ISL: Chennaiyin FC stun Punjab FC with late winner to stay in hunt for playoffs spot

Former champions ride superb strike by Daniel Chima Chukwu to remain distant contenders for a top-six finish

Chennaiyin FC registered their first home win in five games as they edged past Punjab FC by a 2-1 margin at the Jawaharlal Nehru Indoor Stadium in Chennai in an Indian Super League (ISL) clash on Saturday evening.

Coming off a morale-boosting win against East Bengal FC, Chennaiyin FC struck first with Wilmar Jordan Gil converting from the spot. Punjab FC retaliated early in the second half with Luka Majcen slotting home the equaliser. However, the hosts left it late when Daniel Chima Chukwu scored the winner in the 84th minute to bag the maximum points. Despite this win, the Marina Machans, with 24 points from 21 games, are seven behind sixth-placed Mumbai City FC, who have 31 points from 20 games.

Punjab FC started the game with more momentum in their attacks. The visitors were moving the ball with more intensity in the final third. Asmir Suljic got the first opportunity of the match but his eventual effort was wayward as he failed to keep it in target from close range.

A couple of minutes later, Punjab FC had their best opportunity following Chennaiyin FC's throw-in. Ravi Kumar gathered the ball and found Petros Giakoumakis with a long ball.

The Greek forward held the ball up and released Mrzljak through on goal from the right flank.

The Croatian had a clear look on goal but his shot was not vicious enough to beat Mohammed Nawaz, who was alert to the danger.

However, the missed opportunities came back to bite them when Melroy Assis handled the ball in the penalty box, awarding a spot-kick for the hosts. Wilmar Jordan Gil stepped up to the spot and hammered it past Ravi Kumar to hand Chennaiyin FC



the lead in the 19th minute.

In the 37th minute, Punjab FC had a decent chance to get back into the game when Ricky Shabong stole possession from Lalrinliana Hnamte in the final third and played it to the Croatian.

Mrzljak had a couple of options but he decided to go on his own, though the chance fizzled out as he failed to hit the target. A minute later, Panagiotis Dilmpis decided to take a more attacking approach with a couple of changes as things were not working in his team's favour.

He introduced Muhammad Suhail and Luka Majcen replacing Ashish Pradhan and Mrzljak. The latter was also struggling with a knock near his hamstring.

Chennaiyin FC had a great chance to double their lead when Wilmar glided a header towards Irfan Yadwad in space and the winger made a surging run into the box. However, his eventual shot was brilliantly kept out by Ravi. Moments later, Punjab FC almost had an opening when Suhail delivered a telling cross across goal but none of his teammates attacked the ball in the box.

Just like the first half, Punjab FC started the second half strong with Suhail coming close to scoring. He just missed the target by a whisker. However, Majcen repaid his coach's faith when he found the equaliser in the 48th minute. It was a brilliant give-and-go between Ezequiel

Vidal and Suljic in the penalty box before the Argentine passed it to Majcen, who made no mistake in registering his eighth goal of the campaign. In the 70th minute, Giakoumakis had a brilliant opportunity to put his team ahead in the game when Khaiminhang Lungdim found the Greek forward in the box.

However, Giakoumakis failed to control his header as it flew over the bar. With the game going nowhere, Owen Coyle made three changes as he brought on Lukas Brambilla and Ankit Mukherjee who replaced Ryan Edwards and Hnamte to bolster their attack.

He later introduced Daniel Chima Chukwu replacing

Wilmar upfront. Punjab FC continued squandering their chances in the final quarter and they were punished when Chukwu handed Chennaiyin FC the lead in the 84th minute. The Nigerian found himself in space and slotted the ball home from Brambilla's low cross.

The two substitutes combined and carved open Punjab FC's backline with relative ease.

In a crucial juncture of the game, Nawaz came up with two big saves in quick succession to keep the lead intact for the hosts. He denied Majcen from close range before tipping away a long-range effort from Vidal.

Punjab FC threw bodies forward in the final few min-

utes but Chennaiyin FC's backline and Nawaz did enough to secure all three points from the game.

Chennaiyin FC star Daniel Chima Chukwu was the difference maker between the two teams as he scored the winning goal after coming off the bench.

While he made a brief presence in the game his impact was undeniable. Apart from the decisive goal, he registered a clearance and completed four of his five passes.

Chennaiyin FC will now travel to Bengaluru to lock horns with Bengaluru FC on 25 February, whereas Punjab FC will host East Bengal FC in New Delhi on 22 February.

