# Make tourists feel safe in Goa

Goa is one of the top beach tourism destinations in the country, attracts lakhs of tourists every year. According to the sources, more than 6 million tourists arrive in the state of Goa every year and this figure shows an upward trend with every passing year. There is no doubt that Goa is one of the top most choices of destination in India for the foreigners. The increasing number of arrivals whether from the national or international reveals that fact that Goa is a most wanted destination for the tourists from across the world. Goa has always had its share of tourist troubles - from the nudist beaches of the sixties to drug peddling, and more recently, to pedophilia rackets. Rape and sexual

abuse are interlinked with drug abuse. It is indeed a concern for the Government and stakeholders of the Tourism Industry of Goa. India's tourism spot Goa is fast becoming a centre for the sex trade and drugs. There are cases reported that many foreign tourists have been sexually assaulted in the past few years in the state. No doubt, the government has increased security for tourists and promised to take tough action against the culprits to avoid these incidents in the future. However, if proper monitoring is not done then problems of law and order and rubbish will spell doom for state tourism. It is reported that about 85% of sex workers operating in Goa and 38% workers in the red light area in Mumbai are from Andhra Pradesh. Young girls supplied by pimps in Andhra Pradesh are slogging in brothels in Goa, Mumbai, Delhi, Kolkata, Karnataka and other States and the neighbouring districts in the State. There is no denying fact that the sex industry in Goa is flourishing, even though it's largely invisible. Gradually we are losing the image of an international tourist destination. No doubt,

the Goa government, through the home department, is augmenting budgets to improve safety and security measures in the State keeping in mind the tourism industry and the importance of providing a safe holiday for tourists visiting Goa. We find more and more domestic tourists are creating an imbalance to the kind of tourists visiting Goa. We have to be very sensitive towards tourism in Goa because, the whole world is focused towards Goa. From time to time there are reports of 'date rape' or theft-related druggings, usually in busy, trendy tourist bars. The cases of sexual assault against women and young girls are increasing. There have also been incidents of attacks on women. Tourists, especially women, should not wander about unnecessarily at night. It is to be remembered that no person or a place is safe if you are in the wrong place at wrong time and hence blaming the entire state or doubting its integrity is incorrect. It would always be advisable to be take some very basic precautions, avoid traveling late night, keeping your gadgets and wallet safe as

you may sometime want to travel in the local buses, steer clear of drugs and not carrying much valuable items while traveling. There will always be incidents and unnecessary problems as long as people take drugs. It would be better if tourists wherever they go would be to stay away from drugs. Even the small things that happen in Goa becomes big news, international news. It is not as though the crime rate is high but it is also certain that if tourists die due to natural causes or overdose of drugs, Goa cannot be considered as unsafe. The tourists must also realise that India is a traditional set up and there is a certain amount of decency required. Therefore, we have to take care that such things don't happen. If the government really wants to control drug racketeers, they need to seriously take on the local drug lords rather than watch helplessly. # How Silk Road was Sanskrit Sutra Route: A case of irresistible Indian influence and cursory Chinese presence

A few years ago, at a seminar, Indologist Lokesh Chandra said that the term 'Silk Road' was a misnomer. "Silk never travelled on this route. The Chinese used silk only as part of political diplomacy; to get horses, they supplied bales of silk," he added. According to Prof Chandra, the so-called Silk Road was more of a 'Sutra Road' as monks and pilgrims used this route to carry Sanskrit manuscripts and disseminate Hindu-Buddhist knowledge and philosophy. His assertion has been vindicated by the discovery of numerous manuscripts and "spectacular masterpieces of Buddhist monastic art", as William Dalrymple writes in The Golden Road, in caves along the ancient route. Since antiquity, India's links with Central Asia-Tarim Basin and the neighbouring Oxus and Badakhshan regions have been intense and interactive. According to British historian Arnold Toynbee, these linkages go back to at least 1,700 years before the Christian era. One is reminded of this deep-rooted connection every time a Hindu takes a sankalp during a puja: The puja begins with the mention of Jambu-dvipa (comprising a large section of Eurasia), followed by Dakshina Parv (southern part of the Jambu-dvipa), Bharata Khand (Greater Bharat), Bharata Varsha (Bharat subcontinent), and ends with the reference of the locality in which the devotee resides. The Brahma Purana, translated into English by Bibek Debroy (2021), mentions these geographical regions. It says: "The dvipas are Jambu, Plaksha, Shalmalia, Kusha, Krouncha, Shaka, and Pushkara as the seventh... Jambu-dvipa is located right in the middle of these and in the centre is Meru, the golden mountain... The earth is like a lotus and the mountain is established like its pericarp... Bharata is said to be the first varsha, and Kimpurusha is the one that comes next. Harivarsha is to the south of Meru. Ramyaka is to the north and Hiranmaya is next to it. O supreme Brahmanas! Uttarkuru is like Bharata. Each of these extends for 9,000 yojanas. Ilavrita is in the centre and the golden mountain of Meru rises up there. O immensely fortunate ones! In four directions from

