Sub.: Update on Resumption of partial Manufacturing operations/ production at our plants suspended in wake of COVID- 19.

We refer to Regulation 30 of the Listing Regulations and our communication dated March 24, 2020 regarding closure / partial closure of manufacturing operations at our plants located at Mahape, Navi Mumbai in Maharashtra, Karakhadi, Vadodara and Dahej SEZ in Gujarat due to outbreak of COVID- 19 pandemic. We would like to update as under:

- i. Company being an essential service provider, has now obtained requisite permissions from concerned Government authorities, at all its above mentioned plants and resumed production / partial production at all its above mentioned plants.
- ii. Based on the availability of inputs / transportation / manpower, partial operations have re-commenced at all sites and the same will be ramped up in a phased manner.
- iii. The Company will continue to accord utmost importance to the health and safety of its workforce and the community including compliance with all the directives of competent authorities issued in this behalf from time to time.
