IMPEACHMENT PROBE

Trump-blocked witnesses loom large

Democrats will soon face a choice in what has been a fast-moving inquiry

NICK WADHAMS Washington, November 21

GORDON SONDLAND TESTIFIED that "everyone was in the loop" about his months-long push for a quid pro quo from Ukraine Democrats must now decide if they've gathered enough evidence to justify impeaching President Donald Trump quickly or press for more.

In more than 24 hours of testimony on Wednesday, the helicopter turned enemy to the European Union said he informed Vice President Mike Pence, Secretary of State Mike Pompeo and other top officials that he was relaying a demand that he believed came directly from the president: Ukrainian aid and an Oval Office meeting required a corruption probe to former president Joe Biden's family.

Sondland said Pompeo, one of Trump's closest advisers, told

him to "keep banging away." But more broadly, he emphasized that everyone in a position of authority in the administration, including the president, knew of and approved his work with Rudy Giuliani, Trump's personal lawyer.

"Everyone was in the loop," Sondland testified. "Was there a quid pro quo?" As I testified previously, with regard to the requested White House call and White House meeting, the answer is yes.

Democrats will soon face a choice in what has been a fast-moving inquiry. Drawup articles of impeachment based on what they've heard so far, or chase more evidence and testi-

mony from high-profile witnesses like Pompeo and Giuliani who have so far refused to cooperate. That would likely require months of court battles, pushing hearings well into the presidential primary calendar next year.

Thursday will feature the last scheduled public hearing at the end of a dramatic week, with two witnesses expected to further underscore the confusion around Trump's Ukraine policy. One of them, Fiona Hill, the former National Security Council director on Russia and Eastern Europe, worked directly with Sondland as a secretary and advisor to John Bolton. Republicans challenged

Sondland's testimony Wednesday, arguing that he never gave a direct nod from the president and flagged his comments that he didn't initially equate demands for a probe into Burisma, the gas company on whose board Biden's son served, as a bid to undermine the former vice president. Sondland, who donated \$1 million to Trump's inauguration and said he likes the president, didn't disagree. "I don't recall President Trump ever talking to me about any security assistance, ever," he said. Highlighting just how much could still be revealed, testimony from a Wednesday evening witness upended

Republicans' claim that Ukraine itself learned about a US hold on security aid in late August, days before the money was released.

Laura Cnapper, the Defense Department's top official on Russia and Ukraine, testified she was alerted to emails from her staff showing that officials at Ukraine's embassy in Washington may have been aware of the freeze on critical military aid as early as July 25, the same day Trump spoke with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and asked him for a "favor."

Despite continuing revelations, Democrats have been frustrated that senior officials including Trump, the Office of Management and Budget and the State Department have refused to hand over key documents linked to the investigation. In his testimony, Sondland said the process has been "less than fair" because he hasn't been given crucial records. Pompeo, speaking in Brussels on Wednesday, declined to release himself from decisions on releasing documents to the panel and refused to comment on Sondland's allegations about his involvement in the Ukraine dealings. Later, State Department spokesman Morgan Ortago said in a statement that Sondland refused to comment on Pompeo that he believed the president was linking aid to investigations of political opponents. Any suggestion to the contrary is "flat-out false."

China demands Trump veto bills on Hong Kong

CHINA ON THURSDAY demanded President Donald Trump veto legislation aimed at supporting human rights in Hong Kong and renewed a threat to take "strong countermeasures" if the bills become law. Foreign ministry spokesman Geng Shuang said the Hong Kong Human Rights and Democracy Act undermined both China's interests and those of the US in the semi-autonomous Chinese city. "We urge the US to grasp the situation, stop its wrong-doing before it's too late, prevent this act from becoming law (and) immediately stop interfering in Hong Kong affairs," Geng said at a daily news briefing.

"If the US continues to make the wrong moves, China will be taking strong countermeasures for sure," Geng said. Foreign minister Wang Yi joined in the criticism, telling visiting former US Defense Secretary William Cohen that the legislation constituted an act of interference in China's internal affairs and ignored violent acts committed by protesters. "Foreign minister Wang Yi said in his remarks the wrong signal to those violent criminals and its substance seeks to throw Hong Kong into chaos or even to destroy Hong Kong outright," Wang said.

The human rights act mandates sanctions on Chinese and Hong Kong officials who carry out human rights abuses and requires an annual review of the favorable trade status that Washington grants Hong Kong. Another bill prohibits export to Hong Kong police of certain nonlethal munitions, including tear gas, pepper spray, rubber bullets, water cannons, stun guns and tasers. The House of Representatives overwhelmingly approved the bills Wednesday, a day after the Senate passed them on vote votes. The bills now go to the White House for Trump's signature, and the White House signaled that he would sign the measure. Hong Kong held on to its advantageous trading status with the US upon its handover

from British to Chinese rule in 1997, in recognition of Beijing's pledge to allow it to retain its own laws, independent judiciary and civil and economic freedoms. That independent status has come into question amid moves by Beijing to gradually strengthen its political control over the territory, helping grant months of increasingly violent protests.

This week, China's legislature argued it had the sole right to interpret the validity of Hong Kong's laws after the territory's court struck down an order banning the wearing of masks at protests. Legal scholars described that as a power grab violating the governing framework known as "one country, two systems."
