# PM cites triple talaq, asks MPs to reach out to Muslim women

'Modi Emphasised Need To Connect With Every Section Of Society'

New Delhi: Asserting that his government's decision to ban instant triple talaq made Muslim women feel more secure, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has asked BJP leaders to reach out to them during the upcoming festival of Raksha Bandhan.

The PM's remarks came during a meeting with BJP-led NDA MPs from West Bengal, Odisha and Jharkhand on Monday night. Some MPs, including Modi and senior BJP functionaries highlighted the central government's development initiatives for different sections of society.

Some MPs, who attended the meeting, said Modi emphasised the need to connect with every section of society. The party has been making an outreach to "asmasda (backward) Muslims".

The Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Mar-

riage) Bill was passed by Parliament in 2019, declaring the practice of instant triple talaq illegal and a crime that could attract a jail term for the husband.

Modi has often highlighted his government's reform measures for Muslim women. In his speech, the PM noted that opposition parties are making efforts to join their forces under a new

name INDIA (Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance) as their earlier moniker IPA was tainted with a slew of scams.

BJP has divided NDA MPs region-wise into clusters of nearly 40 members and Modi is expected to speak to them separately during the ongoing Monsoon session of Parliament.

Navyuga Engineering Co Ltd had appointed VSI India of Singapore to launch the viaduct segments using automatic launchers. The incident occurred when 28 personnel, including four engineers, seven staff workers and 17 labourers, were at the site when a concrete section between piers 15 and 16 and the launching gantry crane standing on it collapsed. The police said some were stuck below the girder while others were trapped below the launcher. Shahapur police have filed an FIR under section 302 of the IPC against unidentified persons and have begun a probe.

Compensation totalling Rs 17 lakh to the next of kin of each deceased has been declared. It includes gratuity by the Centre (from the PMNRF as announced by the PM) and Rs 5 lakh by the state government. Another Rs 5 lakh will be given by VSI India Ltd who is the sub-contractor carrying out work, and Rs 5 lakh by main contractor Navyuga Engineering company. The injured will be given Rs 50,000 each.

Villagers were among the first to hear machinery collapsing and reached the site to rescue the victims before police and fire brigades took to the spot around 2am. The local Shahapur police as well as rescuers from the National Disaster Response Force and 33 members of the Thane Disaster Response Force joined operations at 7am. The rescue operation went on till 5.30pm on Tuesday, when the last three bodies were found.

## Choksi told to pay ₹2L before plea against series is taken up

New Delhi: The Delhi HC has directed the Rs 13,500-crore PNB scam accused Mehul Choksi to first deposit Rs 2 lakh with it within a week before it hears his plea against a bench of justices comprising Justice V. Ramaswami and Justice A. K. Patil.

Choksi has appealed against a single judge order dismissing his plea against 'Bad Boy Billionaires'. A bench of Justices Vibhu Bakhrui and Amit Mahajan directed him, in a recent order, to deposit Rs 2 lakh with the HC registry to secure the cost of the proceedings.

"This court is of the view that, in the event the appellant (Choksi) does not prevail in the present appeal and costs are awarded to the respondent (Union of India

and Netflix, there perhaps would be no method of recovering the same. This court considers it apposite to direct, before these proceedings are taken, the appellant to deposit a sum of Rs 2 lakh within a period of one week (from the day of the order) with the registry of this court to secure the costs of the present proceeding," the

bench said. "It is pointed out that the appellant is neither a citizen of India nor a resident of India. In addition, it is also submitted that there are several other proceedings pending against the appellant, including for payment of dues, which have not been discharged," it added.

Choksi, who left the country in 2019 and was granted the citizenship of Antigua and Barbuda, said in his appeal that he is only seeking that the matter be remanded to the single judge who had dismissed his plea.

The single judge had on August 28, 2020, denied relief to Choksi, saying a writ petition for enforcement of a private right was not maintainable. The judge said his remedy lay in a civil suit and granted him the liberty to raise the issue there.

