Govt approves proposal to roll out project to explore deep ocean for resources

NEW DELHI, JUNE 16 /- The Centre today approved a proposal to roll out a "Deep Ocean Mission" to explore the deep ocean for resources and develop deep-sea technologies for sustainable use of marine resources. The decision was taken by the Union Cabinet at its meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, minister Prakash Javadekar told a press conference. "This will support the blue economy and take India into a new era," he said. The proposal for launching the "Deep Ocean Mission" came from the Ministry of Earth Sciences. Javadekar said under the mission, a mineral study will be conducted 6,000 metres deep in the ocean. The mission will also study the changes, if any, noticed due to climate change. Under the mission, he said, a study will be conducted on more deep-sea biodiversity. The minister said an advanced marine station will be set up for ocean biology under the mission.

There will also be an offshore thermal energy centre, which will help new emerging sectors. After the

U.S, Russia, France, Japan and China, India will be the sixth country to have this kind of technology, Javadekar said. "There will be good opportunities for our MSMEs and research. This will also help in our endeavour and vision towards an Atmanirbhar Bharat (self-reliant India)," he added. The estimated cost of the mission for a period of five years will be Rs 4,077 crore and it will be implemented in a phase-wise manner, according to an official statement. "The estimated cost for the first phase for the three years (2021-2024) would be Rs 2,823.4 crore. The Deep Ocean Mis-

sion will be a mission-mode project to support the blue economy initiatives of the government. The Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES) will be the nodal ministry implementing this multi-institutional ambitious mission," the statement said. The mission consists of six major components - development of technologies for deep-sea mining and manned submersible, development of ocean climate change advisory services, technological innovations for exploration and conservation of deep-sea biodiversity, a deep-ocean survey and exploration, energy and freshwater from the ocean and an advanced marine station for ocean biology. "This mission is also directed towards capacity development in marine biology, which will provide job opportunities in Indian industries. In addition, design, development and fabrication of specialised equipment, ships and setting up of the required infrastructure are expected to spur the growth of the Indian industry, especially the MSMEs and start-ups," it added. Senior minister Eshwarappa says some within BJP want CM Yediyurappa replaced

BENGALURU, JUNE 16 /- Karnataka BJP president Nalin Kumar Kateel today once again ruled out the possibility of a leadership change in the State, even as senior Minister K S Eshwarappa acknowledged that a section within the party is of the view that Chief Minister B S Yediyurappa should be replaced. The statements have come as the BJP national general secretary in-charge of Karnataka Arun Singh's three-day visit to the State begins on Wednesday amid speculations in some quarters about leadership change. Chief Minister Yediyurappa will remain in the post for the next two years. "Kateel told reporters,

and the administration" by the Chief Minister.

As part of his three-day visit, Singh would be holding a meeting with all the Ministers this evening, and during the next two days he would have one-on-one meetings with legislators and Ministers who would meet him, and finally on Friday he would take part in the State BJP core committee meeting, party sources said. Speculations have been rife for some time now that a section of the ruling BJP is trying to push for unseating Yediyurappa. However, Singh had recently ruled out replacing the Chief Minister and asserted that Yediyurappa would continue in the post. His visit comes amid growing disquiet among a section of BJP legislators like Hubli-Dharwad MLA Arvind Belladand and Tourism Minister C P Yageshwar who have made visits to Delhi to meet national leaders and expressed the feeling of some legislators "against Yediyurappa's style of functioning and requested them to rein in the Chief Minister. Leaders like MLA Basanagouda Patil Yataln

and MLC A H Vishwanath have been embarrassing the government with their statements against the functioning of the government and the Chief Minister, alleging interference from Yediyurappa's younger son and state BJP vice president B Y Vijayendra in administration. Also, the governments Chief Whip V Sunil Kumar has publicly asked BJP leadership to provide a platform, where legislators can air their grievances. This even as some BJP legislators are said to be pushing for convening legislature party meeting, pointing at certain decisions taken by the government, its functioning, handling of the COVID crisis and alleged instances of corruption among others. Amid all these activities and speculations, Yediyurappa had earlier said he would continue in the post as long as the BJP high command has confidence in him, and he had no confusion about it. He subsequently asserted that there was no confusion in the State BJP on the issue of leadership and that he would work for the development of the State during the remaining two years of the term.

Earlier too, there have been speculations in some quarters that the BJP high command is mulling leadership change in Karnataka. This is considering the 78-year-old Yediyurappa's advancing age. Though the BJP had officially rejected outright such speculation in the past, it refuses to die down, with some within the party like senior MLA Basanagouda Patil Yataln giving credence to it with his statements, setting repeated deadlines for Yediyurappa's exit. Most drugs for treating adult Covid patients not recommended for kids: Govt guidelines

NEW DELHI, JUNE 16 /- Drugs such as ivermectin, hydroxychloroquine, favipiravir and antibiotics like doxycycline and azithromycin prescribed for adult COVID-19 patients have not been recommended for treating children, according to a government guideline issued on Wednesday.



