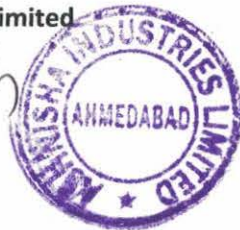

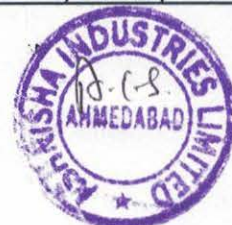

Opinion

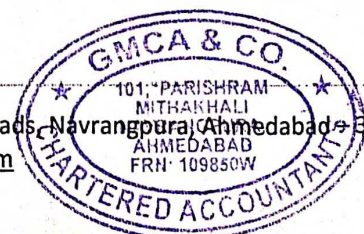

Responsibility of Management for the Consolidated Annual Financial Results

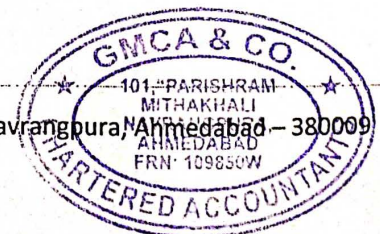