## 'Manipur police lost control of situation'

Solicitor general Tushar Mehta tried to assuage the Supreme Court bench and said, "That last observation (breakdown of constitutional machinery and law and order) may not be correct as we are a little away from that and the situation is coming back to normal now."

"The moment we came to know of the viral video, we not only transferred the probe to the CBI but we also requested the SC to monitor it. There cannot be anything more transparent than this."

The SG informed the court that the state police had registered around 6,500 FIRs for "various offences during the ethnic strife. The bench pointed out that the CBI could investigate only a few heinous offences. "What about the rest? Can the state police investigate 6,000-odd cases? What about the remaining cases? The state police are incapable of investigating the cases. It is so obvious that they lost control over the situation," the CJ said.

When the SG protested the CJ's observations against the state police and said such remarks without reading the state report could have serious repercussions for the already-tense situation in the state, the bench said in the 11 cases of serious crimes against wom-

en and children, only seven arrests had been made.

The bench said, "One thing which is obvious and clear from the record now is that for a period of more than two months—from May 4 till July 27—the police were not in charge. They may have been making some perfunctory arrests. But they were not in charge. Either they were incapable of doing it or they were unwilling to do it."

## Centre always seemed assured of bill's passage

BJD declared its stand through the whip it issued to its members asking them to support the bill that has been attacked by other regional parties for alleged violation of the principle of federalism. "BJD has decided to support the passing of the Delhi bill and we will be opposing the no-confidence motion moved by the opposition parties. A three-line whip has been issued by the party to all Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha members to remain present in the House and do the needful," BJD RS member Sasmit Patra said.

Unlike BJD, YRSCP's Reddy said the party's stand on the "no-confidence motion" is yet to be decided. Significantly, an agency report had earlier quoted Reddy as saying that his party would oppose the no-trust vote. Asked about it, Reddy, who is leader of the YRSCP parliamentary group, said the call would be taken by "our leader" and Andhra CM Jagan Mohan Reddy.

The government had, in any case, always appeared confident of mastering enough support. It was evident again on Tuesday when home minister Amit Shah dubbed as "politically motivated" the opposition's claim that the bill was illegal because it flew in the face of the Supreme Court order that vested the superintendence of services in the elected govern-

ment of Delhi. "Our Constitution allows Parliament to make laws for Delhi. Any opposition to this bill has no constitutional basis. There is no reason for the opposition to seek to block the introduction of the bill," Shah said amid the din as opposition members trooped into the well raising slogans.

Shah also said that Article 239 A of the Constitution gives the Centre the power to bring a bill on Delhi and this has been underscored by the SC in the very same judgment that the opposition has cited.

He found support from BJD's leader in the Lok Sabha Pinalak Mishra, who quoted from the SC verdict to say that the apex court had acknowledged that Parliament had the power to change the law based on which they had ruled in favour of the Delhi government.

Opposing the introduction of the bill, the entire opposition camp vociferously argued that Parliament lacks legislative competence on the bill.

# Why India is counting on G20 to burnish its stature

In July 1963, with the Cold War at its peak, United States President John F. Kennedy felt it was far better that the leaders of the US and Soviet Union met at a summit — a term Winston Churchill coined in 1950 — than on the brink of a nuclear war. In the post-Cold War era, summits of top world leaders, especially of the multi-lateral kind, is far more frequent and takes place in contexts that may seem less urgent but are politically equally nuanced.

Hosting global conferences or international sporting events, such as the Olympics, could be an effort by an emerging economy to announce its coming of age and win international prestige. It could also help a country's incumbent leadership to renew its domestic political legitimacy.

"We notice that whenever a country hosts an Olympics or a major summit, its profile changes significantly on the world stage," Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Wednesday when he inaugurated Bharat Mandapam, the new 2,000-seater conference hall-cum-exhibition centre in the heart of New Delhi and the venue for the G20 summit next month. Modi justified the hosting of G20, India's economic growth and his government's third term. He said it is "Modi's guarantee" that in his third term, "India will be among the top three economies in the world". He said the world will witness "the rising strides of India and its growing stature" when the "grand" Bharat Mandapam hosts the G20 summit.