Delhi Open: Unseeded Japanese duo claim men's doubles crown

Unseeded pair Masamichi Imamura and Rio Noguchi claimed the 2025 Delhi Open doubles title with a commanding 6-4, 6-3 victory over second seeds Niki Kaliyanda Poonacha and Courtney John Lock at the DLTA Complex on Saturday. The Japanese duo showcased resilience and precision, breaking their opponents early in both sets to cap off a remarkable run at the ATP Challenger 75 event.

Imamura and Noguchi took control from the outset, securing breaks in the third and fifth games to race to a 4-1 lead. While Poonacha and Lock fought back with a break of their own in game six, closing the gap to 4-3, the Japanese pair held firm to take the first set 6-4. The second set followed a similar pattern, with breaks in the first and fifth games proving decisive. Despite the second seeds' efforts to force a turnaround, a double fault on match point sealed the title for Imamura and Noguchi.

Organised by the All India Tennis Association and the Delhi Lawn Tennis Association, the Delhi Open 2025 is an ATP Challenger 75 tournament played on hard courts with USD 100,000 as prize money on offer. The winner of the singles tournament also rakes in 75 crucial ATP points.

Kyrian Jacquet prolonged his dream run in the singles event by knocking out top seed Vit Kopriva in straight sets in the semifinals. The unseeded Frenchman, who had eliminated seventh seed Sho Shimabukuro and seasoned players Jay Clarke and Michael Geerts in the earlier rounds, raced off the blocks in the first set, breaking Kopriva in the second and sixth games to establish a 5-1 lead. Kopriva gave himself some reprieve by breaking back in the very next game, before holding his serve to cut the deficit to 5-3. Jacquet, however, won on his serve—a weapon he relied upon throughout the match—to claim the first set.

The second set proved much more straightforward for Jacquet, who broke Kopriva's service thrice in a row to seal the win 6-3, 6-1 in little over an hour.

Jacquet will face second seed Billy Harris in the Delhi Open 2025 singles final after the Briton saw off third seed Tristan Schoolkate with a spectacular come-from-behind win in the second semifinal. Having lost the opening set 6-4, Harris retaliated in the second, forcing his opponent into a tiebreaker which he won by a three-point margin.

With momentum on his side, Harris raced into a 3-0 advantage in the decider before winning the match on his opponent's serve in the eighth game. A two-hour-22-minute-long battle later, Harris stamped his triumph 4-6, 7(7)-6(4), 6-2.

National Games: 17-day sports extravaganza in Uttarakhand boosts CM Dhami's political standing

This successful organisation of the 38th National Games in Uttarakhand has resulted in political gains for Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami. This was evident in the praises showered on him by none other than Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah during the opening and closing ceremonies, respectively.

The 17-day 38th National Games extravaganza organised by Uttarakhand has helped Pushkar Singh Dhami earn political brownie points, as his detractors now find it difficult to point fingers at him. The huge applause from Amit Shah on Friday during the closing ceremony has not only elevated his political stature within the organisation but also added a new feather

to Dhami's leadership cap. "Uttarakhand has risen from the 25th to the 7th position on the national sports map. The state's winning athletes have transformed Devbhumi (land of gods) into 'Khel Bhumi' (land of sports). Congratulating the state's athletes for their exemplary performance, Shah also praised the Games Organising Committee and Uttarakhand sports bodies, stating that the state has been widely appreciated across the country for the exceptional manner in which the National Games were organised by the Dhami government."

Commending Dhami's leadership, Shah further said, "Despite topographical challenges, Uttarakhand successfully hosted the National Games under the leadership of CM Dhami."

Earlier, on 28 January, Prime Minister Narendra

Modi highly appreciated Dhami for his leadership in the state, the green theme of the National Games introduced by Uttarakhand, and the carving of prize medals from recycled e-waste. PM Modi also praised the Dhami government for its decision to keep the 38th National Games plastic-free and for not using petroleum-fuel-based vehicles to transport players. High praise for Dhami from BJP's top leaders, who oversee key organisational affairs, has silenced his detractors in the state. Even his critics now acknowledge his steadily rising political influence over the central leadership, noting that the Chief Minister's approach to governance has impressed every section of society. "It seems that any task assigned to Pushkar Singh Dhami as CM will be executed with precision and perfection. This is the

perception these days. He has silenced all his detractors in the state, at least for now," said a party legislator in Dehradun, unwilling to be named. Uttarakhand received PM Modi's blessings at the inauguration of the National Games and was honored by the presence of Union Home Minister Amit Shah at the closing ceremony. It's a matter of pride for Uttarakhand to host the National Games for the first time in its silver jubilee year. This will elevate sports in the state to new heights in the coming years," Dhami said.

Notably, over 16,000 athletes participated in 35 sporting disciplines, winning a total of 448 gold, 448 silver, and 594 bronze medals. Several national records were broken and many emerging champions showcased their potential for future international performances.
