Big GST Rate Tweaks Unlikely in Saturday Meet

Council may extend concessional tax rate on vehicles purchased by visually impaired; exempt powdered millets

New Delhi: The Goods and Services Tax (GST) Council is set to meet on October 7 to consider the concessional tax rate of 8% on vehicles purchased by visually impaired persons, exemption on millets sold in powdered form, and clarify levy of tax on bank and corporate guarantees provided by directors and promoters to a company and its subsidiaries.

The fitment committee under the council, which looks at tax rates, has not recommended any significant tweaks in rates and rejected over dozen proposals by the industry and government. The Group of Ministers on rate rationalization, people privy to the matter told ET.

The committee, which comprises revenue officers from both centre and states, rejected proposal to re-

duce GST on lithium-ion batteries used in electric vehicles (EV) to 5% from 18%, reduction of compensation cess on cigarettes, reduction on services supplied by Business Correspondent to 5% from current 18% and tax exemption to institutes imparting flying training, said one of the persons quoted above.

The council decision making body for the indirect tax is also expected to take up a proposal to bring all services provided by Indian railways under the GST regime. The mechanism shifting from reverse charge mechanism, which is leading to an annual loss of ₹1,300 crore due to inability of the national transporter to claim input tax credit.

SLEW OF PROPOSALS ON AGENDA

The Council will take up a host of proposals to provide greater clarity to taxpayers under the GST regime. The Council will take up a recommendation by its law committee that corporate guarantee given by directors or promoters to subsidiaries was supply of service and the valuation for taxation can be either the remuneration in case of director and one per cent of the total guarantee amount.

The meeting will also consider another law committee recommendation to allow advocates with 15 years of practice eligible as judicial members in the GST tribunal and increase in the upper limit of chairman of appellate tribunals to 67 years from current 63 years.

The Council may provide some relief to industry in form of additional time to file appeals in tax disputes for some specific cases, the person said.

The Council could consider changes in the GST registration forms to incorporate 'One Person Company' and provide detailed clarification regarding the place of services in case of advertisement service, data centre and relocation of service and services provided through mail and courier.

The Council is also likely to discuss and review GST on various public contracts on government related constructions which are not for sale, like bridges, roads, roads, etc. The Council is also considering exemption of GST on horticulture services given on contract to maintain public parks, lawns, and public gardens where value of goods is less than 25%.

New Delhi: National transporter Indian Railways may have to rely more on imported wheels, largely from Chinese companies, as domestic supplies from Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL) and Rashtriya Ispat Nigam Limited (RINL) have been unable to keep pace with the growing demand.

While the supply of wheels from Indian Railways' production unit, SAIL, is not meeting demand, supply from other public sector undertakings sources needed a lift, said officials aware of the development.

"Availability from SAIL was also not up to mark due to capital maintenance schedule, a senior government official said.

This was significant as the national transporter must resort to importing largely from China, if domestic availability falters here.

"We were advised to expedite the supply of wheels, which are being imported from China," he added.

Issues with wheel supplies also impact output from production units of the Indian Railways and hamper repairs.

To address this demand, RINL had set up a forged wheel plant in Bhadrak, Odisha Pradesh.

"Supply of Linke Hofmann Busch (LHB) wheels from RINL is yet to stabilise. They have been urged to improve production as the wheels are in short supply in al-

In a First, Two IBBI Members Bat for ESG Focus in Insolvency Resolution

New Delhi: A paper by two senior members of the insolvency regulator has proposed an amendment to the bankruptcy law to explicitly mandate the consideration of ESG (environmental, social and governance) factors during the resolution process.

The paper by Sudhakar Shukla, full-time member of the insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (IBBI), and Asit Behra, manager of insolvency resolution at the regulator, also proposed that the role of the insolvency professional be expanded to consider ESG risks and opportunities for the bankrupt firm undergoing a restructuring process.

The paper suggests that the IBBI also back these changes with follow-up regulations, including some extra points in the evaluation matrix for those plans with ESG focus. This could effectively prompt investors to build ESG focus into their resolution plans for the stressed assets. To start with, section 30(2) of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, which deals with the submission of resolution plans, could be amended by the government, the paper proposed.

"This would align with the broader trend of increasing the economic value of companies, promoting sustainable business practices and considering the interests of a larger group of stakeholders," it said.

The IBBI, through regulations, could set out specific ESG criteria to be considered and the process for their integration into resolution plans, according to the paper. "This approach would provide flexibility, allowing for the consideration of ESG factors to be tailored to the circumstances of each case and sector," it said.

With due process of time and expenditure of incorporating such criteria, such ESG factors may be made mandatory," it said.

