Elephants run amok

While Wayanad has a burning issue with wild elephants attacking local people at regular intervals, two domesticated jumbos fought a pitched battle during a temple festival near Koyilandy in Kozhikode district killing three devotees and injuring 35 others. The incident took place at the annual Manakkulangara Bhagavathy Temple near Koyilandy Thursday night.

According to eye-witnesses, one elephant suddenly turned rogue and attacked the jumbo standing beside it. The attacked elephant panicked and ran towards the exit, bringing down a portion of the temple building.

According to Koyilandy MLA Kanathil Jameela, one of the elephants turned violent due to fireworks and loud music. When the two elephants were locked in a fight, two devotees were crushed to death. The third devotee died when the office building fell on him.

CRIME SHOW: Shah, in presence of Fadnavis, reviews Maharashtra's implementation of three new criminal laws

'Govt lawyers, judiciary should work together'

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday chaired a review meeting on the implementation of three new criminal laws in Maharashtra in the presence of state chief minister Devendra Fadnavis.

Speaking at the meeting, which reviewed the implementation and present status of various new provisions related to police, prisons, courts, prosecution and forensics in the state, Shah said the Centre wants to provide a speedy and transparent justice system to the people. For strengthening law and order, it is essential that crimes are registered and there is no delay in filing of FIRs, he added.

The Union Home Minister



Amit Shah, Maharashtra CM Devendra Fadnavis and others at a meeting in New Delhi on Friday

demanding that Maharashtra establish a model Directorate of Prosecution system in line with the new criminal laws. He said efforts should be made to achieve over 90 per cent conviction rate in cases with sentences of more than 7 years, and that the police, government lawyers, and judiciary should work together to ensure that the guilty are punished expeditiously.

Shah said senior police officers should regularly monitor cases of organized crime, terrorism and mob lynching to prevent the misuse of the sections related to these crimes. He also called for having a system for recording evidence through video conferencing in facilities such as prisons, government hospitals, banks and Forensic Science Laboratories (FSL).

The Home Minister also demanded implementation of a system where FIRs can be transferred between two states through the Crime and Criminal Tracking Network and Systems (CCTNS) and urged Maharashtra to adopt CCTNS 2.0 and ICJS 2.0.

He said the police should also provide information about individuals held in custody for interrogation on an electronic dashboard and called for improving the internet connectivity of police stations and availability of forensic science mobile vans in every police sub-division.

The meeting was also attended among others by the Union Home Secretary, the Chief Secretary and Director General of Police of Maharashtra, and the DGs of Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPRD) and the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB).

Daylight bank heist at knifepoint

In a daylight heist, a man barged into a bank, threatened staff with a knife and made off with Rs 15 lakh in Potta in Thrissur district Friday. According to reports, the incident occurred at 2:15 pm at the Federal Bank branch.

Clear CCTV footage showed the man parking his scooter outside the bank before rushing in. With most staff on lunch break, only the manager and an attendant were present.

Reports said after threatening the staff using a knife, the suspect locked them in the bathroom and broke the glass of the cash counter using a chair.

He was then seen taking the cash available at the counter which he stuffed into his backpack. Later, he was seen heading towards Thrissur. The police arrived at the spot immediately. It is not clear if the armed security guard was present when the incident took place.

Key meet between farmers & Centre deferred to Feb 22

The crucial meeting between the farm leaders and the Centre to discuss the former's demands including minimum support price (MSP) and debt waiver, which began here Friday evening were said to have been held in cordial atmosphere and the same have been deferred to February 22 for further discussion.

While the Union minister for consumer affairs, food and public distribution, Pralhad Joshi led the Central team, the two main farmer unions - Kisan Mazdoor Morcha and Samyukta Kisan Morcha (non-political) - were led by their leaders namely Sarwan Singh Pandher and Jagjit Singh Dallewal.

Dallewal had reached the meeting venue in an am-

bulance from Khanauri border where he had been on fast-unto-death since November-end.

Other than the two farm leaders, 26 other farm leaders also participated in the meeting. Addressing newsmen after the meeting - which went on for about two-and-half-an-hour - Joshi said that the meeting with the farmer leaders was held in a cordial atmosphere and it was decided to hold another round of talks for further discussion on their demands on February 22.

This meeting is expected to be chaired by the Union Agriculture minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan.

It may be recalled it is after more than a year that the talks between the farm leaders and the Central representatives have been resumed on the former's

demands as the same remained inconclusive last year following which a score of farmers continued to camp and protest at the two borders of Punjab and Haryana - Shumbhu and Khanauri borders, threatening to take their "Delhi chalo" protest to press for their demands.

The farmers also made three attempts to take out protest foot marches on December 6, 8 and 14 last year, though the same were foiled by Haryana police and Central forces by raining teargas shells leaving about 50 farmers injured.

According to farm leaders at least 60 farmers had died on the two protest sites since February last year. Also farm leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal has also been on fast-unto-death since November-end.

India-Bangladesh Border talks in Delhi next week

The border forces of India and Bangladesh will hold their bi-annual talks in Delhi next week with issues such as border fence construction and attacks on BSF personnel

and civilians by Bangladeshi criminals figuring among the discussion points, an official statement said on Friday.

The 55th Director General-Level Border Coordination Conference between BSF and the Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) will be organised

at the Border Security Force (BSF) headquarters here between February 17-20 February.

This would be the first top-level meeting between the two sides after the fall of the Sheikh Hasina government in August last year.

UFBU holds protest rally in Raipur

Bank employees staged a protest rally in capital city Raipur in support of their five points demand under the banner of the United Forum of Bank Unions (UFBU), which represents nearly 100% of bank employees. The protest was organized near the PNB Main Branch, Moti Bagh of capital city Raipur on Friday.

Bank employees' main demands are adequate recruitment in banks, implementation of a five-day banking week, resolution of pending issues, stop outsourcing of jobs, and other pending demands.

During the protest the demonstrators raised anti-establishment slogans and criticized the policies of ruling government policies and termed them anti-people.

"It has been decided to launch an agitational programme culminating in a two-day continuous strike on March 24 and 25, 2025," said UFBU in a statement, Y. Gopal Krishna, Chhattis-

garh State Secretary of All India Bank Officers Confederation (AIBOC) said that despite a mutual agreement on the 5-a day workweek, the Govt has not implemented it even though it is already existing in other financial institutions.

The officers also highlighted that there is an urgent need for adequate recruitment in all public sector banks. He mentioned that banks are generating record profits even in that context recruitment done in the sector is quite scanty creating additional pressure on bank employees.

The other bank employees' union leader joined the protest and supported the views expressed by Krishna.
