New Era Mother and Child Hospital Achieves Breakthrough in Treating Rare Fetal Hydrothorax

Nagpur 15 Feb: New Era Mother and Child Hospital today announced the successful treatment of a complex fetal hydrothorax case, underscoring its leadership in fetal medicine. Dr. Kiranshree Bakane Foetal Medicine Expert performed a minimally invasive thoracoamniocentesis guided by real-time ultrasound, to drain the fluid and relieve pressure on the fetus's lungs and heart. Post-procedure monitoring showed remarkable improvement. Later Cesarean delivery conducted by Dr. Ritu Dargan. With good post natal care and drainage of pleural fluid in newborn's chest, baby is doing well and discharged in

stable conditions to home. Dr. Anand Sancheti, Director, stated, "This case demanded precision and collaboration. Our team's swift decision-making and expertise in fetal interventions were pivotal in navigating risks and ensuring recovery." First honour for Nagpur: NMC to get 40 e-buses under PM E-Bus Scheme in May

Nagpur 15 Feb: As part of the PM E-Bus Seva initiative, the Central Government is set to roll out electric buses across various cities in India, with Nagpur Municipal Corporation (NMC) receiving the first allocation. Under this initiative, 40 electric buses will arrive in May 2025, marking a significant step toward strengthening Nagpur sustainable public transport system. A central team from the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), New Delhi, visited Nagpur on Friday to assess the progress of the project. The team expressed satisfaction over the ongoing preparations by the NMC Transport Department. Officials present during the review include Ram Paunikar, Deputy Team Leader, MoHUA, Amandeep Kumar, Senior Transport Planner, Mishra, Advisor, Kalyan Reddy, JBM Company Representative, and senior officials from CESL and bus suppliers. From NMC, officials including Transport Manager



Vinod Jadhav, Administrative Officer Ravindra Page, Operations Manager Rajiv Ghatole, Deputy Engineer Kedar Mishra, and Electrical Engineer Prashant Kalbande were present. Development of Khapri & Koradi depots underway to support the expansion of Nagpur's bus transportation system, the Central Government has sanctioned a total of 150 electric buses for the city. Additionally, Khapri and Koradi depots will be upgraded with modern infrastructure under this initiative. Koradi depot is expected to be fully operational by April 2025. Mahavitaran

(MSEDCL) has almost completed the 33KV high-tension power supply line for Koradi. Infrastructure development and power connection work for both depots is currently underway. Nagpur to become a key e-bus hub with dedicated funding from the Central Government. Nagpur is poised to become a leading city in India's electric public transport network. The PM E-Bus Seva initiative aims to reduce carbon emissions, improve urban mobility, and provide efficient and eco-friendly transport solutions to citizens.

Fadnavis on Friday reached Uttar Pradesh Prayagraj to perform Aarti and Snan at the Kumbh Mela. Fadnavis congratulated CM Yogi Adityanath for wonderful arrangements at Maha Kumbh. Expressing joy over his visit, Fadnavis said, I am very happy that I could attend Maha Kumbh with my family today. I congratulate Yogi ji for the wonderful arrangements made here. Every person visiting Maha Kumbh is happy. A new record is being made with the number of devotees visiting here. The world is surprised to see the management of Maha Kumbh and the number of people visiting here. Amruta Fadnavis also said, "We are very happy that we are among the 50 crore people who have taken this holy dip of devotion during Maha Kumbh. I want to thank Yogi ji. We are making efforts to ensure that the next Kumbh in Nashik is also grand and has good arrangements." Fadnavis on Tahawwur Rana's extradition CM Devendra Fadnavis said Maharashtra is



prepared to lodge Tahawwur Rana, an accused in the 26/11 Mumbai attacks, in jail once he is extradited from the United States. "We kept Kasab. We can keep him (Tahawwur Rana) too," he said. Fadnavis further referred to the security measures implemented for Ajmal Kasab, one of the terrorists involved in the 2008 Mumbai attacks. He also thanked Prime Minister Narendra Modi for his efforts in securing Rana's extradition. He noted that the US had previously been reluctant to extradite Rana despite evidence linking him to the planning of the 26/11 attacks. "The US has agreed to the extradition of the mastermind behind the 26/11 attacks, Tahawwur Rana. I thank PM Modi for this... Previously, we conducted an online investigation that proved Pakistan's involvement in the attack. He was under America's protection, and they were not ready to extradite him. After PM Modi's efforts, President Trump has agreed to it. I consider this a very important development," the Maharashtra CM said.

