Hyderabad FC hold Bagan 1-1

Roy Krishna and Manvir Singh looked threatening up front but missed a flurry of chances, while Subrata Pal pulled off some fine saves under the Hyderabad post

MARGAO: Hyderabad FC rode on Joao Victor's second half penalty to hold ATK Mohun Bagan to a 1-1 draw, maintaining their unbeaten run in the Indian Super League, here on Friday.

The duo of Roy Krishna and Manvir Singh looked threatening up front but missed a flurry of chances, while veteran Subrata Pal pulled off some fine saves under the Hyderabad post to keep a clean score-sheet in the first-half.

Manvir finally broke the deadlock in the 54th minute capitalising on a defensive lapse by Odei Onaindia.

But the Mariners' joy lasted just over 10 minutes as they conceded a soft penalty after Nikhil Poojary was brought down by Manvir with a faint touch.

The Brazilian midfielder pounced on the opportunity



with a thunderous strike that kissed Arindam Bhattacharja's fingers before getting into the back of the net.

The result meant ATK Mohun Bagan failed to get

a win from two matches to remain on second spot with 10 points from five matches. ATKMB had lost to Jamshedpur FC in their last match.

Playing with just two foreigners in Onaindia and Victor, the 'Men in Yellow' on the other put up a cohesive show and put up a creditable show to remain unbeaten with six points from four matches.

ATKMB had an early opportunity in the ninth minute when Roy Krishna came close to scoring after Pritam Kotla delivered an inch-perfect cross at the far post.

But Pal stood in their way thwarting Roy Krishna's powerful header.

Roy Krishna was at it again in the 17th minute after a perfect run into the box but the Fijian's effort went wide at the far post.

Rohit clears to leave for A

NEW DELHI: Senior India batsman Rohit Sharma on Friday cleared an eagerly-watched fitness test at the National Cricket Academy in Bengaluru and will leave for Australia on December 14, three days before the start of the marquee Test series against the world's number one team.

Rohit had sustained a hamstring injury during the IPL, which led to him missing the white-ball leg of the ongoing tour. He is also out of reckoning for the first two Tests but can now be there for the last two games.

"Rohit has cleared the fitness Test and will soon be flying out to Australia," a senior BCCI official told PTI on conditions of anonymity.

Rohit's fitness test took place under the supervision of NCA director Rahul Dravid, who is entrusted with the responsibility of giving him his fitness certificate.

Tokyo Games sponsors pay \$3.3 billion, but more still needed

TOKYO: Domestic sponsors have already contributed a record of \$3.3 billion to help pay for the Tokyo Olympics. That's at least twice as much as any previous Games.

But it's still not enough. Now they're being asked to pay millions more to cover some of the soaring costs of the one-year postponement.

This comes as Japanese businesses are battered by the COVID-19 pandemic, raising doubts about re-investing in an Olympics that may be short on fans, but long on pandemic-related rules to discourage tourists, sightseeing and spending.

We are in the process of asking for additional sponsorship (payments) from our partners, organizing committee CEO Toshiro Muto said last week as he detailed why the postponement will cost organizers and Japanese taxpayers an extra \$2.8 billion.

The sponsors have expressed the willingness to contribute to the Games next year. But they have not specified an amount.

None of the nearly 70 domestic sponsors is saying "no" at least publicly to an Olympics backed by Prime Minister Yoshihide Suga, and driven by Japan's powerful advertising conglomerate Dentsu Inc., the official marketing agency for the Tokyo Olympics.

Paes eyeing 'unbreakable' record eighth straight Olympics in Tokyo

KOLKATA: Indian tennis icon Leander Paes on Friday said he is preparing hard to participate in next year's Tokyo Games to make it a record eighth straight Olympic appearance.

On the Christmas Day of 2019, Paes had announced his 'One Last Roar' tagline, calling 2020 to be his last season as a professional player, culminating with the Tokyo Olympics.

"None of us then imagined that we would get hit by such a big pandemic. It has made all of us introspect...", Paes said at the launch of 'Motovolt Mobility Smart E-Cycles' here.

"But after this long break, I feel happy. I've no doubt in my mind that physically, mentally and emotionally I would be ready."

"For me it's very important to ensure that India's name stays in the history books and that is why I've continued my career for 30 years."



Paes would turn 48 by the time Tokyo Olympics, slated to begin on July 23, happens but he said age is just a number and he has the big motivation to ensure that India's name stays forever in the record books.

"I already have the record at seven and I've the motivation that if I can push that up to eight Olympics, my belief is that India forever will stay in the history books as the most number of Olympics played in tennis. I'm hoping Tokyo comes around, the event happens."

All-round Bumrah headlines opening day for India as Australia A bowled out for 108

SYDNEY: Pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah headlined the opening day's play with a maiden first-class fifty and a couple of wickets in an impressive all-round effort to put India in the driver's seat against Australia A in the pink ball warm-up game on Friday.

With his unbeaten 55 off 57 balls, Bumrah was the top-scorer for the visitors, who folded for a disappointing 108 in 48.3 overs at the Sydney Cricket Ground.

The Indians, however, came back strongly with the ball to bundle out Australia for 108 at stumps as 20 wickets fell on a curtailed day on which almost an hour was lost due to heavy rain.