LPG Subsidy under Ujjwala Increased to ₹300/Cylinder; 9.6 cr Families to Benefit

New Delhi: The government on Wednesday raised the subsidy provided to poor women, who got free cooking gas connections under the Ujjwala Yojana, to Rs 300 per cylinder as it looked to blunt opposition criticism of high fuel prices. The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs raised the subsidy from ₹200 per 14.2-kg cylinders for up to 12 refills per year to ₹300 per bottle, information and broadcasting minister Anurag Thakur said here.

The move will benefit 9.6 crore families.

Ahead of assembly elections in five states, including Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan, the government had in late August cut cooking gas price by ₹200 per cylinder. After the LPG cylinder price came down to ₹903.

For Ujjwala beneficiaries, the price was Rs 703 after considering the ₹200 per cylinder subsidy, which is directly paid into the bank accounts of connection holders.

After the increase in subsidy, a 14.2-kg LPG cylinder will now cost ₹603 for Ujjwala beneficiaries.

The move follows criticism by opposition parties over the high LPG price. Parties like Congress are promising LPG cylinder at Rs 500 if voted to power.

The hike in subsidy is being seen as an attempt to blunt that criticism.

Thakur did not say how much additional subsidy would be provided to the poor households.

For 2022-23, Rs 6,100 crore was provided for the Ujjwala subsidy, which increased to Rs 7,680 crore in the current 2023-24 fiscal (April 2023 to March 2024).

The subsidy is credited directly to the bank accounts of eligible beneficiaries.

The targeted support to Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) consumers encourages them for continuous use of LPG.

The average LPG consumption of PMUY consumers increased 20 per cent from 1.01 refills in 2019-20 to 3.68 in 2021-22.

All PMUY beneficiaries are eligible for the targeted subsidy.

To make Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG), a clean cooking fuel, available to rural and deprived poor households, the government launched Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana in May 2016, to provide deposit-free LPG connections to adult women of poor households.

National Turmeric Board Established

New Delhi: The government has set up National Turmeric Board with a view to promoting production of the herb having medicinal value and increase its exports to \$1 billion or ₹8,600 crore by 2030.

With the forecasted activities of the board, it is expected that turmeric exports will reach \$1 billion by 2030," a commerce ministry statement said.

According to the statement, the board will meet on Wednesday to finalise the constitution of National Turmeric Board. The board will focus on development and growth of turmeric and turmeric products. Briefing media about the issue, Union minister Kishore Reddy said the decision fulfils the long-pending demand of farmers of Telangana.—PTI

NPCI's Overseas Arm to Sign Pact with UAE's AI Etihad Payments Today

New Delhi: NPCI International Payments Ltd, the international arm of the National Payment Corporation of India, will ink an agreement with AI Etihad Payments on Thursday in Abu Dhabi to facilitate cross-border transactions, an official said.

The MoU (Memorandum of Understanding) will be signed on the development of the domestic credit stack of the UAE based on India's RuPay debit and credit card stack, the official added. The agreement will be signed in the presence of Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal, who is leading a business delegation to Abu Dhabi from October 5 to October 8.

Goyal will co-chair the eleventh meeting of the India-UAE High-Level Task Force on Investments (HLTFI) along with Sheikh Hamed Bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Managing Director of Abu Dhabi Investment Authority.

The meeting will be attended by Mohamed Hassan Al-Suwaydi, Minister of Investment, MD and CEO of ADQ; Thani bin Ahmed Al Zeyoudi, Minister of State for Foreign Trade; Khalid Mohamed Bahama, Governor of the Central Bank of the UAE; and Ambassadors of both countries (Abdulsudhan Alishah, UAE Ambassador to India, and Sunjay Sudhir, Ambassador of India to UAE). Goyal will also hold bilateral meetings with Khaldoon Al Mubarak, CEO and MD, Muba, deputy members of the UAE-India Business Council.—PTI

Centre Scrapped 39,000 Compliances to Boost Ease of Business, Says FM

New Delhi: The Narendra Modi-led NDA government has scrapped 39,000 unnecessary compliances and 1,500 archaic laws, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said Wednesday, highlighting a raft of steps taken by authorities to ensure ease of doing business in the country.

Speaking on the occasion of the 55th foundation day of the Institute of Company Secretaries of India (ICSI), the minister said the introduction of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, simplification of regulatory framework, decriminalisation of minor offences and tax changes are among the reforms that have also bolstered the country's business climate. India received a record \$230 billion in foreign direct investment (FDI) over the last three financial years, which clearly suggests the growing interest of foreign companies to do business in India, she added.

As India prepares to be a developed nation by 2047, company secretaries should also aim to be the global standard bearer of corporate governance, she suggested.

Citing a Deloitte report, the minister said India is the top choice for global shared services and accounts for 45% of all global capability centres (outside home countries). This suggests immense scope within the country for ICSIs members and students, she added.
