# Service delivery camps to be held in every office

The second phase of Mukhya Mantri Jan Seva Abhiyan (Chief Minister public service campaign) will start from May 10. Service delivery camps will be organised in all the field offices providing 67 services to the citizens identified in the campaign. The campaign will run till May 25.

The General Administration Department has issued instructions to department heads, commissioners, collectors, panchayats and urban bodies for successful operation of the campaign. It has been said that banners of the second phase of Mukhya Mantri Jan Seva Abhiyan should also be put up in all the offices.

All collectors will nomi-

nate specific nodal officers for each office in their districts where the camps will be held. Information related to the applications of the identified 67 services which are pending online or offline in the respective offices before the start of the campaign for their disposal during the campaign and each day's disposal will be recorded on the portal. Recording in the redressal of applications for prescribed services received during the campaign period will also be ensured in the portal.

The number of the camp of the district will also be registered on the portal. Suitable arrangements for seating and drinking water etc. will also be made for the applicants coming to each office. It will be ensured that after the end of the campaign, no eligible

applications of the 67 identified services are left.

Out of all the complaints received during the campaign, the District Collector will be able to separately identify such complaints, which are not possible to be resolved due to budgetary reasons, policy decisions, pending cases in civil or high courts.

It will be ensured that all the remaining complaints are resolved in the campaign. All the complaints registered till April 15, 2023 but currently pending on the CM Helpline Portal will be displayed separately. This service will be made live from 5 May 2023 on the CM Helpline Portal.

For registering on the portal the number of applications received daily in the campaign for the marked ser-

vices and the number of rejected applications by the Revenue, General Administration, Public Health and Family Welfare, Energy, Tribal Welfare, Higher Education, MP State Agricultural Marketing Board, Co-operative, Technical Education, Skill Development and Employment, Horticulture and Transport Department, the login ID and password will be given to the District Collector, Chief Executive Officer, District Panchayat for rural areas of the district, and for municipal areas, as the case may be, to the Commissioner Municipal Corporation, Project Officer Urban Development Agency or the chief municipal officer of the municipality of the district headquarters.

# Toddler raped by neighbour in Chhatarpur

Bhopal: A three-year-old girl child was raped in a village in Chhatarpur district in Madhya Pradesh by her neighbour on Thursday night, police said, adding that they have arrested the accused.

Chhatarpur superintendent of police (SP) Amit Sanghi said they arrested the 24-year-old accused. Police said that the girl was referred to Gwalior Medical College on Friday afternoon, where she is undergoing treatment.

Chhatarpur, Rajnagar sub-divisional police officer Manmohan Singh said that the child was playing outside her house when the accused, who lives in the neighbourhood, took her to a lonely place and raped her.

In honor of Gautam, Daimari also organized a dinner at his official residence. The delegation held a meeting with various key committees of the Assam Legislative Assembly today. During this, ideas related to parliamentary work were shared. Prior to this, delegate visited Maa Kamakhya temple.

Prior to this, the delegation reached Delhi from Bhopal on April 30 morning and Gautam visited the new Madhya Pradesh Bhawan there. During this, he also gave some suggestions to the officers present there to make better arrangements. The delegation reached Agartala, the capital of Tripura, late at night and held a meeting with a high-level delegation of the Tripura assembly the next day on May 1.

In this meeting too, topics focused on e-legislation and parliamentary procedures were discussed. Apart from this, Shri Gautam visited the historical Jalmahal of Agartala and visited Mata Tripura Sundari Temple. It has also been given the place of a Shaktipeeth in Sanatan traditions.

# Cops on foot patrolling in the State

More than 20000 police officers and employees went on foot patrol together in the state, on the instructions of the Chief Minister, the police took to the streets to increase the sense of security among citizens.

DGP Sudhir Kumar Saxena patrolled 10 km on foot, interacting with citizens.

Foot patrolling done to promote basic policing. Police officers and employees took stock of law and order across the state. All IG and Commissioner of Police, DIG and Additional CP, SP and DCP, Additional SP, SDOP and police station and outpost in-charge patrolled on foot.

