Kurla man faces NIA charges in navy-Pak honey trap case

Amaan Salim Sheikh, 23, a delivery executive, was held from his residence last year; sensitive documents were found at his home, says agency

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a supplementary chargesheet against Kurla resident **Amaan Salim Sheikh, 23**, who is a key accused in the conspiracy by Pakistani Intelligence Operatives (PIO) to honey trap Indian Navy personnel and gather secret information about defense establishments. The supplementary chargesheet was filed on Thursday in the special NIA court, Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh.

After being arrested in November 2023, Sheikh, who worked as a delivery executive, was charged under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code as well as the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. The NIA's investigation revealed that Sheikh was actively collaborating with a suspected Pakistani agent Usman. Notably, the accused was receiving funds from other suspected Pakistani operatives, including Meer Balaj Khan and Alven, through cryptocurrency

channels in lieu of carrying out tasks assigned by them.

According to the NIA, Sheikh visited Pakistan in 2017-18 to meet his relatives, where he came in contact with Usman and subsequently started working for him. Later, he also got in touch with other PIOs. On Usman's instructions, he arranged a few fake SIM cards and activated them,

which were then used by Pakistani intelligence officers. The NIA teams had seized sensitive documents and two phones from Sheikh's Kurla residence during the search last year. According to sources, the investigation found that Pakistani agents had honey trapped Indian Navy officers in Visakhapatnam. Shaikh played a key role in this oper-

ation as he was in touch with escort services. The plan was to send these escorts to Navy officers, who were involved in espionage operations, and share sensitive vital defence information with Pakistani handlers.

On July 19, 2023, the NIA had filed a chargesheet against two accused, including absconding Khan. According to the chargesheet, arrested accused Aakash Solanki, who was working as an electrical artificer radio apprentice at the naval dockyard, Visakhapatnam, was passing on classified information related to warships and submarines with a suspected PIO operating under the assumed identity of 'Aditi Chouhan' as well as other unidentified individuals. Like Sheikh, Solanki also received money from Khan through crypto channels, said the NIA.

On November 6, 2023, the central agency had filed a supplementary chargesheet against Manmohan Surendra Panda (arrested) and Alven.

Hand over first slice of land for new HC by Sept: SC tells govt

The Supreme Court on Friday asked the state government to hand over the first slice of land for construction of a new Bombay High Court building by September end. A bench headed by Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud asserted that the state authorities need not wait till the end of the year to hand over the entire land and smaller areas can be given as they become available.

"We direct the Maharashtra government to make all endeavour to hand over the first tranche of land of 9.64 acre by the end of September. The government need not wait till December to hand over the entire plot," the court said. It was hearing a case under its suo motu (on its own) jurisdiction, initiated after taking note of an April 29 letter petition of Bombay Bar Association president Nitin Thakker and other bar leaders with respect to the urgent need of accommodation for the Bombay HC, whose existing building is 150 years old.

It titled the case 'Heritage Building of the Bombay High Court and allotment of additional lands for the High Court'.

Yes Bank-DHFL scam: HC grants bail to Pune builder

While granting bail to Pune-based builder Avinash Bhosale two years after his arrest, the Bombay High Court on Friday observed that bail need not be denied only because the person is accused of an economic offence.

Justice NJ Jamadar granted relief to Bhosale in the Dewan Housing Finance Corporation Ltd (DHFL)-Yes Bank in the corruption case, being probed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), on furnishing a personal bond of Rs1 lakh. Bhosale, chairman and founder of ABIL Group, was arrested by the CBI on May 26, 2022, and was in judicial custody. However, he has been admitted to a hospital for treatment. During the major part of his custody, he was admitted in different hospitals and currently he is admitted at St George's Hospital.

The bench noted that it was not an "immutable rule of law that the accused be denied bail in serious economic offences". The parameters which govern the grant of bail in other categories of offences equally govern the case where a person is accused of an economic offence, Justice Jamadar said. The judge said that while the

court ought to be cognisant of the fact that the economic offences have serious ramifications, however, where other parameters are fulfilled, bail need not be denied on the score that the person is accused of an economic offence. "In the light of the prima facie consideration of the prosecution case, the amount of alleged fraud attributable to the applicant gets significantly scaled down. That bears on the gravity of the allegation," Justice Jamadar added. Also, the investigation in the case is complete and three chargesheets have been filed already, the court said. Further, Bhosale has been in

custody since two years and is facing prosecution for offences such as cheating, criminal conspiracy and criminal breach of trust by a public servant under the Indian Penal Code and under relevant provisions of the Prevention of Corruption Act.

