the prime minister said he met 85 world leaders during the past 30 days.

"In today's polarised international atmosphere, it is not a small thing to get so many countries together on one platform," he said, referring to the G20 Summit in Delhi earlier this month. He asserted that clean, clear and stable governance is necessary for the country's developmental journey to continue. "I want to give you a report card of the last 30 days. That will give you an idea of the speed and scale of New India. You must remember August 23! Everyone was praying and then suddenly there was a smile on everyone's face. The entire world heard India's voice: 'India is on the Moon'."

"August 23 has become immortal in the country as the National Space Day. Soon after the success of its lunar mission, India launched its solar mission," he added.

Asserting that India's diplomacy reached new heights in the past 30 days, the prime minister said the G20 Summit could have been limited to a diplo-

matic and Delhi-centric programme but India made it a people-driven national movement. Six more countries have joined BRICS community due to India's efforts, the prime minister said.

"A 100% consensus on the Delhi declaration made global headlines...some decisions taken during the G20 Summit have potential to change the 21st century's direction...In today's polarised international atmosphere, it is not a small thing to get so many countries together on one platform," he said.

Listing out the achievements of his government in the past 30 days, the prime minister said several initiatives were taken to empower the poor, SCs, STs, OBCs and the middle class.

"The government launched the PM Vishwakarma Yojana for

artisans. In last 30 days, over one lakh youths have been given central government jobs through 'Rozgar Mela'. The women's reservation bill became the first bill passed in the new Parliament building and it filled the country with a sense of pride," he said. Modi said he is not surprised at the success of the G20 Summit as when youths get associated with any event, its success is assured.

"Youths progress only where there is optimism, opportunities and openness. My message to the youth is - 'Think Big'," he said.

Noting that India's college and university campuses can become crucial centres for his "vocal for local" mantra, the prime minister urged the students to make Khadi a fashion statement on the campus.

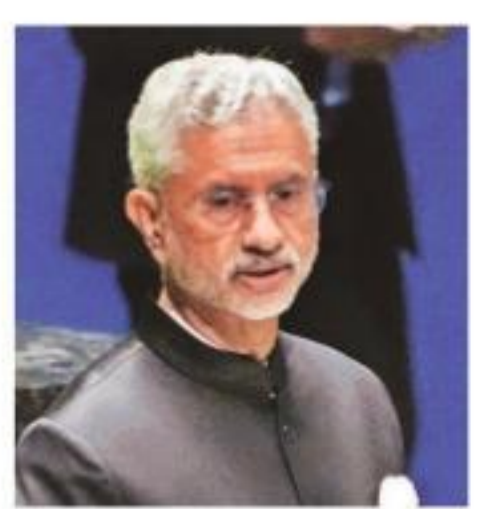
Political convenience cannot determine response to terror: Jaishankar at UNGA

AMID THE ONGOING diplomatic row between India and Canada, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said on Tuesday that "political convenience" should not be allowed to determine a country's response to "terrorism, extremism and violence".

Jaishankar's remarks, in his address at the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA), are being seen as a veiled attack on Canada. India has accused Canada of being a haven for terrorists, extremists and organised violence, in response to Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's allegation about a "potential link between agents of the Government of India" and the killing of pro-Khalistan separatist leader Hardeep Singh Nijjar. Targeting "rule-makers", Jaishankar said that "respect for territorial integrity and non-interference in internal affairs cannot be exercised in cherry picking", a reference to Trudeau's statement that any involvement of a foreign government in the killing of a Canadian citizen on Canadian soil was an "unacceptable violation of our sovereignty".

While Jaishankar's comments are also perceived to be directed at Pakistan and China, the reference to "rule-makers" points towards Canada, which is part of the G7 grouping and exercises influence because of its close alliance with the US. This was Jaishankar's first remarks on the India-Canada row. However, he framed it in the context of a global rules-

based order. "In our deliberations, we often advocate the promotion of a rules-based order. From time to time, respect for the UN Charter is also invoked. But for all the talk, it is still a few nations who shape the agenda and seek to define the norms. This cannot go on indefinitely. Nor will it continue to go unchallenged," said Jaishankar, who spoke for about 17 minutes.

"A fair, equitable and democratic order will surely emerge, once we all put our minds to it. And for a start, that means ensuring that rule-makers do not subjugate rule-takers. After all, rules will work only when they apply equally to all," he said. "We must never again allow an injustice like vaccine apartheid to recur. Climate action too cannot continue to witness an evasion of historical responsibilities. The power of markets should not be utilised to steer food and energy from the needy to the wealthy," he said, in a swipe at the developed countries.

Rana discussed about south Mumbai before 26/11 attacks: Police

PAKISTANI-ORIGIN CANADIAN BUSINESSMAN Tahawwur Rana, a key accused in the 26/11 terror attacks case, stayed at a hotel in Mumbai's Powai for two days in November 2008 ahead of the attacks, where he discussed about the crowded places in south Mumbai with a witness in the case, police said on Tuesday.

The places that Rana discussed with the key witness include the sites in south Mumbai that were targeted by Pakistani terrorists during the deadly attacks, a police official said. On Tuesday, the Mumbai police filed an application in a court here, seeking issuance of a non-bailable warrant against Rana so that further legal processes can be initiated, he said.

This comes a day after the city police's crime branch submitted the over 400-page supplementary chargesheet, the fourth in the case so far, before a special court hearing cases related to the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA).

PM, President & leaders wish Manmohan Singh on b'day

A HOST OF leaders, including President Droupadi Murmu, Vice-President Jagdeep Thakkar and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on Tuesday wished former prime minister Manmohan Singh on his birthday as he turned 91.

Former president Pratibha Patil, Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge, and party leaders Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi called Singh and gave their best wishes to him. President Murmu, Vice President Thakkar and Prime Minister Modi greeted the former prime minister over phone. Modi spoke to Singh in the morning to greet him on his birthday, officials said. Later, in a post on X, Modi said, "Birthday wishes to former PM Dr Manmohan Singh ji. I pray for his long life and good health."

The Congress also hailed Singh with party chief Kharge saying he was a "true statesman PM" whose actions spoke louder than his words. Manmohan Singh led the Congress-led UPA government as prime minister between 2004 and 2014. He was also India's finance minister in the P V Narasimha Rao-led government during 1991-96, an epochal era for the country's economy marked by wide-ranging reforms. —PTI

Amit Khare's tenure as adviser to PM extended

THE CENTRE HAS given extension to Amit Khare, a retired IAS officer, as Adviser to Prime Minister beyond his present term ending October 12, 2023, for a period co-terminus with the term of the PM.

In an order, the Department of Personnel and Training said, "The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved extension in tenure of Amit Khare, IAS (Retd.) (JH:1985) as Adviser to Prime Minister, in the rank and scale of Secretary to Government of India on contract basis on usual terms and conditions as are applicable in the case of re-employed officers of Secretary level in Government of India, beyond 12.10.2023 for a period, co-terminus with the term of Prime Minister or until further orders, whichever is earlier."

Khare was appointed as Adviser to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on a contract basis for two years on October 12, 2021.

Khare, a 1985-batch Jharkhand-cadre IAS officer, retired as higher education secretary. He helped shape the new National Education Policy (NEP). —ENS