The decades after the end of the Second World War saw emerging economies, such as

Japan, Mexico and West Germany, signal their rise by hosting the Olympics in 1964, 1968 and 1972, respectively. Mexico hosted the 1980 North-South Summit on Cooperation and Development and key multilateral gatherings subsequently. In the 1980s, 35 years after the Korean War devastated the region, South Korea showcased its rapid economic growth, and Russia hosted the 2014 Sochi Winter Olympics. The Rio-20 Summit took place in Rio de Janeiro in 2012, and China's Hangzhou hosted the 2016 G20 Summit.

In the initial years of the United Progressive Alliance II government, India's global profile started to change. US President Obama invited PM Manmohan Singh as his guest for the first state dinner of his presidency in November 2009. In 2010, India hosted the heads of state/government of the IS, or the permanent five members of the UN Security Council, in a single year. Although New Delhi also hosted the BRICS

summit and India-ASEAN summit in 2012 with pomp, things went downhill for that government from 2011 onwards.

The 2010s weren't the first in terms of India hosting international events. After returning to power in 1990, Prime Minister Indira Gandhi started afresh to craft her global stature and India's international image. In 1982, India hosted the Asian Games. In March 1983, New Delhi hosted the Non-Aligned Movement summit and in November the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting.

While threats by non-state actors have receded in recent years, those of disruption of a world event by non-participants, such as activists and NGOs like Greenpeace, Amnesty and Human Rights Watch, are more persistent. In his speech on Wednesday, the PM lashed out at pessimistic minds in India for obstructing Bharat Mandapam's construction. "They caused a lot of turmoil and were involved in a series of legal battles," he said. Activists have protested the government evicting thousands of shanty-dwellers from the venue area, leaving them homeless. Former Ambassador Yogesh Gupta believes the G20 presidency and hosting leaders of the top global economies is a huge opportunity for India to showcase its strengths in digital technology and to put forth its perspectives on key issues like energy and food security. "The group comprises 85 per cent of the global GDP, and if you are able to convey your point of view effectively to this group then you have reached three or less all the important players that matter," he said, adding that Modi had taken the lead on flagging the concerns of the Global South.



# Oppenheimer blazes at box office, leaving Johar's Rocky behind

Despite Karan Johar's famed magic touch at the box office, his new directorial venture after six years, *Rocky aur Rani ki Prem Kahani*, which was released last Friday, has failed to match, let alone overtake, the collections of Christopher Nolan's *Oppenheimer* in its first weekend (which began from July 21).

*Oppenheimer*, which has hit domestic box-office collections of 990 crore, is racing towards the 100-crore mark. On its first day, it hit 114 crore and ended

that weekend with 549.50 crore.

The 150-180 crore budget *Rocky aur Rani's* collections were 111 crore on the first day and 646.15 crore for the weekend. According to PVR Inox estimates, ticket sales fell by around 30 per cent on Monday over the first day.

"It has come as a big surprise for us that *Oppenheimer's* collections performed better than *Rocky* despite being dubbed only in Hindi and no other regional language," said Kamal Ghanchandan, chief of business planning strategy at PVR and president of the Multiplex Association of India.

He added: "We expect *Oppenheimer* to go strong, especially in IMAX screens, and continue for another 3-4 weeks. While *Rocky* has performed according to our expectations, *Oppenheimer* has exceeded our expectations."

He pointed out that *Oppenheimer*, which has been shot on IMAX cameras, has been running in over 22 IMAX theatres where ticket prices are high. Estimates suggest these tickets account for 20 per cent of the movie's box-office revenues.

But trade analyst Komal Nahta said the difference is in the content: "*Oppenheimer* has

better content. While *Rocky aur Rani* is a good film, there is nothing compelling in the content or presentation or any novelty for which viewers would be ready to pay a premium."

*Rocky aur Rani* is a weekend film in that numbers could dip on weekdays, while *Oppenheimer* is seeing steady viewership throughout the week. Nahta estimated *Oppenheimer* will achieve over 100 crore by this weekend. "For an English film, which is so dense, it is a small achievement to cross 100 crore," he said.