Applicability of the offence punishable under the IPC section 409 (criminal breach of trust by a public servant), qua the role attributed to the applicant, appears contentious, the court added. "The applicant (Bhosale) cannot be prima facie roped in for the offence punishable under the IPC section 409, which entails punishment of imprisonment for life," the judge said in a detailed order.

According to the CBI, Bhosale received kickbacks from Yes Bank founder Rana Kapoor, also an accused in the case, in return for diverting funds. Kapoor had disbursed Rs3,983 crore to DHFL, which were proceeds of crime. Of this amount, DHFL disbursed loans aggregating to a whopping Rs2,420 crore to three group concerns of Radius Group. Bhosale allegedly received Rs350 crore kickbacks from Radius group for facilitating loans from DHFL in the form of consultancy services payments, the CBI claimed.

Murders of Laila Khan, kin: Death sentence sought for actor's stepdad

The prosecution on Friday sought capital punishment for Parvez Tak, stepfather of actor Laila Khan, as he has been held guilty for killing her and her mother and four siblings in February 2011. Tak, a resident of Kashmir and third husband of Khan's mother Shelina, was arrested on July 8, 2012. Fourteen years after the murders, the court recently pronounced him guilty for killing Laila, 30, her elder sister Azmina, 32, twin siblings Zara and Imran, 25, cousin Reshma and Shelina, 51. The family had gone missing in February 2011 from Mumbai.

Public prosecutor Pankaj Chavan on Friday sought death penalty for Tak, while referring to the guidelines set by the apex court in the 1980 case against Bachan Singh. Chavan said that the murders were committed in an inhumane way as the victims were helpless women and children, and one of them was also a public figure. He contended that the case satisfies all the conditions set out by the top court to award a capital punishment. "They (victims) trusted him (Tak) hence they went with him. He has killed six people in one go in their own house," Chavan argued.

The defence objected to Chavan's appointment as public prosecutor. "A special public prosecutor was appointed, who conducted the case for 12 years," said defence lawyer Wahab Khan. He further contended that after the appointment of the special public prosecutor was cancelled, Chavan has been assigned to handle the case. "What if his appointment is held illegal and he was not authorised to make submissions," asked Khan. Chavan argued that his appointment is legal.

The victims were last seen in Igatpuri with Tak and a few days later, Khan's Igatpuri house was set on fire. The actor's biological father had filed a missing complaint for Khan and other victims at the Oshiwara police station. The court will hear the arguments on May 21.

Man booked for rape on job pretext

A 50-year-old man has been booked for allegedly raping a woman on the pretext of helping her secure a job. The accused was identified as Joseph Xavier, who also runs an NGO.

In her complaint lodged with the Worli police station on May 17, the victim, 24, said that the incident took place on the night of May 16. She further said that she lives in Navi Mumbai and was hunting for a job. In the same regard, she had sought the help of her friend Zuber, who then shared Xavier's contact with her.

On May 16 at 10 pm, Zuber called her, asking her to meet Xavier at the Khar station to discuss a job opportunity. Upon reaching the spot, she found that the accused was accompanied by Zuber and his friends. All of them went to a hotel where Joseph drank alcohol and offered it to the woman, which she consumed. They left by midnight and Zuber and his friends went home, while Xavier offered to drop the victim at Khar station on his scooter. However, he took her to a parking place and asked her to sit in a car. He started drinking again inside the vehicle. Later, he drove to Worli and allegedly raped her.

Was raped on express train, alleges woman

April 19, the woman filed a written complaint at the Gwalior railway police station. A case was registered under the Indian Penal Code sections 328 (causing hurt by means of poison, etc., with intent to commit an offence) and 376 (rape). According to Thane railway police, the case was transferred to them almost 60 days after the incident. The LTT's CCTV footage of the day is not available, said the cops, adding that they have checked the reservation list of Tuls Express and other trains that started from LTT around that time. They came to know that the complainant was travelling without a ticket. The police also inquired with ticket checkers, who were deployed on Tuls Express, Gorakhpur Express and Kushinagar Express on the day of the incident. However, they said that they know nothing about the rape.

A railway cop said that when the Gwalior police asked the complainant to undergo a medical examination, she refused.