In anticipation of likely intermittent surges in the number of COVID-19 cases, the government has come out with guidelines for operationalising Covid-care services for children. The recommendations include augmenting existing Covid care facilities to provide care to children with acute coronavirus infection. According to it, once vaccines are approved for children, those with comorbid conditions having more severe manifestations of COVID-19 and poorer outcomes should be a priority group for immunisation. About the treatment of children, the guidelines by the Union Health Ministry said most drugs used in adults such as ivermectin, hydroxychloroquine, favipiravir and antibiotics such as doxycycline or azithromycin have not been tested on children for prevention or treatment of Covid infection among them. "Therefore, these are not recommended in children."

The guidelines stated it is anticipated that there may be intermittent surges in the number of coronavirus cases. "A combined effort from the private and public sector is needed to handle any surge (in cases) in the future after the withdrawal of the lockdown, school reopening or as a third wave over the next three to four months. The basic principles of equity and dignity of care should be followed," it said. The guidelines said estimates for additional bed capacity for paediatric care may be calculated based on peak daily cases in different districts during the second wave of the COVID-19 infections. From this, projections for pediatric cases and the number of admissions required can be derived, it said. "It is desirable to augment the existing Covid-care facilities to provide care to children with acute Covid. This will need additional pediatric-specific equipment, infrastructure and pediatric formulations." Also, an adequate number of trained manpower - both doctors and nurses - should be provided. The health authorities should initiate capacity building programmes for appropriate pediatric care. In standalone paediatric hospitals, separate arrangements, for example, separate beds for paediatric Covid care need to be set up," the guidelines said.

It is desirable to designate specific areas in the Covid facilities for pediatric care and parents should be allowed to accompany the child there. "For children with Multisystem Inflammatory Syndrome who test negative for acute Covid, care has to be provided by the existing pediatric facilities. These facilities also need augmentation especially HDU and can be managed at home by parents. The document provides guidance about additional requirements for infrastructure, equipment and manpower. Noting that a majority of children have asymptomatic or mild illness and can be managed at home by parents, it said treatment for symptomatic patients include paracetamol for fever and monitoring conditions such as measuring respiratory rates, difficulty in respiration, oral intake and oxygen saturation. "In a community setting, ASHA and MPW should be involved for management of children at home and also monitor to assess the need for referral and admission," the guidelines said.

The document stressed on imparting training to community health workers for picking up the red flag signs. Also, all stakeholders, including the community, should be educated by the information education communication. For improving the quality of care and bed capacity building, the guidelines recommended hand-holding of district hospitals and other facilities by medical colleges. "A few centres may be designated as regional centres of excellence for Covid care and research. These centres can provide leadership in clinical management and training. Telemedicine could be harnessed for reaching out to a large number of facilities," it said. To ensure data collection at all levels and transmission from community to higher centres, the document recommended that a national registry be launched for pediatric Covid. "There is a need to encourage and facilitate research in the area of pediatric Covid and this could cover various aspects of management. Similarly, issues of optimal treatment for MIS-C need to be addressed by clinical trials, such as comparison of low dose with high doses steroids, comparison of steroids with IVIG and others," it added.

The guidelines said that based on sero-surveillance reports, COVID-19 infection in children above 10 years of age occurs in a similar frequency to that of adults, even though among the confirmed cases less than 12 per cent are individuals less than 20 years of age. "Children have less severe disease than adults. In the majority, the infection is asymptomatic or mildly symptomatic. It is uncommon to have moderate to severe Covid among healthy children," it noted. (PTI)

HC asks Delhi govt to respond to plea challenging decision to limit non-PDS beneficiaries

NEW DELHI, JUNE 16 /- The Delhi High Court today sought response of the Delhi government on a plea challenging its non-PDS beneficiaries putting an arbitrary limit of 30 lakh beneficiaries for providing them dry ration. A vacation bench of Justices Navin Chawla and Asha Menon issued notice to the Delhi government and Centre on an application filed by the Delhi Razi Ration Adhikari Abhiyan which said food grains be given to all the needy persons.

The application has also sought direction to the AAP government to modify the May 27 guidelines to the extent that it should not be a mere one time relief measure and that the beneficiaries may receive dry ration (food grains) for every calendar month until further orders.

The petitioner's counsel said the Delhi government has been distributing dry ration to non-PDS beneficiaries at several centres. The impugned guidelines (of May 27) have put an arbitrary limit of 30 lakh beneficiaries under the scheme. This limit of 20 lakh appears to have no rational basis whatsoever. The provisioning and the estimate of the number of persons who are in need of the benefits under the scheme ought to be based on the number of people who in fact had benefitted under a similar scheme last year.