India's four-pronged pace attack did well to intimidate Australian youngsters with short-pitched stuff as Mohammed Shami and Navdeep Saini got three wickets apiece.

On a day when the recognised batsmen struggled to put runs on the board, Bum-

rah, who came into the game with a Test batting average of 2.9, produced a stellar performance with the willow, smashing the ball six times to the fence and twice over it.

The 27-year-old, known for his wily bowling, reached his half-century in style, hooking a bouncer by all-rounder Will Sutherland for a huge six over the deep square-leg fence.

Bumrah and fellow pacer Mohammed Siraj stitched a valuable 71-run partnership for the 10th wicket before the Indian innings ended with a semblance of respectivity.

Pleasantly surprised with his batting heroics, Bumrah's teammates got up, clapped and gave him a guard of honour when he walked back into the dressing room.

Earlier, after skipper Ajinkya Rahane opted to bat, Prithvi Shaw (40) and Shubman Gill (43) -- both 21-year-old batsmen with bright futures -- showed

enough glimpses of why they are rated so highly by almost everyone in the Indian cricket fraternity.

However, the rest of the teammates including the seasoned Rahane, failed to impress on the first day of their final tune-up before the four-match Test series beginning December 17 with a day-nighter in Adelaide.

The two specialist wicket-keepers -- Wriddhiman Saha (0) and Rishabh Pant (5) -- fell cheaply with the former failing to open his account after the likes of Mayank Agarwal and Hanuma Vihari were also dismissed early.

But the most distraught will be the duo of Shaw and Gill, both getting out after promising so much with their dazzling strokes and positive approach.

The Australians bowled out India for a low score but they wouldn't be too happy with the way their batting panned out during the day's play.

Wimbledon champ, Tennis Hall of Famer Alex Olmedo dead at 84

SANTA MONICA (US): Alex Olmedo, who won the Wimbledon and Australian Championships singles titles in 1959 and was inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 1987, has died. He was 84.

Citing Olmedo's son, Alejandro Jr., the Hall of Fame said Thursday that Olmedo died of

brain cancer on Wednesday.

Alejandro Alex Olmedo was born in Peru in 1936 and moved to the United States as a teenager. He went to the University of Southern California, where he won NCAA tennis championships in singles and doubles in both 1956 and 1958.

Olmedo played in the Davis

Cup for the United States and led the team to the trophy in 1958, when he also paired with Ham Richardson to win the doubles title at the U.S. National Championships, the tournament now known as the U.S. Open.

That was followed by Olmedo's historic 1959 season, which

in addition to a victory over Rod Laver in the Wimbledon final and his triumph at the tournament now called the Australian Open included a run to the final at the U.S. National Championships.

That was when Grand Slam tournaments were closed to professional players. Olmedo

turned pro in 1960.

Alex Olmedo came from humble beginnings and he made sacrifices and worked hard to chase his dreams of a tennis career, ultimately becoming a major champion and Hall of Famer, International Tennis Hall of Fame President Stan Smith said in a statement

Napoli, Real Sociedad, Young Boys advance in Europa League

NAPLES: Napoli and Real Sociedad both advanced from a tightly contested Europa League group after a 1-1 draw on Thursday, with William Jos netting a crucial equalizer for the Spanish team in the 90th minute.

The result meant Napoli finished top of Group F, while Sociedad edged ahead of AZ Alkmaar into second. Alkmaar would have advanced with a win but lost 2-1 at already eliminated Rijelka.

Swiss club Young Boys also advanced with a 2-1 comeback win over Cluj after a wild finish that saw two goals and three red cards in injury time.

Norway's Molde also made the round of 32 after a 2-2 draw with Rapid Vienna in the final round of group-stage matches.

Wolfsberg and Maccabi Tel-Aviv took the final two spots in the knockout rounds.

Premier League leader Tottenham blanked Royal Antwerp 2-0 to finish top in its group.

Already qualified with two games to spare, Arsenal made it six wins from six with a 4-2 away victory at Dundalk.

The match between Group I winner Villarreal and last-place Qarabag was postponed after several players from the Kazakh club tested positive for the Coronavirus. It was unclear whether the game would be rescheduled or whether UEFA would award a forfeit win to Villarreal.

A total of 18 clubs were already through ahead of the final games while eight more teams, including Manchester United, dropped into the last 32



as third-place finishers in their Champions League groups.

The draw for the round of 32 is scheduled for Monday.

A minute of silence was observed at the stadiums to honor Italian soccer great Paolo Rossi, who died after a long illness at the age of 64.

Napoli only needed a draw at home against Sociedad and went 1-0 up after Piotr Zielinski netted from the edge of the area with a right-foot shot after the visitors failed to clear a corner kick.

Sociedad looked to be going

out but a cross into the area in injury time fell to William Jos, and he blasted a shot high into the net to send his team through. Napoli finished with 11 points, two more than Sociedad. Alkmaar had eight.

Cluj needed to beat Young Boys to overtake the Swiss team and advance and went ahead when substitute Gabriel Debeljuh scored in the 84th m Cluj goalkeeper Cristian Balgradean was given a red card and conceded a penalty at the start of injury time, allowing Young Boys to equalize.