Meru, Ilavrita extends for 9,000 yojanas." According to the Markandeya Purana, again translated by Debroy (2019), the earth in Jambu-dvipa "rises up in the middle and slopes downwards to the north and the south". The elevated land is called Ilavrita, in whose centre is Mount Meru. The Vayu Purana mentions the mountains, rivers and valleys of Jambu-dvipa in detail. In The Geography of the Puranas (1966), Prof SM Ali writes that the "geographical section of this (Vayu) Purana is more complete and detailed than that found in any other Puranas". According to him, the description of the northern regions of Jambu-dvipa "covers a very vast area, from the Urals and the Caspian to the Yenisei and from the Turkestan, Tien Shan ranges to the Arctic. It describes the topography of the whole land very accurately and in some cases picturesquely". The area across the



Himalayas and Hindukush from Pamir up to the Arctic is known in the Puranas and the epics as Uttarkuru. The Arctic is referred to as Somagiri. There are numerous references to the two regions in the Ramayana and the Mahabharata. In the Ramayana, for instance, Sugriva, while sending the monkeys to the north in search of Sita, describes the route and the countries in that direction. Among others, he commands them to search Sita in the lands and towns of the Dardas, Kambojas, Yavanas and Shakas. He says that Somagiri has no national boundaries; it is without the sun and yet very much lighted. The story of Kumarajiva (344-413 AD), born to a Kashmiri father, probably a minister in the Takshashila royal court, and a Kuchean mother, is a reminder of India's deep connections with the Central Asian region — and also how much its civilisational/cultural spread has shrunk in the last two millennia.

# PM Modi's Nigeria, Guyana visit and India's Africa-Caribbean outreach



Prime Minister Narendra Modi's latest visits to Nigeria and Guyana exemplify a critical juncture in India's diplomatic outreach to Africa and the Caribbean, highlighting the significance of the visit for India's foreign policy. The relationships between the countries are built upon shared histories, common developmental goals, and aspirations, and at the same time mutual strategic interests. With Nigeria and Guyana emerging as key players in global energy markets in their respective locations, these visits are poised to elevate bilateral ties, enhance India's foreign policy objectives, and contribute to a more multipolar world order. India and Nigeria share a historical bond rooted in anti-colonial struggles, post-independence solidarity, and participation in the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM). On the other hand, the roots of India-Guyana relations lie in the shared history of enslaved labourers during British colonial rule. After India's independence, New Delhi officially established diplomatic relationships with Nigeria and Guyana in the years of 1962 and 1966, respectively. PM Modi's tour involves significant geopolitics,

which begins with Nigeria, Africa's most populous country and a major player in the region, before moving to Guyana, which holds strategic importance in the Caribbean. Both countries share historical connections with India, underscored by a long-standing Indian diaspora that strengthens cultural and economic ties. India is one of Nigeria's biggest trading partners, with a stronghold of two-way trade that hit about \$15 billion in the 2021-2022 financial year, even with the COVID-19 pandemic's effects. The major exports from India include medicines, machines, and fabrics, while Nigerian

crude oil is also brought in. This cooperation shows how much these two countries have come to rely on each other over time. Not only is the relationship limited to trade or economics, but the two nations also equip and help Nigeria to enhance its defence capabilities. At the same time, Guyana has become a key player in the world's oil market after finding huge oil deposits offshore. India is a major importer of oil; for instance, in the financial year of 2023-2024, India imported around 232.5 million metric tonnes (MMT) of crude oil. With the same intensity, India has long supported Guyana through various ways, such as opportunities with scholarships, training programs, and capacity-building initiatives under the ITEC (Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation) program.