Up: Ten killed, 19 injured as SUV collides with bus in Prayagraj



Prayagraj, Feb 15: Ten people were killed and 19 others were injured in a head-on collision between a bus and an SUV in the Meja area of Prayagraj district in Uttar Pradesh, a police officer said here on Saturday. Deputy Commissioner of Police (Yamuna Nagar) Vivek Chandra Yadav said that the incident took place late on Saturday night when devotees from Korba in Chhattisgarh were going to take bath in Prayagraj Mahakumbh in the SUV. He said near Manupura village on the National Highway the SUV collided head-on with the bus going towards Prayagraj. "All 10 were killed travelling in the SUV were people on the spot. The bus passengers also got injured and were sent to their destination after first aid," he said. Chief

Minister Yogi Adityanath expressed grief over the accident and expressed condolences to the bereaved families. He directed the officials to immediately reach the spot and expedite the relief work and directed the district administration officials to provide proper treatment to the injured. The DCP expressed apprehension that the incident took place as the SUV driver dozed off at some point due to the long distance, which led to the accident. "The deceased have been identified as Somnath (28), Ishwari Prasad Jaiswal (56), Santosh Soni (55), Bhagirathi Jaiswal (43), Saurabh Soni (55), Ganga Verma (54), Shiv Rajput (60), Deepak Verma and Raju Shahu, all residents of Korba in Chhattisgarh," he said.

Unauthorised Markets Crowd City, Causing Traffic Jams



Nagpur 15 Feb: The city is struggling with a growing number of unauthorised weekly markets, which are causing severe traffic congestion and encroachment issues. While only 12 markets have been officially sanctioned, 52 operate without approval, turning streets into chaotic vending zones. Despite the increasing obstruction, both the Municipal Corporation and the police seem indifferent to the problem. Consequently, the Municipal Corporation bears the burden of hefty fines amounting to crores of rupees each year.

department staff, further straining civic resources. Hawkers and handcart vendors have occupied major roads and public squares, converting them into makeshift markets. The presence of carts and vehicles selling fruits, vegetables, and other essentials has led to severe congestion. Even in areas where police are stationed, vendors continue their business without intervention. The unchecked growth of these markets has turned bustling streets into disorderly zones, making pedestrian movement and vehicle passage increasingly difficult. Parking Woes Add to

the Chaos In many of these unauthorised markets, vehicles are parked haphazardly on the roads, further blocking movement. Although authorities have the power to penalize offenders, the lack of enforcement has led to worsening traffic conditions. What were once wide, well-structured roads have now shrunk, forcing commuters to navigate through narrow, congested lanes. Traffic Hazards and Safety Risks Key roads, such as the Ring Road, have also been affected by these weekly markets. On Saturdays, the stretch between Manewada Chowk and Udaynagar Chowk is nearly impassable due to market encroachment. Vendors occupy sidewalks and even large portions of the road, leading to long traffic jams. The situation poses a serious safety hazard, increasing the risk of accidents if left unaddressed. Immediate action is needed to regulate these markets and restore order to the city's roads.

Film city will be built on 128 acres of land near Ramtek



Nagpur 15 Feb: A film city will be built near Ramtek to promote the film production in Vidarbha. State Cultural Affairs Minister Ashish Shelar said that 128 acres of land has been earmarked near Ramtek for the film city. The proposal to transfer this land will be submitted to the District Magistrate within the next 15 days. It has been decided to

appoint a consultant to make the film city. Minister of State Ashish Jaiswal said that this is a necessary initiative for the progress of Vidarbha and earlier the artists of Vidarbha had to go to Mumbai. Many efforts are being made to establish a film city in central India, the site in Ramtek has now been finalized and its GR has also been issued.
