PROCESSION | 108 chariots and 5 tableaux to take part, event starts at 8 am

Jain community rath yatra today, traffic diversion from 5 am to 3 pm

The traffic management police have made arrangements for vehicle parking and traffic diversions during the Rath Yatra of 108 chariots by the Jain Samaj on Friday morning.

The Rath Yatra will start at 8 am on Friday. About 25,000 people of Jain Samaj along with 108 chariots and 5 tableaux would participate to participate in the Yatra. The procession will start from Vijay Nagar Square and will pass through Rasoma Square, Lig Square, in front of MIG police station, Patnapura, Astha Talkies, Bahari area, Rasoma Square and will end at Vijay Nagar Square. During the procession, diversion and parking arrangements will be as follows-

Parking arrangements

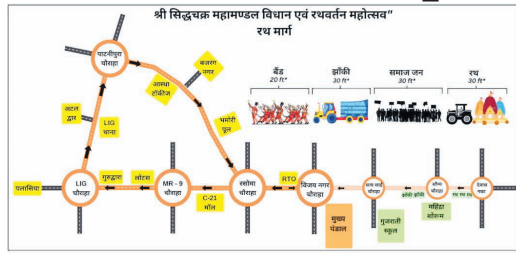
People coming in vehicles coming from Rajwada and Malhar Ashram will be able to reach Khajrana Square from Palasia Square, Radisson Square from Ring Road and walk towards Vijay Nagar and the vehicles will be parked behind Dastur Delight Garden near Star Square.

Devotees coming from Dhar, Khandwa, Rau will be able to use the Bypass Road, park their vehicles in the ground near Dastur Delight Garden and come to Vijay Nagar.

Devotees coming from Dewas, Niranjapur and Banganga will be able to park their vehicles in the ground in Scheme Number 136.

The devotees coming from Bapat Square and Sukhliya have to park their vehicles in the ground in Scheme Number 136.

Vehicles of devotees coming from Scheme 74 and



78 will be banned from Hotel Golden Gate Tiraha. The devotees will be able to park their vehicles in the ground in Scheme Number 136 and come for the program.

Diversions

From 5 am to 3 pm, in view of the traffic pressure, the diversion arrangement of vehicles will be as follows.

Entry of vehicles will be completely banned from Ra-

disson Square, Satya Sai Square, Marriott Hotel Square and Rasoma Square towards Vijay Nagar Square. People are requested to use this route and use a diverted route.

All types of heavy vehicles, passenger buses and commercial loading vehicles will be banned from the procession route.

All types of heavy vehicles, passenger buses, commercial and loading vehicles will be banned from Bapat Square towards Vijay Nagar.

In view of traffic pressure, the time of diversion can be changed as per the requirement.

All devotees participating in the programme are requested to make maximum use of e-rickshaw, city bus, i-bus and public transport to avoid inconvenience.

Adivasi icons go off tribal school pages in State

State government organises grand events on Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas

Despite grand programmes and celebrations on the occasion of Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas on Thursday, schools in Madhya Pradesh, especially those catering to tribal children, lack curriculum that truly reflect the history, culture and lives of tribal heroes. Madhya Pradesh is home to 63 Eklavya Model Residential Schools, 8 Model Residential Schools, 84 Kanya Shiksha Parisars and 94 CM Rise Schools. These institutions are affiliated with the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and follow their prescribed syllabus. Unfortunately, there are no comprehensive subjects dedicated



to tribal history or the lives of prominent tribal figures. As a result, even students attending schools meant to uplift tribal communities are deprived of education that acknowledges their own rich cultural backgrounds. From classes 1 to 12, only two chapters briefly cover aspects of tribal life in classes 7 and 8. Despite the presence of chapters on tribal figures like Birsu Munda or Tantiya Bhil,

the depth and breadth of their stories are severely limited, often reduced to just a few paragraphs. However, in these schools they have classrooms and houses named after local tribes and heroes; this recognition remains superficial. For instance, students might attend classes in rooms named after the Gond or Bhil tribes, but they are not taught detailed subjects that explore the history, custom and contribution of these communities.

Tribal affairs minister clarifies

Tribal affairs minister Kunwar Vijay Shah told Free Press that these schools are run by the Indian government; we can't even interfere in any of the matters related to the schools. However, they will try to incorporate a few activities related to MP's tribe in their curriculum.

3 held with charas worth Rs 8.6 crore

Action comes amid police crackdown on drugs

The city crime branch on Thursday arrested two men and one woman involved in charas smuggling and seized 8.4 kilogram of illegal substance, officials said. According to officials, total value of confiscated drugs, along with cash, mobile phones and a vehicle, is estimated at Rs 8.6 crore. Meanwhile, the state police seized drugs worth 700 grams across MP within eight hours on the first day of the state-wide drug crackdown.

tives from Director General of Police (DGP) of Madhya Pradesh to take strict action against illegal narcotics and smugglers, the city crime branch swung into action. Earlier, CM Mohan Yadav had directed state police to curb sale and smuggling of drugs.

The Crime Branch team on Thursday received a tip-off about a group of smugglers, who had reportedly been waiting for a buyer near a roadside restaurant in Khajuri Road area of Bhopal, in a lux-

ury vehicle. Acting promptly, the team conducted a raid and arrested the suspects, who have been identified as Amir Qureshi (52), Prateek Mishra (36) and Zahida Qureshi (48).

Upon searching the car, the crime branch team recovered 8.4 kilogram of charas valued at Rs 4 crore, 72 lakh in cash, five mobile phones, and the car, bringing total seizure to Rs 8.6 crore.

The Crime Branch registered a case under Section 8/20 of the NDPS Act and has taken the suspects into custody for further investigation. Amir Qureshi has a previous case under NDPS Act registered at Mangalwara police station, while Prateek Mishra's records are being retrieved via ICJS system, DCP Patel said.

Lalbagh entry from Kesharbagh road

The main gate of Indore's historic palace Lalbagh Palace is going to become history after 150 years as it has been proposed to keep this gate closed and make a new gate on the Kesarbagh road.

This decision has been taken so that the gardens on both sides of this gate can be renovated easily and visitors to the palace get hassle-free entry into the Lalbagh premises as the area around the existing main gate is always crowded and heavy traffic often leads to congestion. This was stated by Deputy director of Directorate of Archaeology, Archives and Museums Prakash Paranjape. Selfie points and gardens will also be made. There are also plans to make a garden and boundary wall at a cost of Rs 47 crore.

The existing main gate of the palace was built like the gate of the Buckingham Palace in England. This house was made of cast iron and was brought to Mumbai by ship and from there it was brought to Indore by road. There are only two such



Work at Lalbagh worth Rs 67.8 crore

Rs 47 crore: A proposal has been submitted to the government by the Department of Archaeology to construct a boundary wall surrounding the whole campus, develop the gardens and create a play zone. The main gate will be closed as soon as permission is received.

Rs 6.40 crore: Indira Gandhi National Centre for Arts is repairing the interior and archaeological paintings. This work started in 2023 and is to be completed by 2026.

Rs 9 crore: Since 2020, sewage repair and waterproofing work has been going on in the palace. This work is being done by the Department of Archaeology.

Strengthening of the building and its repair is included in this work.

Rs 5.40 crore: The Tourism Development Corporation is preparing the first floor of the palace for commercial use. Here cafeteria, meeting hall and rooms will be designed and given on rent.
