Federer swansong ends in doubles loss

London, Sep 24: Tennis great Roger Federer bid adieu to his career and fans in an emotional speech here after defeat in a doubles match alongside longtime friend and rival Rafael Nadal.

The 41-year-old Swiss legend teamed up with another great of all time Nadal in his one last contest on Friday, losing a doubles match to Jack Sock/ Frances Tiafoe of the US 6-4, 6-7 (2-7), 9-11 in the Laver Cup.

"It's been a perfect journey," Federer said. "I would do it all over again." Federer, who has not played since the 2021 Wimbledon quarter-finals, announced last Thursday that he would retire from Grand Slams and the ATP Tour after the Laver Cup held from September 23 to 25 in London.

The 20-time Grand Slam winner had decided earlier that he would only play one doubles match at the Laver Cup held in London's O2 Arena.

The defeat meant Team Europe were locked at 2-2 with Team



World at the end of the opening day of the Ryder Cup-style event.

Team Europe has earlier won two singles match while Team World claimed one singles victory.

"We'll get through this somehow," said a tearful Federer. "It's been a wonderful day. I'm happy, I'm not sad. It feels great

to be here and I enjoyed tying my shoes one more time. Everything was the last time." Federer is leaving the sport 19 years after winning his first Grand Slam title at Wimbledon in 2003.

Nadal (22) and Novak Djokovic (21) have both surpassed Federer's tally of Grand Slam titles.

Jhulan confirms retirement from international game

Mumbai, Sep 24: India legend Jhulan Goswami officially confirmed her international retirement from the game after a 20-year-old career.

In the virtual press conference ahead of the final ODI against England, India star Jhulan Goswami confirmed that the game at Lord's on Saturday will be her international match.

The storied career of Goswami that began against England in 2002 will end against the sameteam. In the 20 years, the veteran pacer has made a name for herself as one of the finest players to play the game as well as revolutionised fast bowling in women's cricket in India.

The 39-year-old has 12 Tests, 203 ODIs and 68



T20Is for India, and has picked up 353 wickets across formats. Of those, 253 wickets have come in ODIs where she is the highest wicket-taker in women's cricket.

In fact, no other player bar Goswami has managed to breach the 200-wicket landmark in ODI cricket so far.

Few bowlers in women's cricket have achieved what Jhulan Goswami has been able

to, both in terms of number and impact. But while bidding farewell to the game, Goswami was candid and said that she does retire with one regret.

"Regrets in the sense, I played in two World Cup finals and if we had won one of them that would've been great for us because it is the ultimate goal for us," said Jhulan Goswami. "That's one such regret I have,

otherwise, everything else is great." India made it to the final of the 2005 and 2017 women's cricket world cup but fell short against Australia and England respectively. In the most recent edition, India failed to make it out of the group stage after losing a do-or-die clash to South Africa.

Jhulan Goswami missed the game through injury and in a crunch game, India missed the services of their talisman. In the press conference, Goswami said that recent recurring injuries were the main reason to call it a day.

"For the last two years I was thinking every series (that I played) is my last series because of injuries and ups and downs," she said.

extensive deliberations on the development of volleyball across the globe.

Samanta also requested FIVB to organise its next World Congress in Bhubaneswar and demanded to start a Regional Development Centre in Bhubaneswar to conduct refresher courses for volleyball coaches and technical officers for the sustained development of the game.

Samanta made courtesy calls on Ary Graca, FIVB president and director general FIVB Fabio Azevedo, presidents of various associations and federations of the 222 member nations.

Local favourite Harmeet Desai, the fourth seed, toyed with Deepit Rajesh Patil of Maharashtra and won 4-0. But his teammate and left-handed Manush Shah, who trailed 0-2, came back strongly to beat Telangana's SFR Snehit 4-2. The Telangana player, who began well,

lost his touch with far too many unforced errors that helped Manush seize the crucial moments and points.

Top women's seed Manika Batra dropped two games after opening positively but came back strongly to beat Kritika Sinha Roy 4-2 in her quarterfinal match. The other two quarterfinals went down to the wire with Sutirtha Mukherjee overcoming fourth-seed Reeth Rishya 4-1 and third-seed Diya Chitale overcoming the challenge of unseeded Suhana Saini.

Singapore tough opponent, opines coach ahead of tie

New Delhi, Sept 24: A confident India will look to take on Singapore in the first FIFA international friendly at the Thong Nhat Stadium in the Ho Chi Minh City in Vietnam on Saturday.
