Three arrested for killing liquor shop securityman

The security guard of a liquor shop, who was attacked by some youths at the establishment in the Bhanwarkuan area, died during treatment late on Monday. The police said he had told the accused not to drink liquor in front of the shop after which they started an argument with him. The police have detained three people, including a minor boy, in connection with the incident and they are being questioned further. Bhanwarkuan police station-in-charge Shashikant Chourasiya said the inci-

dent took place at the liquor shop near Limbodi gate on August 12. Security guard Ashok Rao, a resident of the Pipliyarao area, had seen two persons on a bike drinking outside the liquor shop. When he told them to go away from there, they started arguing with him. After that, Ashok called the liquor shop employees, who slapped an accused and told them to go away. After a few minutes, the accused, along with their minor friend, reached the place and again started an argument with Ashok. The situation turned tense and one of the accused threw a stone, which hit Ashok in the head and he fell uncon-

scious. After this, the accused managed to flee from the spot. Ashok was rushed to hospital and died on Monday night during treatment. It was a challenge for the police to identify the accused. The CCTVs of the liquor shop were checked and the police managed to identify the criminals involved. On Tuesday, the accused, named Rajesh and Vikas, along with their minor friend, were arrested. The accused informed the police that, following an argument, they had attacked the security guard with a stone on the spot. The police are questioning the accused further.

Court, inaugurated the exhibition. On this occasion, justice Vijay Kumar Shukla, justice Subodh Abhyankar, justice Satyendra Singh, justice Pranay Verma, justice Rajendra Verma and justice Amarnath Kesharwani were present. President of the High

Gajankush and various advocates were also present. At the exhibition, rare and historical newspapers of August 15, 1947-which comprised Hindi, English and regional language newspapers of India and abroad-were showcased. The compilation of historical photos of newspapers published in Australia, America, Ireland, Pakistan and so forth was also showcased. The exhibition received a good response from visitors, as well. Incidentally, the grandfather of justice Verma, late Motilal Verma, was also a freedom-fighter. He worked with Shaheed Chandrashekar Azad and then with Dr Rajendra Prasad and Mahatma Gandhi in the Jungle Satyagraha (1931) and Quit India Movement (1942) for 6 months. He was sentenced to rigorous imprisonment.

Penalty if shops found sans dustbin

Indore Municipal Corporation, which played the biggest role in clinching cleanest city tag for Indore five times in a row, has given three days to shopkeepers to keep dustbins in their shops. For three days, the IMC vehicles will make announcements asking shopkeepers to keep dustbins. From the fourth day, the IMC will start imposing penalty on shops found without dustbins. The same rule lies with vendors selling their goods on handcarts," said municipal commissioner Pratibha Pal. She stated that health officers, health inspectors, assistant health inspectors have been directed to make announcements in all the commercial areas of the city from their vehicles for the next three days asking shopkeepers to keep dustbins mandatorily at their shops, handcarts, business establishments etc.

Students in 155 urban and 163 rural schools get DPT vaccines

Indore: The health department launched a campaign to inoculate children against DPT (diphtheria, pertussis and tetanus) on Tuesday with the aim of vaccinating about 21,000 children in the district. The campaign of vaccinating children will continue till August 31. According to district immunisation officer Dr Tarun Gupta, the campaign is being run in 155 schools in the urban areas and in 163 schools in the rural areas. "It will be a statewide campaign during which students of Classes 1, 5 and 10 will be inoculated against these bacterial diseases. We have a target of vaccinating about 200,000 children in the district and administering the DPT and TD booster dose for tetanus and diphtheria vaccines," Dr Gupta

said. It will be a statewide campaign to administer the DPT vaccine to children of Class 1 and TD (booster dose) to children of Classes 5 and 10. The campaign is also meant to target students of the age group of 10 and 16 years along with five years of age as some cases were reported in the higher age groups, as well.