On Saturday, May 6, including DGP Sudhir Kumar Saxena, more than 20000 police officers and personnel came out on the streets together in the entire state and took stock of the law and order situation.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi had also emphasized on the effectiveness of foot patrolling in the 57th All India Conference of Directors General and Inspectors General of Police held in New Delhi in the month of January. He also mentioned

the foot patrolling being done by the Madhya Pradesh Police, along with instructions to further strengthen the traditional police system like foot patrolling etc.

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan had recently given instructions in the law and order review meeting that basic policing should be promoted. Emphasis was also placed on foot patrolling to maintain a sense of general security among the general public and to increase the visibility of the police on the roads.

Police should be strict against the elements who disturb peace and law and order. He also said that our police should be tougher than thunderbolts for criminals and soft like flowers for citizens.

# Priyanka Gandhi to sound poll bugle in MP

Priyanka Gandhi Vadra will kickstart the Congress' campaign for the year-end Madhya Pradesh Assembly polls from Jabalpur next month, a senior party leader said.

The last Assembly elections in MP were held on November 28, 2018. "Priyanka ji will launch the party's campaign and 'Sankalp 2023' on June 12 here," Jabalpur mayor and Congress' city chief Jagat Bahadur Singh told.

The Congress general secretary will hold a 2-km road-

show in the city and address a rally, Singh said. "We are expecting a crowd of 1.5 to 2 lakh. For this we are going to hold meetings of leaders in Mahakoshal area shortly," Singh said.

Her final programme will be out in three or four days, he said. "She is coming to Jabalpur on June 12 for sure. I have been informed about it and asked by the state leadership to make preparations for it," he said.

People in Mahakoshal area (Jabalpur division having eight districts) feel neglected by the BJP, said the Congress

leader. "We did well (last time) in the area. This time around we are going to sweep elections in the region," he said.

The last MP polls threw up a hung Assembly, with the Congress emerging as the largest party with 114 seats in the 230-member House. The Congress formed a coalition government under Kamal Nath, but it fell in March 2020 after several MLAs loyal to Jyotiraditya Scindia walked out and joined the BJP, paving the way for Shivraj Singh Chouhan to return as chief minister.

# Mayor Malti Rai inspects localities in ward 36, 38 and 69

Bhopal: Mayor Malti Rai is constantly inspecting the cleanliness arrangements in different areas of the city with a view to ensure cleanliness activities as per the norms prescribed under Swachhata Survekshan-2023 and to motivate common citizens for active participation in cleanliness activities and the corporation.

Apart from giving necessary guidelines to the staff, she is also holding discussions on cleanliness with citizens and businessmen.

In the same sequence, on Saturday, Mayor Rai inspected the drains, markets and residential areas located in various areas of ward number 36, 38 and 69 under zone number 09 and made sure to ensure regular and better cleaning of drains, doors Instructions were

given to make the door-to-door garbage collection and cleaning system more efficient, and to take spot fine action against those who cause disruption in the cleaning system by spreading filth.

She appealed to cooperate to make Bhopal the cleanest and plastic free city of the country.

Further she inspected the drains, residential settlements, markets etc. located in the areas of Ektapuri, Hinautia, Parihar Chauraha, Ashoka Garden, 80 Feet Road, Semra etc. After discussing with businessmen she also took feedback.

Mayor gave instructions for regular and better cleaning of roads, market areas, public places and drains, instructed to further strengthen the door-to-door garbage collection sys-

tem and collect garbage from 100 percent areas. Mayor Rai directed that the garbage should be kept in different dustbins and given to different garbage collectors. Instructed to compulsorily keep two dustbins at the shops, to transport only segregated garbage in garbage vehicles.

During this, the Mayor held a cleanliness dialogue with the residents and businessmen of different areas and advised them to keep different types of waste in different dustbins and give them to the cleaning friend who collects the waste separately. While discussing with the businessmen, advised to keep two dustbins at the shops and to use cloth bags and steel utensils instead of polythene and single use plastic materials.