PM lauds mother for following Covid norms, isolating from child to protect him from coronavirus

NEW DELHI, JUNE 16 (PTI) Prime Minister Narendra Modi has hailed a mother of a six-year-old boy for her courage and positive thinking as she isolated herself from her son after contracting COVID-19. Pooja Verma, who lives in Sector-6 of Ghaziabad, tested positive for the coronavirus along with her husband, Gagan Kaushik. Verma, her husband and their six-year-old son live in a three-bedroom apartment and after contracting COVID-19 in April, the couple made a tough decision and decided that all three would be isolated in separate rooms. This was not easy for the six-year-old who longed for his parents' love while unable to understand what the coronavirus was or what the need for this isolation, Verma said. He kept on wondering what wrong had he done that he had to stay in a room separate from his parents, she said.

In a letter to the prime minister, she narrated her ordeal as a mother who had to stay away from her child, through a poem she had penned. The prime minister wrote back to her and while asking about the wellbeing of her family said, "I am happy that even in difficult circumstances, you and your family have fought the disease by adopting Covid-compliant behaviour for courage." He said the 'shastras' have also taught us not to lose patience and to maintain courage in times of adversity. Lauding the woman's poem, the prime minister said it expressed the worry and anxiety of a mother when she is away from her child. Prime Minister Modi expressed confidence that with her courage and positive thinking, Verma will continue to move forward and successfully face any challenge that comes in life. Due to the strict isolation undertaken by the couple, their son did not contract COVID-19, Kaushik said. He said his wife and he have fully recovered. (PTI)

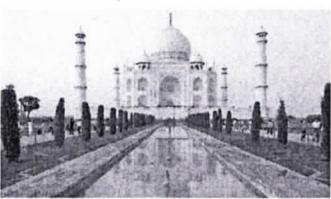
Third wave preparation: Delhi govt to train 5,000 youths as health assistants

NEW DELHI, JUNE 16 /- The Delhi government will train 5,000 youths to assist doctors and nurses as part of preparations for a possible third wave of COVID-19, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said today. The health assistants or community nursing assistants will be imparted two weeks basic training in nursing and lifecare. The training will start from June 28 in batches of 500 candidates. "I believe this move will strengthen the preparation for the third wave of Covid. Our aim is to learn from experiences across the globe such as the UK where the third wave has emerged, and to be fully prepared," Kejriwal said in an online briefing. Training applicants need to have cleared class 12 and be at least 18-years-old. Online applications for training will be received on a first come, first served basis from June 17, he said.

The health assistants will be roped in whenever their services are required during the possible third wave. They will be paid for the days they work, the chief minister said. They will be trained in basic nursing, paramedical, lifesaving, first aid home care, sample collection, oxygen concentrators and cylinders operations and other tasks, Kejriwal said. The initiative is being taken in view of shortage of medical staff witnessed during the first and the second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic. The basic training will be imparted to the selected candidates by Indraprastha University (IP) University and nine medical institutes of Delhi, he said. The Delhi government has already undertaken preparations to tackle the possible third wave of COVID-19 like arranging oxygen plants, oxygen concentrators, oxygen cylinders, and oxygen storage tanks, Kejriwal said. Tourists delighted after Taj Mahal reopens after two months

AGRA, JUNE 16 /- A 40-year-old woman from Brazil was one of the early tourists to step inside the Taj Mahal premises as the monument reopened on Wednesday after being closed for around two months due to the Covid pandemic. Melissa Dalla Rosa shared with PTI that for her is a "special moment for her to see the Taj Mahal during sunrise and being totally alone at the wonderful place." The Archaeological Survey of India has announced the reopening of all centrally protected monuments, sites and museums from Wednesday. However, the Agra administration capped the number of visitors at the Taj Mahal to 650 people at a time. Melissa, who was on a nine-week Yoga tour in India when the lockdown was announced, said, "I came to Agra yesterday from Lucknow only to explore



the city as I knew monuments were closed due to the pandemic. But I got information from locals that Taj Mahal will be reopened from Wednesday so I rushed to book my entry ticket. "I managed to book a ticket after afternoon and today, I came here very early and was the first tourist who stepped inside the premises," said Melissa. "The experience was magical. Thank you India for this opportunity," she said.

Another tourist, an Indian woman from Lucknow, shared that it was a pleasant experience as there were few tourists. "I've visited the Taj Mahal many times but today's visit was memorable. I booked tickets online and was able to see the most beautiful white marble mausoleum in the world," said Amir. "It was a 'waah Taj' moment as it looked so beautiful, birds were chirping, the sun was rising and the premises was clean," he added. Mamta Tomar, who travelled from Ghaziabad along with her family members, said they had been waiting for a long time to visit the monument. "Me and my other family members clicked photos from the central tank and captured every moment on our mobile phone," she shared. Tourists at the Taj Mahal were asked to follow Covid protocols and were thermal screened and sanitised before entering the premises. Masks were mandatory for everyone and a staff member was available to assist tourists book tickets. On the first day of its reopening, everyone seemed enthusiastic.
